#### NTRUCE HEADQUARTERS FEARS REMEMAL OF PALESTINE WAR AS ARABS MOBILIZE AT JREUSALEM

HAIFA, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- Tension was rising at the United Nations ace headquarters here tonight as reports kept arriving from the Jerusalem area of mobilization of Arab troops there for what appears to be an aliminent all-out fensive, Personnel at the U.N.headquarters fear that Israel will meet an Arab fensive against Jerusalem with a general resumption of fighting on all fronts.

#### RUSALEM HOSTILITIES CONTINUE TO TAKE TOLL AS PALESTINE TRUCE ENTERS NINTH WEEK

JERUSALEM, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- While Palestine enters its minth week the U.N. Security Council truce, therease-fire has little meaning in Jeruschem ere artillery and automatic fire is heard almost every day and where a largeale duel yesterday between Arab and Jewish mortars and cannon resulted in a inher of casualties. For the Jerusalem inhabitants the truce has been almost as stly in lives, dislocation of everyday living and in economic losses as a fullledged war.

A Sternist raiding party this week-end invaded Beit Iksa. an Arab illage three miles northwest of here, and routed an Arab force which had been . hiping on traffic in Jerusalem. The Arabs lost ten dead, but the Jews returned base without suffering any casual ries. The Sternist radio was moved here from el Aviv last night, in order to operate outside Israeli territory. The editor and ublisher of the Sternist newspaper Mirrak, who were arrested for censorship iolations last week, have been released in \$200 bull. The charges against them are been reduced to "contravention of a press ordinance."

Bartley C. Crum, former member of the joint Anglo-American Committee f Inquiry on Palestine and publisher of the New York Star, last night told a press onference that he believed that the United States will grant Israel de jure recog-ition and a \$100,000,000 loan. He asserted that there is little difference etween the two American major political parties on the question of supporting srael's application for membership in the United Nations.

Crum charged that there were a number of officials in the State Department and other American governmental agencies who "clearly collaborate" with evin's disastrous and banknipt policy" in reference to Palestine. He added that then he returns to the U.S. he will report, in the capacity of a private citizen, to President Truman on his tour of Israel.

Jewish schools here and throughout Israel will reopen tomorrow after three-month summer vacation. Meanwhile, the Transjordan-controlled Remaliah redio announced that Arab schools will not reopen because of a shortage of funds.

The announcer also declared that a threat to the health of the population of the Arab occupied areas of Palestine is growing because of a serious shortage of food among the refugees in the Ramellah and Nablus areas, He also revealed that an additional 2,500 Arabs from northern Palestine have arrived in Damascus and have been sent to various comps.

ad him flown to Cyprus two days after he was freed. OVERNMENT OF INDIA IS URGED TO CONDEYN ARAB ATRICUTIES AND RECOGNIZE ISRAEL

DELHI, India, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- An appeal to the Mehru Government to condemn the "mass massacre of the Jews by the Arab armies" in Palestine and to recognize the state of Israel appeared in the English-language newspaper Informa,

published here. The publication pointed out editorially that "when the minority of

India demanded the partition of India this was backed almost by all the Arab countries." Asserting that it "fails to understand" the Arab opposition to the partition of Palestine, Informa added that there is no reason "why the Zionists should not be allowed to form their own state."

## RITISH JENS ASK GOVT. TO ACT AGAINST TWO GERMAN POW'S WHO STAGED ANTI-SEMITIC INCIDENT

LONDON, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- The British Government was today called bon to take action against Kurt Wagner and Erwin Scholz, two German prisoners of rr who created an anti-Semitic disturbance last week at a meeting of the Internation-1 Spiritualist Conference. The call was issued by the Board of Deputies of British ows, after it heard a report on the incident and the status of the two Nazis who ame to Britain from the U.S. where they had been incarcerated in prisoner of war amos.

The Deputies also heard a report of an enti-Semitic incident which coursed during the Olympic Games, held here in July. Following a dispute between Jewish member of the Argentinian seccer team and a member of the Austrian team, he entire Austrian team snouted anti-Semitic incults at the Jew. A representative of the World Jewish Congress urged the Deputies to protest to the Austrian Government, revealing that the W.J.C. had done so.

The Board of Deputies voted to accept an invitation issued by Rene assin, president of the Alliance Insraelite Universelle, to meet with other major levish consultative organizations and plan a joint presentation of the Jewish case to the forthcoming meeting of the United Nations General Assembly. During the debate on the action a number of speakers attacked the World Jewish Congress for allegedly obstructing such cooperation. Dr. W. Blenenfeld and M.Bakstansky, of the Congress, defended their organization against the churges, assorting that the spirit of cooperation "cannot be fostered by such attacks." One of the Congress' severest critics was H.A.Goodman, political socretary of the Agudas Israel.

## NEW SOUTH AFRICAN ANTI-SEWITIC LEAGUE LITERATUPE MAILED TO ENLISH LITERARY GROUPS

LONDON, Sopt. 12. (JTA) -- Large numbers of anti-Semitic circulars were received hore recently from Pietermaritzburg, South Africa, which loval Jewish circles believe is becoming a new center of world enti-Semitic propaganda. The leaflets were nailed to English professional and literary groups by "The League for Fair Play and Decency."

### RUMANIAN GOVERNMENT EXEMPTS ORT VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS FROM NATIONALIZATION PROGRAM

BUCHAREST, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- Although the Rumanian Government has ordered the nationalization of all schools in the land, the ORT will be permitted to continue to operate its schools and training centers independently, George Stroe, head of the Rumanian OFT, announced here today.

The Rumanian Government gave the ORT schools special status because the Jews are in great need of vocational training, Stroe said, adding that the government plans to issue a law giving the ORT complete charge of all Jowish retraining centers in the country. To avoid a clash in jurisdiction with the government schools, the ORT will offer its facilities only to students who are not eligible -- because of age or previous education -- for attendance in one of the regular government educational institutions.

# TURKISH COURT FREES JEWISH YOUTHS CHARGED WITH ATTEMPTING TO LEAVE TO FIGHT IN ISRAEL

ISTANBUL, Sept. 12. (JTA) -- Two Jewish youths have been acquitted in Ismir of charges of having attempted to leave the country without passports in order to fight with the Israeli Army, it was reported here today. The court found that there was not legal basis for holding the youths.

entered this country as government officials, visitors, transits, seamen, merchant

or students may become permanent residents if their applications are approved

following hearings by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Application form

will be available on and after September 15 at any office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, but will not be accepted before October 1. Authorization for the changes in status was provided under the recently adopted DP law.

ORBIGN AND AMERICAN EDUCATORS NAMED DELECATES TO INAUGURATION OF BRANDRIS UNIVERSITY

The educational institutions which have named delegates to the inaugration are: Yenching University of Poiping; University of Aberdeen; University of Counto; Acedemie des Inscriptions et Belles Lottres; Royal Society of Canada; Iniversity of New Brunswick; the Acedemie Royale de Belgique; and the Acedemie des Sciences of the Institut de France. Among the American universities which will be represented are: Washington University; Massachusetts Institute of Technology; Boston College; Boston University.
