ECYPTIAN MOES PIERCE EYES OF JEWS; KILL RABBIS SAVAGELY: JEWISH SITUATION ALARMING

PARIS. Aug. 4. (JTA) -- The situation of the Jews in Egypt was termed today as "highly alarming" by a Frenchman who returned from Cairo and gave the first detailed and uncensored report of the pogroms, mob violence, mass looting and terrorism which is now taking place throughout Egypt against the Jewish population.

Egyptian mobs, he revealed, killed three rabbis by splitting their throats. after dragging them into a Cairo slaughter house. He estimated that at least 150 Jovs had either been killed or had "disappeared," in Cairo incidents during the last four weeks. A substantial number of Jews had been wounded, he said. The pogroms and anti-Jewish terrorism are tacitly encouraged by the passive attitude of the Egyptian Government, he charged.

The gravest single incident, he reported, occurred on July 20 at one of Cairo's chief street car junctions, in Malika Farida Placo. An organized group of Exptians ejected all the European passengers from several trolleys. All passengers suspected of being Jews were sayagely killed on the spot, and many had their eyes pierced or were knifed, while non-Jews and Europeans were robbed of all cash and belongings. The police made no effort to intervene, the French visitor emphasized.

Of the large number of Jews in Cairo who have been wounded, he continued, 120 are now undergoing treatment in the Jewish hospital there and an unannounced number are in government or mivate institutions. Scattered incidents of knifing of Jews are repeatedly reported in various parts of the Egyptian capital, he said. The killing of three rabbis in the slaughter house took place on July 21, he reported.

Both Jews and Europeans were attacked earlier in July when they left large motion-picture theaters, the French traveler stated. The most violent of these attacks, he declared, occurred near the Odeon and Rivoli Theatres, in the center of Cairo, on July 17. The fury of the Arab mob sent 20 persons to hospitals. It was in that assault that one Henri Gaillerd, a French national and an Olympics trainer, was fatally wounded by seven knife stabs. Gaillard fought back and succeeded in killing four of his assailants before he collapsed and died, the informant said.

Jews Ordered to Leave Homes Within 48 Hours; Their Possessions Locted

On July 26, the Frenchman asserted, Jews living in Cairo in the neighborhood of the Royal Palace or in government-owned houses were ordered to move cut within 48 hours. That order, he said, provoked a considerable number of "panic-stricken removals" in the course of which an Arab mob stole or destroyed the belongings of those evicted.

ISABLI GOVERNMENT COMPLETES PLAN FOR POPULATION CENSUS; WILL ISSUE IDENTITY DOCUMENTS

TEL AVIV, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- Plans were completed here today for a census of the Jewish and Arab population in Israel and areas occupied by its army. A population register will be drawn up and maintained by the statistical department of the Premier's office. As each citizen--Jew or Arab--is registered, he will receive an identity card.

The Israeli Government is now facing serious economic problems, especially in connection with the daily increasing inflation. The cost of living here is at least dcuble that in the United States. Also troublesome is the mannower shortage and the financial problem involved in maintaining the Israeli Army at its full length.

There is great pressure here from religious parties to have the civil law based entirely on Jewish traditional law, but this view is vigorously contested by virtually all jurists and most lawyers in Israel. This may be one of the fiercest controversies in the way of early completion of an Israeli constitution.

But the issue of Jerusalem is the most serious. It is being agitated today in all parties from right to left with such unanimity and furce that the government rill soon be compelled to take some definite action. Feeling is so strong on this atter that the Ben Gurion government might easily have been defeated had it acted rith less determination.

For all practical purposes the Jewish-controlled parts of Jerusalem and the red approach in Jewish hands have been incorporated in the Jewish state. The foundation has been laid in this way for partition of Jerusalem, with the new city in Jewish ands and the Old under Arab control. Such a solution would be acceptable, but the Irgun opposes it, demending that the entire city be amexed by Israel and made its spital. In this the Irgun has been joined by most right-wing and Orthodox parties.

The Ministry of Labor issued a number of decrees yesterday and today tightening considerably the mobilization program for the army and labor forces assigned to sesential occupations. Among the decrees is one providing for the labor draft of recat immigrants--who may not under the terms of the U.N. truce serve in the armed forces.

