MANY MIGHTING IN JERUSALEM CONFINUES FOR TELED DAY; U.N. OBSERVERS BLAME ARABS

JERUSALEM, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- Heavy fighting in Jerusalem continued today for the third day. The Arab Legion opened artillery fire early this morning at Jevish mesitions. The Jews were forced to use artillery to reply to the enony shelling. An official report cabled by U.N. observers to Lake Success established that it was the Arabs who opened fire. The report said: "Arab artillery is shelling Jeruselem. Arab guns have fired from a hill east of Nabi Dawud. Jewa also used artillery, but their range is short and shells fell on the village of Silvan Deir. The

northern sector of Jerusalem is relatively quiet except for the exchange of auto-

natic rifle fire."

Two unidentified airplanes, believed to be Egyptian, flow at a high altitude over Rehovoth today. The city was alerted for about 20 minutes. A serious truce breach by Iraqi forces was reported this morning from Tirat Zvi, south of Beisan. (Mair raid alarm was sounded in Cairo early this afternoon, The alert lasted 15 minutes but the cause was unknown, Reuters reported.)

The U.N. mediator's chief of staff, Gen. A.A Lundstrom, left today for Tel Arty where he plans to meet with U.N. observers to discuss the convoy situation and the Latrum explosion. He also plans to visit the front lines between Tel Aviv and Gaza and will arrive in Jerusalem on Thursday,

Shertok Takes Up Jerusalem Issue With U.N. Observer

Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Shertok today received Capt. P. Mohm of the U.N. Ediator's staff and discussed with him the situation in Jerusales. He pointed out that after the compliments which the U.N. mediator paid to the Arabs for promising not to return fire in Jerusalem, the Arab Legion is now shelling Jewish positions there. He also drew the U.N. official's attention to the fact that an Israeli liaian officer was mortally wounded by an Arab sniper yesterday in Jerucalem while on duty with U.S. Consul-General John J. MacDonald, a member of the U.N. Truce Commission. "This time the U.N. authorities will not be able to say that they do not know who fired the shot," Shertok said, "This tragic incident is another proof, if one

is required, what value still can be placed on Arab assurances that they will not open fire in Jerusalem and that they will not even fire back." The Israeli Foreign Minister made it clear to the U.N. representative that the Jows will not be able to withhold fire if attacked by the Arabs on a large scale. Es added that before any new arrangements could be made, the Arabs must withdraw from the part of "no-man's-land" in Jerusalem occupied by them since the truce began.

INVESTIGATED COURT UPHOLIS IMPRISONMENT OF PRITER BERGSON AND OTHER IRGUNISTS

THE AVIV, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- The Tel Aviv district court rejected today the application for a writ of habeas corpus for which the Israeli lawyer Max Seligmen had spiled in bohalf of his clients, Peter Bergson, Jacob Meridor and three other mounters of the Irgun Ival Lewni. Their continued imprisonment was thus confirmed.

Judge L. Kassan dissented from the opinion of the other two judges sitting in the case. The five detainees, who were arrosted after an Irgun gan-runner attempted to land a cargo of arms off Tel Aviv during the first truce period, sent letters to the to a number of prominent persons stating that they intended to go on a larger this that would one only with death.

The prisoners wrote that they had by now been under detention without triel for six weeks. They pointed out that they had intended to start their hunger strike earlier but had awaited the outcome of the habeas corpus proceeding. The five men said that they had now decided to go ahead with the hunger strike and the blame for the consequences would lie with the Irraeli State Council and with the Jawish community.

SCHEF ENVOY TO ISRAEL PRESENTS CREDENTIALS TO BEN GURION IN FORMAL CEREMONY

TEL AVIV, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- Pavel Yershov, the Soviet Union's envoy to the Provisional Covernment of Israel, accompanied by six members of his legation and Israeli Chief of Protocol Dr. Michael Simon, presented his credentials to Premier levid Bon Gurion today.

Formally attired in his black and gold-braided foreign service uniform, the Sowit envoy was saluted by an Exceli guard of henor while a band played the Soviet and Irreeli national arthems. Presenting his credentials, Yerehov addressed Ben Saxion in Russian who, replying in Hebrew, said: "I am delighted to welcome you here. I discouly hope that your work here will strengthen the friendly relations between our two states." A friendly conversation followed in Russian, which both Ben Gurion and Mosho Shertok. MEMBOTTE APPEALS TO U.S. TO SUPPLY ARAB REFUGEES WITH FOOD; PLEA UNDER "URGENT" STUY

W.SHINFRON, Aug. 17. (JFA) -- U.N. Palestine modiator Count Folke Bernadotte has appealed to the United States for food and other relief supplies to aid in curing for Arab and Jawish refugees displaced by the fighting in Palestine.

