### NINE-POINT TRUCE PLAN PROPOSED TO JEWS AND ARABS; CEASE-FIRE TO GO INTO EFFECT ON FRIDAY

LAKE SUCCESS, June 8. (JTA) -- Count Folke Bernadotte, the U.N. mediator, today informed the United Nations Secretary-General that the Palestine cease-fire will go into effect at 2 A.M. on Friday, New York time, providing it is accepted by the Governments of Israel and the Arab League states.

Bernadotte advised the governments concerned that if the effective date is accepted by them he will confirm the time at which the four-week truce should go into effect. If, however, the cease-fire should again be rejected or hedged with conditions and interpretations, Bernadotte added, his peacemaking efforts will be suspended and a full report sent to the Security Council. The provisions of Bernadotte's proposal are:

1. All fighting personnel, persons belonging to organized military units and persons bearing arms shall be barred from Palestine and the Arab countries during the truce period.
2. The mediator shall, at his own discretion, determine if there are enough men of military age among the immigrant groups slated to debark in Palestine during the truce period to tip the military balance. If such a number is included, they will be refused entry.
3. Should men of military age enter the country they will be held in camps under the surveillance of U.N. observers on the mediator's staff and would not be mobilized. U.N. observers will also check all immigrant ships at ports of embarkation and debarkation.
4. During the first week of the truce the mediator shall, at his own discretion, be free to shut off all immigration if the situation requires it.
5. Movements of troops or war materials from one interested country to another or closer to the borders of Palestine or to the fighting fronts shall be forbidden.
6. All fighting fronts and communications lines shall be frozen during the truce, and all reinforcements of men or supplies forbidden. Routine replacement of personnel is, however, permitted.
7. No war materials shall be imported into Palestine or any "territory of any interested party."
8. The civilian populations of Jerusalem and Jaffa shall receive food through the International Red Cross for the four-week period, but no reserve supplies can be brought into either city so that essential stocks shall be substantially the same at the end of the truce as they were at the beginning.
9. All warlike acts, whether on land, sea or air, shall be prohibited during the truce.

U.S. MILITARY OBSERVERS LEAVE FOR PALESTINE TO ASSIST IN ARAB-JEWISH TRUCE

WASHINGTON, June 8. (JTA) -- Seven American naval officers left today by plane for Palestine to serve as military observers assisting U.N. mediator Count Folke Bernadotte in working out the Arab-Jewish truce, it was announced today by the State Department.

Another 14 officers, representing the U.S. Army and the Air Force, will be assigned to the same mission from the European theatre, the announcement added. The arrangement follows a request from the U.N. mediator, received through the American consul in Jerusalem, that the U.S. Government assign 21 military officers as aides to Bernadotte. Similar requests have also been addressed to the governments of France and Belgium.

It was indicated here today that the United States will oppose the demand made yesterday at the U.N. by Soviet delegate Andrei Gromyko that the U.S.S.R. also be invited to send military observers to Palestine. It was predicted that the U.S. delegation at Lake Success will insist that the U.N. team of military observers be restricted to officers from the United States, France and Belgium.

The seven U.S. naval officers who left today are: Capt. Solomon D. Willingham, Portland, Oregon; Lt. Vladimir L. Rychly, Cicero, Illinois; Commander Carson Hawkins, Reno, Nevada; Commander Harold D. Huxley, San Francisco, California; Major Regan Fuller, Washington, D.C.; Major Roy D. Miller, Cincinnati, Ohio; and Capt. Daniel T. Eddy, Honolulu.

ISRAELI CABINET MEETS TO DISCUSS TRUCE TERMS; POLITICAL GROUPS WARN AGAINST HASTY DECISION

TEL AVIV, June 8. (JTA) -- The Israeli Cabinet met today to discuss the truce proposals offered by U.N. mediator Count Folke Bernadotte, who has notified the Security Council that he would be able to report by Wednesday the success or failure of his truce negotiations with the Jews and the Arabs. The Cabinet meeting will continue tomorrow.

Prior to the meeting of the Cabinet, Premier David Ben Gurion received a petition signed by representatives of all political groups in Israel requesting that no decision on the truce proposals be taken by the government unless the 37-member State Council is convened.

Government circles today indicated that the seven-point agreement reached between the Israeli Government and the U.N. mediator, which was reported yesterday at Lake Success by the Israeli representative to the U.N., refers to previous talks only and does not pertain to the present position.

