#### ECYPT BRINGS CHARGES IN U.N. AGAINST ISRAEL; ACTION ON ISRAELI APPLICATION IMPEDED

PARIS, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The seven-member sub-committee appointed by the United Nations Security Council to assist acting mediator Dr. Ralph Bunche in the implementation of the Council's order for a Negev withdrawal met here today at the request of Egypt, which charged that Israel was not complying with the Council order. adopted November 4. After some debate, the body adjourned until Wednesday to give Dr. Bunche sufficient time to arrive here from Israel and report on the current situation, including his negotiations with the Israelis on the Negov.

Meanwhile, an American delegation spokesman today declared that the situation in the Negev. as well as the uncertainty over the General Assembly's vote on the watered-down Anglo-American resolution setting up a three-nation conciliation commission to settle the Palestine problem was holding up speedy consideration of the Israeli application for membership to the United Nations.

The Egyptian charges which led to today's meeting stated that the Jews still occupied the town of Beersheba, although they did not enter it before October 14. The Exptians also stated that they were unable to withdraw their troops from the encircled Faluja pocket. In response to statements by Israeli representative Aubrey Eban, the Egyptian spokesman disclaimed, on behalf of his government, any knowledge or responsibility for contraband found by the Jews Docember 1 in a U.W.-escorted conyoy heading for Faluja. He also stated several times that in principle Egypt agrees with the Security Council resolution of November 16 calling for armistice negotiations,

Eban immediately asked the sub-committee to instruct Dr. Bunche to convey the Egyptian representative's declaration on armistice negotiations to Israel. (The Isrealis have for several weeks been proclaiming their eagerness to open such negotiations and have been pressing the Egyptians to agree.) The Egyptian then stated that his remarks constituted neither a formal nor official declaration and that his goverment's reply would be forthcoming. In presenting his position on armistice negotiations, he said Egypt agrees to negotiations if first the Jews start by complying with the Negev withdrawal order.

## Eban Outlines Israeli Position on Armistice

Eban, for his part, said that Israel decires to see a simultaneous implementation of the withdrawal and armistice orders. Pointing to the Egyptian attempts to imagle arms into Faluja, he said this disproves Egyptian claims to peaceful intentions in the Negev and that as long as Egypt does not comply with the armistice order there are no assurances that the Faluja force, if released by the Jews, would not rejoin the main body of troops in Gaza and be used in a new attack on Israel.

The only member of the sub-committee to speak on the Egyptian position visa-vis Israel was the French delegate who said he would have acted as did the Israeli commander who confiscated the contraband cargo of the Faluja convoy. The Frenchman called the Egyptians "clumsy" for not having at least removed the kesher label from Israel-bound meats seized by the Egyptians and included in the convoy's cargo,

## BASIC PROBLEMS OF ISRAEL SETTLED, OPEN WAR UNLIKELY, ACTING MEDIATOR SAYS IN TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Although difficulties lie ahead, the "basic problems" of the establishment of the Jewish state and immigration to Israel have elready been solved, acting mediator Dr. Relph Bunche today told newsmen here after a misit with Premier David Ben Gurion and high officials of the Foreign Office.

The mediator, who arrived in the Israeli capital today over the land route from Jorusalem, stated that to all "practical purposes" a settlement has been reached and added that he does not expect the resumption of open warfare, although minor incidents are always possible. "If all parties try hard enough it will be possible to make the transition from truce to armistice and then to a final settlement," Dr. Bunche said.

He insisted that after meeting with Egyptian Fremier Nekrashy Fasha, King Abdullah of Transjordan, Ben Gurion and Freesident Weizmann, "the biggest hurdles have already been taken." The axmistice, unlike the truce, he declared, "will mean a withdrawal and reduction of forces and the establishment of normal conditions,"

He revealed that he had heard from the Israelis this morning that a solution of the Cyprus refuges problem is near and that direct British-Israeli talks have taken place. The United Mations never saw a "valid resson" for the detention of the Jews, he continued.

The mediator will make a full report of the current situation to the Scourity Council in Paris; he eaid, adding that he hoped to have more positive news by the time he reports. He asserted that the situation in the Negov was "estisfactory to the Jews and less so to the Egyptians, while the United Rations fools that the resolution has not been realized fully." In a joking said, he said that the arrival of the arminities and the departure of the U.N. truce machinery from the Middle East would be a "welcome reward" for all concerned.

# Ben Gurion and Bunche Discuss Negev Withdrawal and Armistice

During the meeting between the mediator and the Iuraeli officials, the discussion centered about "who will arrange outstanding matters in the Negev, the armistice prospects in the light of the Paris resolutions and the refugee problem," it was announced here.