State Department press officer Michael J. McDermott said today that Secretary of State George C. Marshall late yesterday received a message from Count Bornnactte. describing the "despreade" plight of 330,000 Arab refugees and 7,000 Jewish refugees and asking what the U.S. send wheat, canned meat, butter, cheese and D.D.T. McDermott said no decision has yet been taken in the matter, but the Department is "working on it urgently."

In his massage to Corretary Marshall, Count Bernadotte asked: "Considering the extent and importance of your usual trade relationships with countries of the Middle East, including Phleorine, will the Government of the United States assist to allorante this sudden human disaster comparable to an earthquake or tidal wave by domaing and diverting to me at Beirut or Agaba 2,500 tons of wheat, 100 tons of tened meat, 50 tons of cheese, 50 tons of butter, and 20 tons of D.D.T., ten persont immediately from your supplies and 90 percent within three months at the latest?"

PALESTINE CUPREMCY BOARD IN LONDON NOT CONSULTED BY ISRAEL, ON MEN CURRENCY ISSUE

LONDON, Aug. 17. (JTM) -- The Palestine Currency Board was not consulted by the Israeli Government before the decision to issue new Israeli currency was taken, an efficial statement released here revocated. The Currency Board, a branch of the formandatory Power's regime in Palestine which has not yet been liquidated, manages releatine's currency on behalf of the British Colonial Office.

Commenting on the Israeli Government's action, the Financial Fimes, Britain's leading financial crgam, declared today that "it is recognized in London that the value up of the Palestine Mandate created some sort of a vaccount since the Currency Bord was administered from London under British control." Nevertheless, the publication supresses surprise over the fact that the Israeli Covernment did not wait for the "outcome of negotiations for the political future of Palestine" before issuing the new currency.

"Eanking quarters in London are taking the view that the circulation of Palestine Currency Board notes in areas outside of the Jewish state will have to come under review as a result of the Jewish Government's decision," the paper added.

An editorial published in the same issue of the Times asserts that there is a "clear indication" that the amount of curroncy issued by Issael may in due course will exceed the amount presently in circulation." This viewpoint contrasts strangely with the friendly comment volced in a financial column appearing on the same page declaring that the introduction of the new currency "need occasion no surprise" since it has been generally assumed "that an independent Israeli Government is hardly likely to eithere to the Palestine pound."

Speculating on the question as to whether the Jowish state should become a major of the storling area or become more closely integrated financially with the U.S., the same column points out that the fact that the "bulk of Palestine's external reserve is invested in storling favores the former course of action."

1,000,000 Pounds Exchanged for Esraeli Currency Within Few Fours

TEL AYIV, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- More than 1,000,000 Falestine pounds were exchanged for new Harabli currency less than four hours after the new money was put into circulation today, it was announced here.

The State Council last night unanimously approved the new Israeli curroncy bill introduced by Finance Minister Eliezor Kaplan. After the measure was adopted, Fremier David Ben Gurion asserted that "Israel today established its monetary independence."

"It should be clear, however," Ben Gurion warned, "that monetary independence is ultimately contingent upon economic independence. Such economic independence means large 'imports' of Jows to Esrael and large exports of goods from Israel. The stablest guarantee to the new Israeli currency would be provided not by a formal act of state, but by the constant increase of our strength," he added.

GROUP OF TURNISH JEWISH YOUTHS APRIVES IN ISRAEL AFTER MAKING JOURNEY ON SMALL BOAT

ISTANBUL, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- A group of 30 Jewish young men sailed from here for Israel on a small boat, although their passports were not stamped with Ioraeli visas. Letters received today from the Jewish state by relatives here reveal that the youths landed safely in Haifa. Another contingent of Jewish youths from this bountry will leave soon for Italy to embark on an Israel-bound vessel.

HERREDS OF JEWISH PRYSICIANS, SURGEONS AND PENTISTS SEEK EMIGRATION FROM DP CAMPS

MMNICH, Aug. 17. (JTA) -- The International Refugee Organization will soon spent a list of qualified physicians, dentiets, pheraccists and other medical personnel to all countries interested in admitting displaced persons as immigrants, it was revealed here today.

An I.R.O. spokesman disclosed that there are at present nearly 1,500 qualified physiciens and dentists in the U.S. zone of Germany, the vast majority of them Jews. The number includes 350 specialists, 210 surgeons and a large group of general practitioners. In addition there are 509 dentists, 640 thermacists and a variety of medi-

Under the present arrangements, all applicants for an I.R.O. certificate stating that they are qualified to work in their respective professions must be examined by a special I.R.O. commission. In some cases, where documentary evidence attesting to the applicant's claims is lacking, the I.R.O. gives the applicant a thorough ex-