The Israeli Foreign Office today released a list of synagogues destroyed by the Arab Legion during its battle with Jewish forces in the Old City of Jerusalem. The list disclosed that 22 of 27 synagogues were destroyed before the Jews surrendered, and the Foreign Office statement added that the five left intact on the day of surrender were later reported to have been blasted. Hundreds of Torahs and religious books were buried in the ruins of the synagogues.

The statement also denied Arab allegations that the Jews had damaged or destroyed Christian Holy Places during the battle for the Old City. It charged that the Arabs had converted several Christian monasteries into gun positions for mortars and artillery shelling the Jews in the new city.

ISRAELI PATROLS ENTER JENIN; FIND CITY DESERTED; ARABS INTENSIFY BOMBING ON TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, June 8. (JTA) -- Israel Army patrols today entered the strategic Arab town of Jenin, northernmost point of the Tulkarm-Nablus-Jenin "triangle," and found it completely deserted by its defenders, a bulletin from Army headquarters here announced this afternoon. In the southwestern area of the triangle, large numbers of Arab civilians have been observed fleeing the area following capture of Qaqun, north of Tulkarm, by the Jews two days ago.

Earlier, reports reaching here from the northern front stated that a large Syrian force which yesterday crossed the Israeli frontier in the Huleh region has been thrown back across Jordan River. Yesterday these Arab units ousted the Jews from Malkieh, on the Lebanese border, and laid siege to Mishmar HaYarden.

The Tel Aviv headquarters of the U.N. Palestine mediator were bombed and severely damaged today as Egyptian planes intensified their bombing of the Israeli capital, raiding it four times within six hours. No U.N. personnel was injured, because the staff had not yet arrived at work this morning when the first raid took place. A United Nations flag was flying over the building at the time of the raid.

In another raid many bombs were dropped on the crowded streets and market places of the Israeli capital, killing nine persons and wounding 20 others. After the bombers completed their runs over the city, escorting Spitfires swooped down and machine-gunned men, women and children in the streets. One Spitfire was shot down by Jewish anti-aircraft fire.

The Egyptians bombed Rehovoth yesterday during their desperate attempts to free a large column of infantry and tanks from a Jewish trap at Ishdud, southwest of Rehovoth. They were also reported to have reinforced the column from the sea. The Egyptians also laid siege to and captured the Jewish settlement of Nizzanim, between Majdal and Ishdud. The settlement fell after an all-day battle. An Israeli communique disputed Egyptian claims to having killed over 100 Jews at Nizzanim. The Jews said there were 30 casualties and 100 Jews were taken prisoner.

More than 600 Jewish prisoners from the settlements in the Kfar Etzion area and other Jewish villages overrun by the Arab Legion are still imprisoned in Trans-Jordan, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today from members of a group of 87 Jewish women released by the Arabs in the Tulkarm area yesterday and brought to Tel Aviv. The women were exchanged for Arab women prisoners held by the Jews.

The former captives, who brought back two Torahs saved from the ruins of Kfar Etzion, also reported that the Jewish prisoners east of the Jordan were in comparatively good health and had organized communal life within their prison camp.

Jews in U.S. Zone of Germany Protest Against I.R.O. Refusal to Aid Emigration to Israel

MUNICH, June 8. (JTA) -- Jewish displaced persons staged protest meetings today throughout the United States zone of Germany against the refusal of the International Refugee Organization to facilitate their emigration to Israel.

Various speakers in the camps likened the I.R.O. action to "British power politics." Resolutions adopted at several of the meetings stressed the determination of the Jews to reach Palestine regardless of the "stumbling blocks placed in our paths," and called upon the United Nations to "chastise I.R.O. officials at Geneva who are responsible for this policy."

ARAB MOBS KILL 42 IN ANTI-JEWISH POGROMS IN TWO TOWNS IN MOROCCO; LOOT JEWISH STORES

PARIS, June 8. (JTA) -- Thirty-seven Jews were massacred last night in the French Moroccan town of Djorada following the death of five other persons in an Arab-Jewish riot in the city of Oujda, the French Press Agency reported here today.

