U.S. PROPOSES DIRECT ISRAELI-ARAB MEGOTIATIONS; URGES CREATION OF U.N. CONDITIATION BODY

PARIS, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The United States today presented to the U.N. Political Committee a number of amendments aimed at coordinating the British-supported Bernadotte proposals for Palestine with the original U.N. General Assembly partition resolution of last Nov. 29, favored by the American Government.

The U.S. amendments, as presented by Dr. Phillip C. Jessup, called for the appointment of a three-mation conciliation commission to replace the U.N. Palestine mediator and to take over his duties after the implementation of the Nov. 16 resolution adopted by the Security Council ordering an armistice between the Jews and Arabs.

The amendments stress the importance of direct Israeli-Arab negotiations and definitely remove the boundary principles recommended by the late U.N. Palestine mediator Count Folke Bernsdotte-which would deprive Israel of the Negev-as the sole term of reference for the three-nation conciliation commission.

The internationalization of Jerusalem is strongly urged in the U.S. amendments. They empower the conciliation commission to appoint a U.N. commissioner for Jerusalem and also urge the commission to submit to the next session of the General Assembly definite proposals for a permanent regime of the Jerusalem area.

With regard to the Palestine refugees, the American amendments establish two categories -- those wishing to return to their former homes and those unwilling to do so. The latter, according to the U.S. amendments, are to receive adequate compensa-tion to be fixed by a claims commission. The U.N. conciliation body should "facilitate the repatriation, resettlement and economic and social rehabilitation of the Arab refuses and the payment of compensation," the amendment stated.

Conciliation Commission Would Discuss Arab-Israeli Frontiers

Under the terms of the American recommondations, the U.N. conciliation body is to consult the governments involved on the question of Israel's frontiers. The American proposal points out that there are important elements to both the partition decision and the Bernadotte recommendations and that the frontier modifications suggested in the Bernadotte report should be considered by the commission "so few as they may contribute to the peaceful adjustment of difficulties between the parties." At the same time, the American amendments emphasize that these considerations are however, to be taken by the commission into account "without excluding any territorial settlement mutually acceptable" to the disputants.

The American amendments specify that the three-nation commission which would assume the functions of the U.N. mediator should carry out the functions and directives given to the mediator by the General Assembly and such additional directives as may be given either by the Assembly or the Security Council. At the request of the

Security Council, the tri-nation body would carry out functions presently assigned to the mediator or to the truce commission, which would terminate simultaneously with the mediator's office.

The U.S. amendments created a general feeling of confusion at the Falais de Chaillot. They were interpreted as indicating that the American delegation to the U.S. is still riding two horses—torying to appear as not deviating too far from President Triman's directive, while at the same time trying to conform the American policy on Falestine with that of the British.

Israeli Circles Cool to U.S. Amendments: Profer Australian Resolution

The initial reaction in Israell circles here was that a resolution proposed earlier today by the Australian delegation is preferable to the U.S. amendments. The Israells emphasize that while the Australian resolution clearly speaks of the fact that the Jewish state is entitled to membership in the United Nations, the U.S. amendments cult any reference to this subject.

Israeli opinion here also noted the fact that the Australian version is closer to the concepts of true consiliation than the American recommendations which they said, prejudge the issue by giving equal weight to the partition decision of the General Assembly and the Bernadotte proposals.

The Australian resolution urged adherence to the U.W. General Assembly's Nov. 29, 1947, partition decision under which the Negrov was given to the Joys. The resolution also requested the Security Council to give "expmethetic consideration" to Israel's membership application in the United Nations and that the U.W. should assist "the interested parties" to enter immediately into urgent negotiations for a personant settlement of the Falestine question.

The Australian resolution also recommended that: 1. A five-member conciliation commission be appointed by the United Nations to draw up the final boundaries of Israel. In case of failure, the domnission should report to the General Assembly for a final decision by that body. 2. All governments and parties concerned as well as the U.N. Trusteenthy Council should be consulted on the question of protection for the Holy Places in Jerusalem in conformity with the principles of the U.N. partition plan which provides for the internationalization of Jerusalem.

U.M. OBSERVERS LEAVE FOR REGEV TO CHECK INFAELI CHARGES OF RENEWED EXPITIAN ACTIVITY

TEL AVIV, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- United Nations observers left for the Negov area today to investigate Laraeli complaints of Egyptian military activity during the past three days. At the same time it was announced here that chief U.N. observer Gon. William Biley will meet in Haifa tonight with Leraeli Chief of Operations Yigal Yadin and Reuven Shilosh, of the Foreign Ministry, for what is officially described as a "routine contact."

Speaking at ceremonies marking the opening here of "Davar House" -- the new premises of the Leborite daily newspaper Davar -- Fremier David Ben Gurion declared to-day that 'we Jows can be happing this year, but our happiness is not yet occupiete."

