. ASKS U.N. FOR CEASE-FIRE ORDER; CALLS ARAB INVASION OF ISRAEL "THREAT TO PEACE"

IAKE SUCCESS, May 17. (JTA) -- A strongly-worded resolution calling on the ited Nations Security Council to declare that "the situation in Palestine constituation to the peace and a breach of the peace" within the meaning of the U.N. arter was introduced in the Council this afternoon by United States delegate Warren Austin.

The resolution calls on the U.N. to: 1. Order all governments and authorities rease and desist from any hostile military action and to that end issue a cease-read stand-fast order to their military and pera-military forces to become effects within 36 hours after the adoption of this resolution; 2. Direct the Truce Comsiston setablished by the Council April 23 to report to the Council on the compliance th these orders.

The Soviet Union immediately endorsed the American resolution. British delests John Fletcher-Cooke, on the other hand, questioned the Council's right to declare as Arab invasion a threat to the peace because, he said, Falestine was now a no-man's lad,

Austin suggested that the Council submit a list of questions to the parties unusual in order to clarify the Palestine situation. The Arab League states would a saked to Seclare whether their armed forces "or irregular forces under your contail are operating in Palestine; where they are located and what their objectives are and on what legal basis these forces are intervening in Palestine. The Higher Cemittee is required to answer whether it is exercising political authority in Palestine and whether it requested assistance from Arab governments outside of Palestine.

The questions to be asked of the Israel Government are: 1. Over which areas of halstine do you actually exorcise control at the present time? 2. Do you have armed forces operating outside areas claimed by your Jewish state? 3. If so, on what basis do no attaut to justify such operations? 4. Are you negotiating with Arab authorities reguling either a truce or a political settlement in Palestine? 5. Have you named representatives to deal with the Security Council Truce Commission for the purpose of effecting the truce celled by the Security Council? 6. Will you agree to an immediate at mismeditional truce for the city of Jerusalem and the Holy Places?

### ES CONTROL CENTER OF JERUSALFM; TEL AVIV-HOSPITAL BOMBED; CASUALTIES HEAVY

THE AVIV. May 17. (JTA) -- Jewish forces are now in full control of the cenof Jerusalem after several days of street fighting, it was reported here tonight. wever, Arab mortar shells are still falling in the business and governmental heart of e former capital of Palestine.

A Haganah commando unit last night carried out a successful raid eight miles to Lebanese territory, it was revealed here this morning. The Jewish troops blew an important bridge over the Litani River and forced a large Lebanese force which as heading for the bridge to withdraw. One Jew was wounded and all returned to base.

Meanwhile, the Haganah has occupied new positions in the Malakia area where sterday 200 Lebanese soldiers were killed by the Jews who halted their advance into arael. The Jews also captured the Nebi Yousha police station, which dominates the blek Valley on the road Junction between Eastern and Western Galilee.

Egyptian planes raided Tel Aviv five times today. Casualties were heavy when Mogen David hospital was hit and machine gurned. The first raid, carried out by wo planes, was a complete failure because the half-dozen bombs dropped fell wide of heir mark in the port area. The "Voice of Israel" radio, in an Arabic program. armed the Arab states that their cities will be bombed from the air if the war coninves.

In the Jordan Valley several settlements were attacked by Iraqi and Transordan troops and one, Gesher, was reported to have repulsed enemy infantry after resecting a demand from the Iraqi to surrender. Arab units also failed to carry Jewish ositions at Samakh, in the same area. However, they did succeed in damaging the avarim power station, at the confluence of the Yarmuk and Jordan Rivers. The Arabs lost a number of armored vehicles in these actions. The Iraqi assert that their lanes raided several settlements in eastern Palostine.

In the south, where the Egyptians have spread out over most of the area assigned to Arab Palestine, a two-day hattle at the Mirim settlement was ended when the Jews counterattacked and drove the Egyptian regulars back to their base. The kabs left 31 dead behind. The Hagarah also captured a number of Bren guns and other artillery weapons.

## WEIZMANN, FIRST PRESIDENT OF ISRAEL, SENDS ACCEPTANCE MESSAGE TO COVERNMENT

NEW YORK, May 17. (JTA) -- Dr. Chaim Weizmann, who last night was elected ident of the Council of Government of Iurael at a special session in Tel Aviv, 7 dispatched the following message to the Frovisional Jewish Government accepting first Presidency of Israel:

"I am proud of the great honor bestowed upon me by the Provisional Council of arment of the state of Ierael in electing me as its first President. It is in a ble spirit that I accept this election and I am deeply grateful to the Council for confidence which it has reposed in me.

"I dedicate myself to the service of the land and people in whose cause I e been privileged to labor these many yeers. I send to the Provisional Government people of Israel this expression of my deepest and most heartfelt affection inhang the blessing of God upon them. I pray that the struggle forced upon us will still be succeeded by an era of peace, development, and prosperity the people of Israel and those who are waiting to join us in the construction advancement of the new state.

"I regret that at this moment I em not with our people but my thoughts and yers are especially with those who are bearing the brunt and sacrifice of Israel's fease. The future of Israel will not be unworthy of those who have fallen. Zion all be redeemed in justice."

# STHAGOGUE CONVENTION CLOSES; THANKS TRUMAN FOR RECOGNITION OF ISRAEL

CHICAGO, May 17. (JTA) -- The United Synagogue of America convention, which adted here today, adopted a resolution inst night expressing the "profound gratitude" to 1,000 delegates to President Truman for his "forthright, wise and just act of feantship" in being the first head of a major power to extend recognition to Israel.

The parley also approved resolutions calling for the lifting of the American rgo on shipment of arms to Palestine; urging the U.S. to sponsor the admission of a to the United Nations; and expressing the hope that legislation to facilitate samission of DP's to this country would soon be passed.

The 1948 Solomon Schechter award to "our brethren in the displaced persons to forcept" was announced at a joint session of the United Synagogue and the Rablel Assembly of America. The award, which is usually given to a distinguished inhall who has contributed outstanding service to the Jowish community, was made this to a collective group "as a sacred plodgo that American Israel will stand with the amservingly in their struggle for ultimate redemption, for their return to Zion for opening the gates of the world to the heroic guardians of humanity's worthiest to "".

## Former Adviser on Jewish Affairs to U.S. Army Appeals for Admission of Weak

Rabbi Philip S.
