170 STERNISTS WEO EROFE CUT OF JAFFA JAIL TRANSFERRED TO ACRE: 30 STILL AT LARGE

JAFFA. Oct. 10. (JTA) -- About 170 Stern Group prisoners who staged a demonstration yesterday, overpowering the guards and taking over control of the prison. surrendered to the military police before dawn this morning. They were loaded into lorries and transferred to Acre prison where the authorities grimly promised that treatment "won't be so laz."

About 30 detainees who walked cut of the prison yesterday were still at large today and were the objects of an intensive man-hunt. The authorities predicted. speedy return or recapture of all fugitives.

Meanwhile, the military authorities opened a searching inquiry into the administration of the Jaffa prison to determine responsibility for the conditions enabling the Sternists to stage their demonstration, which the Hebrew press denounced today as a serious blow to the Israeli Government's prestige.

A senior military police official denied today that the Sternists had been in virtual control within the prison for the last fortnight, explaining that they were confined to cells but were permitted free use of the large exercise yard. Asked why the prison guards had not used arms to prevent the break, he replied that the prisoners, after making their escape by leaping over the wall, had mixed with the crowd of women and children outside the prison who had come to visit the Sternists, and it would have been impossible to take action without endangering the lives of these bystanders.

Hebrev Press Urges Government bring Sternists to Trial

The Hebrev press today described the "scandal at Jaffa" as a deliberate Sternist attempt to expose the government to ridicule and demanded a searching investigation into responsibility for conditions permitting it. Hearetz while urging an investigation, called on the government to act immediately to bring the Sternists to trial and not to prolong their detention without giving them a day in courts.

The Sternists were given the full run of the prison for 19 hours while the authorities made preparations for the restoration of order. It was not until 5 o'block this morning that the authorities acted with an ultimatum to the Sternista. which the prisoners accepted.

An official account of the events at Jaffa prison said that after mustering forces during the night, the Army presented an ultimatum to the Sternists to come out in groups of five, submit to search, and board the buses which were purked outside the prison walls in the pitch dark pre-dawn.

Two Stern Group representatives asked for a meeting with the military commander of the operation, who said: "No bergaining, the ultimatum is final, if you d not come out by 5:15, every force available will be used and every soldier ordered to open fire if any detaines tries to escape." With a few minutes left before if expiration, the representatives announced acceptance of the terms,

PALESTINE QUESTION MAY COME UP FOR CENERAL DEBATE IN U.N. THIS WEEK; SHESTOK SEE DULLES

PARIS, Oct. 10. (JTA). The belief that general debate of the Palestine question may begin this week in the United Nations was voiced here today in informed circles. These quarters said that the arrival here a few days age of acting Palestine mediator Dr. Ralph Bunche was limited to this possibility.

Israeli Foreign Minister Moske Shertok conferred today with John Foster Dulles, foreign affairs advisor to Presidential candidate Governor Thomas B: Dewoy, who is expected to be appointed Secretary of State in the event of a Republican victory in November. Meanwhile, the Ieraeli delegation to the U.N. reported over the west-end that it is "making progress" in informal discussions with various delegations here. Aubrey S. Ehan, head of the Ieraeli mission to the U.W., in a letter to the President of the Socurity Council, charged the U.W. with failure to remedy six "grave violations of the trues on the Arab side" which jeografized the positions and interests of Iorael.

Emphasizing that his extrement did not attempt to list all Arab violations, ben declared that the major violations cited had a "lasting detrimental effect on the position of Israel. In all those cases, the U.N. representatives have not been able to give effect to their rulings which the Arabs systematically disregarded," he charged.

Following are the six major violetions:

- I. The Jerusalca water supply, which is still not in operation, the blacked Latrum pumping station, unrepaired, and the population existing on the most measure exter allowance.
- 2. The road to the Megov, the statement complained of the failure of the Exyptians to observe Gen. Age Lundstroen's ruling of Aug. 18 providing for the unmolested use of the crossroads at Karatiyah by both sides for six-hours periods, alternatively.
- 3. Bir Asluj in the Negev was occupied by the Egyptians Aug. 5 under the too ott. No. observers, who persuaded the Israelis not to counter-attack, undertaking to obtain an evaquation which has not occurred to date.
- 4. At Mishmar Hayardon the Syrians occupied a vital height, violating the ine-fixing agreement eigned by the Israelii and Arab commanders. The height has still not jet been evacuated and "here again the U.H. representatives were unable to enforce their decisions."
- 5. The Arab Legion commanders, after signing an undertaking to evacuate positions in n-man's land at Deir Abu Tor and Mt. Zion, did not comply.
- 6. Mt. Scopus, where, despite a mid-July agreement demilitarizing the Hebrew University and Hadassah Hospital Area, only one toncoy actually passed through.

U.N. HEADQUARTERS IN HAIFA WARNS JEWS AND ARABS TO PUT IMMEDIATE END TO NEGEV FIGHTING

TEL AVIV, Oct. 10. (JTA)--W.N. headquarters in Haifa today issued a stronglyworded warning to both Jews and Arabs to halt the fighting on the southern front immediately. The warning termed the large-scale Egyptian attack in the Negev yesterday a "flagrant and gave violation of the truce,"

Sporadic Shorting Continues in Jerusalem; Southern Sectors Hit

JERUSALEM, Oct. 10. (JTA) - "Enemy activity leat night centeried mainly around the Deir Abu Tor sector where our forces foiled an attempt by Arab troops to compy new positions," an Israell Army commingue said today. Sporadic firing from the Arab lines, in various parts of the city, continued during the night and the morning. Jevich suburbs on the southern cutskirts of Jorusalem were intermittently shelled by the Arabs yesterday and this morning, with no casualties reported, the communique said.

BRITAIN ADVISES ABDULLAH NOT TO ENTER INTO DIRECT PEACE NEGOTIATIONS WITH ISRAEL

PARIS, Oct. 10. (JFA) -- The British Government has advised King Abdullah of Transjorden not to enter into direct peace negotiations with the Israeli Government, it was Jeanned hore today.

This advice was given after reports had been received from British representatives at Cairo, Bagdad and particularly Danaccus. In the light of these dispatches, the British Government concluded that if Abdullah Should begin peace negotiations, he would completely isolate himself from the other Arab states and would also be seriously exposed to the risk of assessination.

BCARD OF DEPUTIES OF BRITISH JEWS ADOLTS RESOLUTION UPGING BRITAIN TO RECOGNIZE ISSUED

LUNDUM, Oct. 10. (JEA) -- The Board of Deputies of British Jews Late today adopted a resolution urging the British Government to recognize the state of Israel. The resolution also voiced the hope that Britain would support the admission of Israe to United Nations membership.

In another resolution, the Board joined with the "whole civilized world in a feeling of profound shock and distress at the tragic loss" of the late U.N. Palestine mediator Count Folks Bernadotte. The destensint hoped that the government of Icrael would apprehend those suspected of "complicity in this destardly orine" and "would root out the ovil of terrorisms."