The Larsell Premier said that the Jews could not yet celebrate fully their independence because "the blood of our youth is being shed and because everything we soliteved this year, and everything which we shall achieve in the immediate future, is not what the Jewish people hoped for for centuries—it is only preparation for the freem of generations: the gathering in of the ctiles in the Dispora into Ergal."

Fourteen members of the Stern Group escaped last night from a detention campnear here. A wide search to apprehend them is presently under way.

A total of 80,000 residents of northern Israel, most of them Arabs, were incoulated in the past week by the Israeli Army medical service against smallpox. Earlier, the danger of a smallpox epidemic in northern Israel had been feared by medical officials.

IBRABLI MUNISTRIES OF JUSTICE AND RELIGION TO BE TRANSFERRED SOON TO JERUSALEM

JERUSALM, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The Ministries of Justice and Religion will soon be transferred from Tel Aviv to Jeruselem, it was amnounced here by Israell Minister of Religion, Rabbi J.L. Fichman.

Asserting that it had always been his desire to remain in Jerusalem and set up his Ministry in the city, Rabbi Fishman pointed out that hitherto, this was impossible because of military reasons, which have now been eliminated. "I sincerely hope that the entire government will soon move to Jerusalem," he added.

Minister of Scoinl Welfare Rabbi I.M. Levin asserted today that the cim of his Ministry is to create the fullest possible scoinl security system in Israel. Rabbi Levin revealed that the budget of his Ministry from July through December of this year will be \$1,440,000. Most of those funds will go towards "constructive work," he stated.

A program of social velfere has already been launched among the Arabe, while Israeli solvoid children are now receiving hot noenday meals. The Ministry maintains 60 social velfare centers throughout Israel whose main purpose is to assist the thousands of newly-arriving immigrants. A network of 11 children's aid depots is also run by the Ministry. These minister to the needs of 1,200 under-privilegad children.

U.N. FCOD AND AGRICULTURE ORGANIZATION POSTFONES DECISION ON ISRAELI NUMBERSHIP

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- On recommendation from its General Committee, the fourth annual conference of the United Mations Food and Agriculture Organization at its plenary ession here today put off until its next session the application of Israel for membership in the organization.

The next session of the F.A.O. quite possibly may not be held until January
"of 1950 miles a special session is held earlier to decide on a site for the organizetion. The Israeli application, which was referred to the F.A.O. Compoil "for further
"study and consideration presumably might be brought up then," an R.A.O. spokeman said.

In making its report to the conference, the General Committee referred to the application as "submitted by the Jevish authorities under the news "Israel." Dr. Ludwig Semmels, who was last week admitted as an official Israeli observor, told the conference that he could not accept the language used by the General Committee in referring to Israel. He pointed out that those was a tens fide government in Israel, not merely "Jevish authorities," and that Israel was not merely a name, but a state. He said he could make no comment on the conference decision to refer to the Israeli application for action at the next session.

The recommendation of the General Committee was accepted by the conference without objections. Several countries, however, including Poland, Jacohoelovakia, Uruguay, Guatemala, Eduador, Honduras, Panama, Finland and the United States abstained from voting. Delegates from these countries said their governments recognized Icrael and that they had been prepared to vote favorably on Icrael's application.

The Polish delegate also objected to the language used in the recommendation made by the General Committee. As Barton, Doubt Minister of Agriculture of Cennda, speaking for his government, hoped that Israel, while not a member until not array year, would continue to participate in the work of P.A.O. The conference accepted the application of Baudi Arabia as a masher in F.A.O.

U.P.A. CONFLICT SETTLED; AGREGATIVE REACHED BETWEEN U.P.A. LEADERS AND DISSIDENTS

HEM YORK, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The conflict within the United Palestine Appeal was settled early this morning after an all-night meeting between leaders of the U.P.A. and representatives of the dissident group. The meeting was hald in the offices of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. A statement containing the details of the agreement reached is expected to be issued by the Council within a few days.

JEMISH RELIGIOUS COMMINITIES IN RUMANIA TO MERGE; RABBINICAL COUNCIL TO BE SUPREME

EUCHAREST, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- New by-laws for Jevish religious communities in Rumania were adopted here today at a conference of more than 100 rabbis and representatives of Sephardic and Ashkomazia groups from all parts of the country. The by-laws, which, for the first time in 80 years, provide for the unification of all Jevish religious groups into one contral body, are based on the new law regarding religious communities promulgated last July by the Rumanian Government.

Under the new arrangement the Sophardic and Ashkenazic communities will no charge function as separate groups but will morge into a single community although observing their specific traditions as hitherto. Regional unions of Jevish communities will be abolished and each community will become directly affiliated with the Tederation of Jevish Communities. The supreme religious authority will be an II-member Rabbinical Council headed by the Chief Rabbi of the country.

Since the reorganized Rumanian state schools will no longer offer Hebrev instruction, the problem of religious schools is given particular attention in the statute. Accordingly, communities throughout Rumania will be authorized to establish religious schools—including Cheder's, Talmud Torah's and Yeshives—while this training of religious ministers will be organized by the government, in accordance with existing laws concerning religion.

