#### ISRAELI GOVERNMENT CIRCLES SATISVIED WITH UNITED STATES ELECTION RESULES

TEL AVIV, Nov. 3. (JTA) -- Israeli government circles today expressed to the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency their complete satisfaction with Truman's election.

They pointed out that the Jews appreciate the pro-Israell actions undertaken by Truman during his term of office...his support for the U.N. partition; recolution, his demand immediately after the war for the admission of 100,000 Jews to Palestine, as well as similar actions—and expressed their confidence that the President will carry on with such actions now that he has been elected for any term.

Election results were anxiously watched all day long by the man in the street. Talephones in all Israeli newspapers and as the "Voice of Israel" radio station were constantly busy answering inquiries on the U.S. elections.

President Chaim Weizmann sent a cable of congratulations to Truman reading: "I am most happy with the result of the elections. I respectfully offer my sincerest congratulations for a most successful term in office for the good of your country and humanity."

#### PRINCH CONSUL CHURAL IN JERUSALEM REPORTED RECOTTANTED WITH ARBITLAN ON PERCE

JERUSALEM, Nov. 3. (JTA) -- The disappearance of Rene Neuville, French consuler renewal and head of the U.H. Consuler Truce Commission, from Jerusalem yesterday lent support here today to new rumors of peace negotiations with King Abdullah of Trans jordan. Although Neuville was officially "somewhere in the Middle East, "in-tormed quarters here insist that he was in Amman. Abdullah's capital.

The same quarters report that the Truce Commission and the members of the truce observation staff here have been negotiating with both the Jews and the Arabs view the fate of the city. They are said to be optimistic, having found an "understanding ear" among the Israelis and a "softer attitude" on the newt of Transforden.

#### Blackout Lifted in Jerusalem:Radio Communication with Tel Aviv to be Resumed

Prior to leaving here for Tel Aviv after attending the first joint session of the Israeli Cabinet and the Joudeh Agency executive yesterday, Fremier David Ben Qurion met with Israeli military governor Dr. Bernard Joseph and Col. Month Dayan, Israeli military commander in the city. Jewish sources believe that it was at this paraley that the decision was reached to lift the blackout of the city from its right on. ### "DIFFICULTIES" PREVENT REOPERING OF HATFA REFINERIES, REVIN THIS PARLIAMENT

LONDON, Nov. 3. (JTA) -- There are "lots of difficulties in the way" of British resumption of refining operations of the Haifa oil refinery plants, Föreign Secretary Ernest Bevin today declared in the House of Commons, when asked if the relants could not be reconsed.

In a report on the status of the Haifa properties, Secretary Bevin Stated that they are undamaged, but not functioning except for minor maintenance activities. Be also recalled the protest made by the British Consul when Israeli authorities entered the Clause scan time after they were closed down by their British convers.

Immediate action by the United Mations on the Palestine problem in general and the internationalization of Jerusslam were urged yesterday by the Archibishop of York at a diocesan conference. Declaring that Count Folkle Bernadotte was "foully murdired by terrorists," the Archibishop charged the U.M. with bringing "discredit" on itself by "andless programtication" on Palestine.

He appealed to Christians of all nations to demand that the U.N. deal with the problem firmly and without delay. Opposing Jowish claims to Jerusalem, the Archishen openaged that "under Jevela rulo there would be no toleration for distribution or Moslom, and long established Christian institutions and work would be in danger of duppression or destruction." He asked that Jerusalem "be made an easis of peace and security in the midst of a land seething with hate and fear."

The Manchester Cuardian, reviewing the Palestine case today in the light of the American elections, quotes Israeli representative Ambrey's. Eban who condemned as "unrealistic" the attempt to reestablish the status quo of Cot. 14 in the Negov under threat of sanctions. The editorial emphasizes that Eban "ably" resented the Igraeli case. It also asked that the truce be viewed only as a bridge between war and permanent peace and that the "bridge must break if the further bank perpetuality recedes."

# I.R.O. WILL CONTINUE TO ASSIST JEWISH AGENCY'S REHABILITATION PROGRAM, OFFICIAL SAYS

JERUSALEM, Nov. 3. (JTA) -- International Refusee Organization director of rehabilitation A. Schwartz, who has been visiting the Jorusalem area at the invitation of the Jowish Agency to inspect the reception and absorption centres established for newly-curriving IP's, declared today that he is "greatly estisfied" with the methods employed by the Aconor in preserving the former refusees for their new lives here.

In a talk with Agency Imagretion Director Micha Dobkin, Schwartz said the I.R.O. would continue to assist the Agency in rehabilitation programs. # ISRAELI ENVOY AIMITTED TO INVERNATIONAL RADIO PARKEY IN MEKICO, BUT CHIX AS OBSERVER

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 3. (JTA) -- Zvi Prihar, Director-General of Posts, Telegraph, Telephone and Redio of the Israeli Government, who arrived here to attend the International High Frequency Radio Conference, was admitted to the Conference today but only as an observor without the right to vote.
