#### U.H. MEDIATOR BERNADOTTE ASSASSINATED; U.S. REPORT PRESUMES KILLERS TO BE STERNISTS

WASHINGTON. Sept. 17. (JTA) -- U.N. mediator Count Folke Bernadotte was today assassinated in Jerusalem, it was confirmed here this afternoon by the State Department. A message from John J. MacDonald, U.S. Consul in Jerusalem, to the Department said that Bernadotte and French Col. Scrot, senior U.N. observer in Jerusalem, were murdored "presumably by the Stern Gang."

"This is regarded here as a great tragedy," a State Department spokesman said, in releasing the report of the assassination. A press spokesman for the Israeli mission in Washington said: "I am very deeply shocked and grieved. The Government of Israel has always believed that the United Nations personnel is inviolate in performing its duties inside and outside of the state of Israel."

The text of the message received by the State Department from MacDonald in Jorusalom roads:

"Regret to report Count Bernadotte and Colonel Seret, French efficer and sonior United Nations observer Jorusalom, killed this afternoon at 17 hours (Jorusalom time) prosumably by Storn Gang. Convey in which he was riding was returning from Government House. As they passed through Katamen, a Jowish-held area, joep suddenly appeared blocking route, containing four non, two of which proceeded to Count's car.

"Colonol Frank Bogley, United Nations security officer (an American citizen), grapplod with one and was slightly wounded in face. Second reached Count's car and ascassinated two men at point blank range with Sten gun. Joep succeeded in escaping. Abovo is proliminary report. Full report will follow."

## U.N. Security Council Summoned to Discuss Bernadotto's Assassination

PARIS. Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- An urgent mooting of the U.N. Security Council has been called for temorrow morning immediately after the U.N. headquarters here recoived the news of the assassination of Count Bornadette and Col. Seret.

U.N. Socrotary General Trygvo Lio, who is now in Oslo, cancelled all schedule plane and is roturning tomorrow to Paris. Meanwhile, Acting Secretary General Arkadi Sobolov directed Ralph Bunche, Senier U.N. official in Palestine, to remain in the area and assume full authority ever the U.N. mediation mission.

Gon. Aago Lundstroom, chief of the U.N. military mission in Palestine. has boon directed by Sobolev to start immediately an investigation into the nature of the assassiration. U.N. officials abstained from making any commont, emphasizing that they are avaiting further news about the identity of the assassin and the circumutances of Bornedotto's doath.

## SETEDIARY MARSHALL CALLS FOR CONTINUATION OF BETWADOUTE'S WORK; SHOCKED BY HIS DEATH

WASHINCTON, Sept. 17. (UTA) --- Ecoretary of State George C. Marshall issued a statement expressing his deep shock at the assassination of Count Folko Bernadotte, particularly when the mediator hal "achieved such a great measure of success." Secretary Marshall's statement, which called for a continuation of Bernadotte's work, reads:

"I an deeply shocked to learn of the assassination of Count Folke Bernadotto in Joruselän. His whole life has been one of assistance to mankind. During the past four nonths Bernadotto has been acting as the representative of the United Nations in an endagever to bring lasting peace to Palestine.

"It is particularly tragic that he should have been shot down at a time when he had achieved such a great measure of success. I am convinced the world will demand that the work he so effectively commenced be vigorously pursued. To Countess Bornadotte and his children I extend my deepest sympathy. The world will bitterly regret his loss."

### PALESTINE TRUCE WILL CONTINUE DESPITE BERNADOTTE'S ASSASSINATION, U.N. AIDE SAYS

LAKE SUCCESS, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- United Nations Acting Secretary-General Bonjanin Cohen tonight stated that the assassination of U.N. mediator Count Folio Bornacette did not void the Palestine truce. "The truce will continue," he said. Mr. Cohen further stated that the news had been received both at the U.N. headquarters in Paris and at Lake Success "with a great deal of sadness."

A statement issued by the U.N. Secretariat reviewed Bernadotte's role as Palestine mediator following his unanimous choice on May 20 by the representatives of the permanent members of the Security Council, sitting as a committee of the General Assembly.

#### BRITISH KING CETS REPORT ON BERNADOTTE'S ASSASSINATION; JEWS CONDEMN OUTRAGE

LONDON, Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- The news of the assassination in Jeruselon of Count Folko Bernadette was given tenight to King George at Balmoral Castle, while the Board of British Jews issued a statement describing the assassination as "a dastardly outrage" and "a nest deployable happening."

The likelihood is envisaged here that the recent proposal by Trygve Lie, asking the United Nations for a police force to undertake special assignments and lond protection to U.N. investigators abroad, might now receive renewed attention at the U.N. General Assembly sessions opening Tuesday in Paris.

In official circles the view was expressed that some new procedure must be devised immediately for continuing mediation in Palestine. There was unminity agains any abandonment of mediation, a new which one high government official said was "inconceivable." The point was stressed that in spite of local setbacks, the U.N. truce had proved more successful than had first been believed possible.

Both official and unofficial circles expressed the view tenight that the assessination of Count Bernadotte was a severe noral blow to the authority of the United Nations. In the forefront of the minds were of those reached for comment was the fact that the United Nations mediator was shot down in Jorusalen only a few hours before his Palestine report was due for submission to the U.N. General Assembly at Paris.