The pogrom in Djorada followed receipt of news of the fighting in Oujda. A mob of Arabs surrounded some 70 Jews who were in the town's streets and stoned them. The Arabs followed up this attack with the use of knives and clubs. Among the 37 dead were ten children. The majority of the dead and some 25 who were seriously wounded were shopkeepers. Over 150 shops were looted by the Arabs.

In Oujda the rioting broke out after an argument between a Jew and an Arab over the situation in Palestine. Before the fighting was over two hours later there were five dead and many wounded. In Oujda the rioting was not confined to one area, but spread to various quarters. Both French police and Senegalese troops in tanks were used to quell the battles.

French Foreign Minister Georges Bidault today officially received Israeli President Chaim Weizmann. The Foreign Office has not made any statement as to the subject of their talk. Despite the fact that the French Government has not yet recognized Israel, Dr. Weizmann was announced to Bidault as "the President of the state of Israel."

BRITISH AMBASSADOR TO WASHINGTON HOPES U.S. AND BRITAIN WILL SOLVE PALESTINE PROBLEM

WASHINGTON, June 8. (JTA) -- British Ambassador Sir Oliver Franks, in his first public speech in Washington, today expressed the hope that the United States and Britain will find a "just solution of the Palestine problem" by working with the United Nations, and that they would be able to do it "in a different atmosphere than in the last few weeks."

Speaking before the National Press Club, the British diplomat said that there is "doubt and uncertainty" in British minds over the American approach to the Palestine problem. America and Britain, he declared, have "common aspirations" in Palestine. Both desire a cessation of warfare, both desire to promote peace and stability in the Middle East area, he asserted. "If there is no peace, order and stability, there will be a vacuum and that vacuum must be avoided," he concluded.

DR. SILVER WARNS U.S. JEWS NOT TO CONTRIBUTE ANY FUNDS TO IRGUN OR OTHER EXTREMISTS

NEW YORK, June 8, (JTA) -- Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American section of the Jewish Agency, today issued an appeal to Jews in the United States not to contribute to any collection of funds in behalf of the Irgun or any other organization claiming to defend Israel.

"There is today but one Defense Army of Israel and it is maintained by the Provisional Government of Israel," Dr. Silver declared. He revealed the existence of an agreement under which the Irgun promised to disband as a separate military force upon the establishment of the Jewish state. He also made public the text of a cable received from Moshe Shertok, Foreign Secretary of Israel, which reads:

"In view of the dissolution of Irgun Zeal Leumi and its impending complete incorporation in the Defense Army of Israel, all separate drives and allocations are unwarranted and should be discontinued forthwith. All parts of the Defense Army are financed with central funds and no question can arise of any section or group of the Army claiming separate financial assistance for its maintenance or operations expenses."

JEWISH LEADERS IN SO. AFRICA CALL FOR VIGILANCE; READY TO COMBAT DISCRIMINATORY ACTS

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, June 8. (JTA) -- The maintenance of "full vigilance" by the Jews of this country over the political situation resulting from the recent elections during which the Nationalist Party, headed by Premier Daniel F. Malan, known for his anti-Jewish sentiments, was victorious, was urged here last night at a meeting of the South African Board of Jewish Deputies.

Reviewing the Jewish position in the light of the new political situation following the fall of the liberal government of ex-Premier Jan Christian Smuts, I. Kuper, chairman of the Board, pointed out that the first statements issued by the Malan Cabinet expressed assurances that the new government would stand for equal treatment of all sections of the European population in the country.

"Mindful of the discriminatory proposals of the Nationalist Party in the past, the Jews note these assurances and trust that they will be the keynote of the government's policy," Kuper declared. "However, full vigilance must be maintained, and any attempt to deviate from this policy must be immediately combatted."

During the discussion of Kuper's report, the Jewish deputies all agreed that on the basis of the government assurances, there is no ground for misgivings. At the same time, they all agreed on a policy of "careful and continuous vigilance" to be followed by the Board in connection with the new political situation in the country.

FORMER GESTAPO CHIEF IN RADOM HANGED; WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR DEATH OF THOUSANDS OF JEWS

WARSAW, June 8. (JTA) -- Wilhelm Blum, former Gestapo chief in Radom who was found guilty of murdering thousands of Jews in that city during the Nazi regime, has been hanged following a war crimes court sentence of death, it was announced here today. He was sentenced on the fifth anniversary of the liquidation of the Radom Jewish community. Approximately 28,000 Radom Jews were massacred by the Nazis.