ISBALLI MUNISTRIES TO OPPN SPANCHES IN JERUSALEM; REFRESENTATIVE BODY TO ALD GOVERNOR

JERUSALEM, Aug. 4, (JTA) -- Each ministry of the Israeli Government will open a tranch office in Jerusalem, a large menting of Jerusalem representatives was told today by members of a special Cabinet committee. Each of the five ministries commissing the Jerusalem committee spoke to the gathering.

Dr. Bernard Joseph, newly-appointed Israeli military governor of Jerusalem, outlined the general policies of his administration to the meeting. It was also annumed that the government will appoint a representative committee of 13 Jerusalem leaders to assist Joseph.

IEW YORK, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American section of the Joseph Acceptant today for Israel, ridiculed the sudden concerns.

CONGRESS GETS BILL MAKING MORE JEWISH DP'S ELIGIBLE FOR ADMISSION TO UNITED STATES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- Congressman Kenneth B. Keating, New York Republican, today introduced in the House a bill that would change the qualifying date in the Displaced Persons Act from Dec. 22, 1945 to April 17, 1947. It is a companion measure to a similar amendment introduced in the Senate by seven Republican Senators, led by Sen. H. Alexander Snith, of New Jersey.

Keating estimated that well over 100,000 Jewish displaced persons had entered the camps between the two dates. "To mark them ineligible for admission under the displaced persons program seems unfair and unfortunate," he told the House.

Unless Congress appropriates an additional \$2,000,000 to administer the displaced persons program, only 40,000 DP's will be able to enter the United States in the first year of the program, Ugo Carusi, newly appointed displaced persons commissions, said today.

Sponsors of the program originally asked \$5,000,000 for the first year of the program. The Senate cut the figure to \$3,000,000 and the House to \$2,000,000, with the Senate later agreeing to the lower figure. President Truman asked Congress on Monday to appropriate an additional \$2,000,000 for the operation of the program awring the first year.

Republican Senators Confer on Amending DP Law

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- A conference of 51 Republican Senators meeting this morning to decide strategy for the rest of the special session of Congress, discussed amending the displaced persons law to wipe out discriminatory features, but came to no decision on expected action.

The chairman of the group, Senator Eugene Milikin of Colorado, said that if my changes were made in the bill it would be restricted to charging the date from Dec. 22, 1948 to April 21, 1947. This change would broaden the bill to make acceptable many Jewish DP's who fled from Poland after the earlier date.

MEN YORK JEWISH PARENTS APPEAL TO COURT TO KEEP RELIGION OUT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS

NEW YORK, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- The religious training of children should be confined to the home or the church--not channeled through the public schools--it was maintained today before Justice George J. Beldock in Supreme Court, here.

Kenneth W. Greenawalt, attorney for Tessim Zorach and Mrs. Esta Gluck, both of Brooklyn, advanced the contention in asking that the released time program for religious training of public school students be declared unconstitutional.

"Both these parties are religious people," he said. "They want their children to have a religious education, but they do not want the religious education channelled through the public schools. We are concerned with having religion put in its proper places—the churches and the homes."

Assistant Attorney General Kent A. Brown, representing the State Commissioner of Education, contended the court had no jurisdiction. He asked that the case either be diemissed or referred to the Judicial District in Albany since regulations governing the released-time program originated in Albany in 1940. Justice Beldock reserved decision and gave both sides until August 25 to file supporting briefs.

MMAI" PERMITTED TO LAUNCH SALE OF \$10,000,000 BONDS FOR ISTAEL IN UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- The American Palestine Trading Corporation, "Ampal," today announced that it has received permission from the Securities Exchange Comission to place on sale \$10,000,000 worth of bonds in this country to be used for ganting long term loans in Israel for developmental purposes.

The bonds will be redeemed within ten years and will draw three percent interest annually. The sum of \$5,000,000 raised through the sale of these bonds will be allocated to aid the financing of building projects in various parts of Israel, with a view to establishing dwellings for newly arrived Jewish immigrants. The remaining \$5,000,000 will be granted as loans for irrigation projects, agricultural and industrial enterprises, and for the purchase of material needed by the Israeli Army.

"Ampal" is the central purchesing agency in the United States for equipment of gods needed in Israel by economic institutions and the Army. It has sold, during the last few years, about \$3,000,000 worth of its shares to approximately 10,000 exceptions in this country and in Mexico.

NEW YORK, Aug. 4. (JTA) -- Rosike Schwimmer, internationally known pacifist, Tan's suffrage leader, diplomat and an early advocate of world government, died here stories at the age of 70.