TEL AVIV, Sept. 17. (JTA) -- The Israeli State Council last night adopted a new income tax bill which has aroused a storm of protest in some circles since it was first proposed three weeks ago by Finance Minister Eliezer Kaplan.

The program, based on the principle of progressive taxation, is the stiffest ever to be introduced since the beginning of the Mandatory administration. In his final appeal for adoption, Kanlan last night told the Council that it was a necessary war measure, emphasizing that the present "cold war" in effect during the truce is as expensive as wer on the battlefield. On the final vote, 23 members of the Council voted for the bill, three against and six abstained.

Twenty-one million Israeli pounds (\$84,000,000) in currency has been put into circulation during the first four months of the Jowish state, it was announced here. All but 2,000,000 pounds were issued in exchange for Pelestine currency issued by the Mandatory administration.

BRITISH COMMANDER OF ARAB LEGION CHARGES SOVIET UNION SUPPORTING ISRAELI WAR EFFORT

LONDON, Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- Russia is supporting Israel in the "Zionists' offerts to control Pelestine by force," Brig. John B. Glubb Pasha, Commander-in-Chief of the Transjordan Arab Legion, asserted today prior to his scheduled return to the Middle East.

Ho charged that large quantities of arms had been smuggled to Israel from "behind the iron curtain." The arms, he said, had been bought by means of "large subsidies" from the United States. He cited the "smuggling of aircraft to Israel out of Britain" as evidence of Israeli officiency. He stressed that it was in Britain's interest to arrive at an early Jowish-Arab sottlement and "that can only be reached if the United Nation calls on Count Folke Bernadette for a final plan and that the United Nations then insures that it is carried out."

The Foreign Office, meanwhile cent nued to maintain its strict secretroness concerning the purposes of Glubb's visit to Britain. A spokeman today refused to divulge the identity of Foreign Office officials with whom Glubb met. He also was vague on the part which Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin took in these talks, confining himself to a declaration that the Secretary did not receive Glubb at the Foreign Office.

STATE DEPT. HAS NO INFORMATION ON REPORT OF YEMEN THREATS TO CANCEL U.S. OIL TALKS

WASHINGTON, Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- A pross roport that the Arab nation of Yemen has threatened to cancel further talks with Americans on a projected agreement to grant oil-prospecting agreements brought commont from the State Department today that is has no information on the situation.

A spokesman said that as far as oconomic discussions are concerned, the State Department has had none with Yemen since Frince Abdullah was here in August, 1947. He added that the Department has no information about the present Yemen Government giving any thought to concessions in oil. In fact, he said, no talks on the subject have been held since the Yemen revolution last spring.

# ROSPECTIVE IMMICRANTS TO U.S. ADVISED BY STATE DEPARTMENT TO REGISTER FOR VISAS

WASHINGTON, Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- The State Department today advised all petential immigrants to the United States new in Europe to register for visus under the sisting immigration system so that they would be eligible for normal programs to

risting immigration system so that they would be eligible for normal movement to morice "in the event they should fail to meet all the qualifications" to come as displaced persons under the DP law,

Applicants will be processed as seen as possible on a first-come, first-served asis. The State Department made it clear, however, that registration for visus will be under the existing immigration law of 1924 and not under the new DP act.

A ropert emanating from Frankfurt said today that the U.S. Government has lifted the ben on the immigration of Germans and Austrians to the United States. nother report said that the American Military Government has commuted the life sononce of Ilse Koch, widow of a fermer commandant of the neterious Buchemeald death and a convicted war criminal in her own right, to four years imprisonment. Frau Loch, who will be freed some time next year under the terms of the sentence, was conficted last year by an American military court at Dachau. She was charged with repossibility for the death of thousands of Jowish and non-Jowish prisoners whose skins the later used for lampshades.

# undarian covernment restricts jewish groups to one publication; paper shortage cited

BUDAPEST, Sopt. 17. (JTA) -- The Hungarian authorities today banned the publication of separate Zienist and Agadist wookly magazines here. The authorities informed the Jowish groups that because of the paper shortage only one publication will be allowed for all Jowish groups.

The Mizrachi Organization of Budapost today announced its withdrawal from the

Orthodox community board because of the body's stard on various Zionist matters. The Mirachi domanded that the Jovich Mational Fund and Koren Hayosod collections be saint-though in the synagogue and that the Hatikvah be sung and the blue-and-white Zionist flag be displayed in the synagogue on solem organisms. The non-Zionists, expressing their support of Israel, refused to accede to the other requests, asserting that both funds were not Israeli but Zionist, and that until Iorael adopts the anthen and the flag as national symbols they remain Zionist and as such are not acceptable in the synagogue.

President Arped Szakasits today received a delegation of Hungarian Labor Zionists, headed by Bela Denes, The delegation included a Histadruth representative who greeted the President in the name of Ismaeli labor. Szakasits asked the delegation to convey to Israel his "warn sympathy" and "profound solidarity" with the people of the Jovish state in its fight for "liborty, culture and human existence against inperialist violence and berbarism." He added that he is "convinced of the ultimate victory of Israel's fust cause."