The Radom war crimes court also imposed the death sentence on Martin Schramm, head of the notorious Lipova section in the Lublin death camp, who was responsible for the execution of thousands of Jewish inmates in the camp, among whom were 2,000 Polish Jewish war prisoners.

Meanwhile, more than 30,000 German documents--including 100 thick volumes and 300 Nazi films--have been prepared for the forthcoming war crimes trial of Dr. Jozef Buehler, former police chief in the German occupation government of Poland and one of Gen. von Frank's closest aides.

THREE CZECH NAZIS, INCLUDING ONE WOMAN, SENTENCED TO VARIOUS PRISON TERMS

PRAGUE, June 8. (JTA) -- Elek Varkholvo, a leader of the pro-fascist Hungarian "Arrow Cross" movement, who aided in setting up a ghetto for Jews in the town of Kosice, in Slovakia, has been sentenced to 30 years imprisonment by the People's Court in Kosice, it was reported here today.

Herta Lutz, a 26-year-old Sudeten German who served as an overseer in several concentration camps and was notorious for her treatment of Jewish inmates, has been sentenced to life imprisonment by a People's Court in Cracow. Wilhelm Gottfried, a truck driver who blackmailed many Czech Jews during the German occupation and grew extremely wealthy as a result of his activities, received a five-year jail term here.

AMERICAN ZIONISTS PROTEST STATE DEPARTMENT'S ACCEPTANCE OF ARAB BLOCKADE OF ISRAEL

NEW YORK, June 8. (JTA) -- The American Zionist Emergency Council made public last night the text of a telegram sent to Secretary of State George C. Marshall, protesting the action of the U.S. Maritime Commission in cancelling stops by the American vessel Marine Corp at the Israeli port of Haifa. The telegram reads:

"This act represents the practical acceptance of the unlawful Arab blockade of Israel, appeasement of those whom our government has branded as aggressors, and unwarranted penalization of the state of Israel. Instead of insisting on freedom of American shipping, our government bows to the whims of Arab violators of international law. We respectfully request you to give this matter your immediate and personal attention, to cancel the reported instruction, and to insure that in the future American shipping may carry on its lawful commerce without interference."

JEWISH WAR VETERANS CONVENTION URGES BOYCOTT OF BRITAIN; ADVOCATES U.S. LOAN TO ISRAEL

NEW YORK, June 8. (JTA) -- The Jewish War Veterans of New York State, at their 17th annual convention which concluded last night, adopted a resolution urging the boycott of goods and services of the Government of Great Britain and asked Congress to withhold E.R.P. funds from Britain for supporting the Arab position in the Palestine war.

Other resolutions adopted called for support of a bill sponsored by Rep. Jacob Javits to make \$100,000,000 worth of lend-lease equipment available to Israel, "such goods to be sent in American ships," and requested the State Department to make public its file of captured German documents on the Grand Mufti. The convention also decided to petition the United Nations and the Big Five to brand and indict the Grand Mufti as "a war criminal and a menace to world peace."

JEWISH VICTORY IN PALESTINE WAR PREDICTED BY McDONALD; SAYS WAR MAY LAST A LONG TIME

NEW YORK, June 8. (JTA) -- The prediction that Jews will win the war in Palestine was made here yesterday by James G. McDonald, former member of the Anglo-American Inquiry Committee on Palestine, upon his return from a three-month tour of Europe and Africa.

McDonald, who visited Egypt, accused King Farouk of utilizing the Palestine war for the purpose of imposing restrictions upon the people of his country who are dissatisfied with his regime. "The Republic of Israel will survive its fight for existence, but only after a long, hard pull," he said.

JEWISH FARMERS FROM NEW JERSEY MOTOR TO NEW YORK TO DONATE BLOOD FOR ISRAEL

FARMINGDALE, N.J., June 8. (JTA) -- A motorcade of fifty cars, flying the American and Israeli flags, left here today for New York with several hundred Jewish farmers who will donate blood for Israel at the Red Mogen David blood bank in New York.

ARGENTINE JEWS MOURN DESTRUCTION OF SYNAGOGUES IN OLD CITY IN JERUSALEM

Buenos Aires, June 8. (JTA) -- The destruction of Jewish Holy Places--including several centuries-old synagogues--in the fighting which ravaged the Old City in Jerusalem was mourned here today at special services conducted in synagogues throughout the country.