HUNGARIAN COUNCIL OF CHRISTIANS AND JEWS TO CHECK ALL BOOKS WOR ANTI-SEMEPTEM

EUNAPEST, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The Eungarian branch of the International Courculation and Jeus decided today to determine whether any books now in circulation in this country-literary, religious or scientific--ere apt to encourage anti-Semitic sentiments.

The Council members announced that if any such books are discovered, steps will be taken with the authorities to bring about the necessary revisions. At the same time, the organization appointed form members to the executive of the International Council. Chief Rabbi Fabian Herskovits was among those named.

JEMISH BODY IN BOHEMIA-MORAVIA IS URCED TO SEEK ALD FOR JEMS FROM GOVERNMENT FUND

FRAGUE, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The Association for Racial Persecutees of Slovakia submitted a complaint to government leaders that the Council of Jewish Communities in Bohamia and Moravia has not accepted its invitation to make a joint representation to the Czechoslovak Government for the establishment of a Jewish rehabilitation fund.

The Association received no reply to a communication which outlined proposals to be made to the government that monies be diverted from the Currency Liquidation fund for assistance to Jevish institutions for religious and social purposes. The Association said that the Currency Liquidation Fund has obtained a number of holdings and assets saized by the Razis from Jevish communities and that the Fund's officials had profiled aid to the Jews from its resources.

HUNGARIAN POLICE INVESTIGATING DESECRATION OF JENUSH CEMETERY NEAR TOWN OF KOERETED

EUDAPEST, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- Police officials were today investigating an attack on the Jeviel cometery of the town of Energend lest night in which the entire burial grounds were defiled and deservated. Eight tembstones were destroyed. Horrfond is located in Vestern Empary.

2.000 JESS ATTEND ELECTION MEETING IN BUENOS AIRES SPONSORED BY PRO-PERCY JESTISH CROUP

BURNOS AIRES, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- Two thousand Jews Last night attended an election meeting aponecred by the pro-Peroniet Organization Israelita Argentina.

Senator Alberto Telesire and Deputy J. Caraguro reiterated President Juan Peron's miedge to punish racial persecution as treason. A petition circulated by the pro-Peronist organization asking that Argentina recognize Israel was signed by several hundred persons.

NO COMMUNAL "SANCTIONS" ARE PRACTICED IN FUND-RAISING DRIVES, ISRAELI DELECATE SAIS

EUENCS AIRES, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- Gedalia Zuchowitzky, Israeli director of the Koron Haysood office here who assumed leadership of the United Campaign in Argentina for Israel and for Jewish Refugees Overseas today took issue with charges made by Rabbi M. Pincus of Sac Paulo, Brazil, of the alleged imposition of communal "senctions" against members of Jewish communities in Latin America who do not contribute to fund-raising campaigns.

Zichowitzky emphanised that an late as last September Rabbi Pinous was given an exhaustive explanation that no such sanctions were planned or carried out. He declared that Rabbi Pinous' allegations were not in accordance with the existing facts and emphanized that the Jewich Congregation of Sac Paulo, whose spiritual leader Rabbi Pinous is, has refuted his charges,

Pointing out that he has always opposed "sanctions," and that he did not consider them necessary, Zuchouttaty said that the Jews of Brazil have always responded wholebeartedly to fund-raising drives. Rubbi Pinous, he said, apparently based his allegations on reports contained in some newspapers received from Argentina and Chile and on the Yact that in the city of Porto Alegre, Brazil, during the proclamation of the local drive, the possibility of "sanctions" was mentioned.

No central fewish institution in Ierael has saked for the imposition of "sanctions" or any other compulsory measures in fund-raising activities in Latin American countries, which this year increased their contributions tenfold, he said. He added that any local Jevich organization, community or society, has the right to apply moral measures against those of their members who, according to the decisions and judgment of the majority, are not fulfilling their duty. "It is impossible to force that organization to accord into its memberality persons who do not comply with the moorant and the size of this organization," he pointed out.

Seo Paulo Jewish Leaders Deny Existence of Any "Sanctions" System

gao Paulo, Brazil, Nov. 23. (FTA) -- A statement disassociating themselves from the allogations made by Rabbi Pinous with regard to communal "sanctions" was lade how today to the Jevish Telegraphic Agency by the members of the Congregation of San Paulo and by the Emergency Campaign.

The statement declared that Rabbi Pinous vanted only to define the religious dootrine with regard to the problem of communal sanctions without referring specifically to the local situation. The article which the Rabbi published in the Chronica Laraclita was not motivated by failure to get an official denial regarding sanctions, the statement said.

The emphasized that although the Rabbi does not mention it in his article, the Congregation received an official denial from Gedalia Zuchovitzky, representative of the Jevish Assnoy, and from the directors of the Emergency Compagin in Sec Paulo, Marcos Bramismithal and Vittorio Camerini, to the effect that no sanctions were contemplated by anybody in Sec Paulo. "Mon-existent sanctions cannot be revoked," the established added.