A group of Pelestine Arabs yesterday submitted a memorandum to Dr. Bunche in Amman asserting that they were representatives of the Pelestine Arabs and favoring sa "Addullah's rule over the Arab part of Pelestine," George Barnes, the mediator's press officer, disclosed here today. The Pelestine Arabs added that they felt that there was already too much outside interference in Pelestine's affairs. Dr. Bunche sperit three hours with Abdullah yesterday and several more hours with the Transjordan Foreign Minister, Barnes added.

The entire U.N. party left Tel Aviv for Rehovoth to pay a courtesy visit to President Weizman, after which they were slated to fly to Haifa where they will remain overnight. The mediator will fly to Paris temorrow and from there will leave for the United States on Dec. 12 when he "assumes that the conciliation commission will take over." Special security measures were taken during the visit here, with military police and truckloads of soldiers scattered throughout the area and military jeeps, armored and radio care patrolling the roads in the vicinity of the government seat.

#### ERITAIN WILL NOT SUPPORT INRAFL'S APPLICATION FOR U.N. MEMBERSHIP, MAYHEN SAYS

LONDON, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Britain will not support Israel's application for U.W. membership, Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs Christopher Mayhew declared in Commons today, adding that the British Government considered the Jewish state's bfd for membership in the international organization prometure.

"The Government do not wish to exclude the possibility of Jewish entry into the United Nations at some later stage, but regard the present application as greamature and hard to accept in view of the fact that the future of Falestine is still being discussed and no frontiers have yet been drawn up," Mayhew said. Replying to questions, he denied that the admission of Israel to the U.W. would help the Jews and Arabe reach an equitable solution in Falestine. The British official also declared that several states had much stronger claims to U.W. membership than Icrael.

Several laborite M.P.'s interjected numbrous questions regarding the Jews still detained on Cyprus. Mayhow claimed that the continued detention of 11,200 Jews on the leland was justified by the Security Council's resolution of May 29, the terms of which were extended by the resolution of July 15. He was unable to answer a question by 8. Silverman, M.P., as to what was the legal bacis for the Jews' detaintion artist the Mandatory Power's jurisdiction torminated. He stressed that there was no obstruction to detainess of non-military age and denied that the refugees were being detained unlawfully.

Mayhow later said that the government is re-examining its position on Cyprus in the light of present Falestine developments and would review its decision if more peaceful conditions are established or a new Scourity Council resolution is adopted.

It was learned here today that Anglo-Ierael negotiations on Cyprus are not being conducted in London and that they have not reached a final a tage. An agreement is expected to be arrived at shortly, not involving a roversal of British policy on the detaines but rather a reinterpretation, enabling certain categories to leave Gyprus.

# TRIAL OF STERN GROUP CHIFES CONTINUES; DEFENDANTS PLEAD NOT GUILTY TO CHARGES

TEL AVIV, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The trial of Nathan Friedman-Yellin, Sternist this and his deputy, M. Shaulavitz, continued in the Acre military court today with the Acremiants pleading not guilty to charges of directing terrorist activities and membership in a terrorist organization from Sept. 29, 1948 on.

The procedution began to outline the case, saying that the activities of the Stern Group had not ocased with the formation of Inrael but it had continued its subtraines activities. It had failed to disband, as proved by documents, arms and money which were found in Yallin's flat. Forgad documents were also found in Yallin's flat, indicating that he and his co-defendant planned to escape abroad, the prosecution charged.

The prosecutor compared the Stern Group's ectivities to the Japanese just before Fearl Exhor. The Sternists, he said, were negotiating with the Lexeel. Government at the same time that their actions in Jarusalem amounted to a ctab in the government's back. He charged the Stern Group with responsibility in the murder of Bernadotte and said that the count was in Falestine under protection of the Israeli Government.

Policemen, soldiers end the landlord of Yellin's flat testified about his arrest. The policemen and soldiers told of finding arms and other material in his apartment.

#### ISRAELI TRADE MINISTER URGES THAT WAGES BE FROZEN TO CHECK RISING COST OF LIVING

TEL AVIV, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Miniator of Trade Dr. Fritz Bernstein demanded this week endet a meeting of the State Council that wages be frozen and industry this and agriculture concentrate only on the production of necessities in order to check the rising cost of living in the Jewish state. Dr. Bernstein emphasized the need for an expanded export progrem to aid in the absorption of new immigrants and to pay in part for imports into Invest.

The Ministry of Welfare, which deals with war casualties and losses, has expended \$2,00,000 during the past six months in helping victims of the war, Rabij Judah L. Fishman, Minister of Social Welfare, told a press conference today. Forty percent of the total figure was spent in Jerusalem and at present a total of 7,000 cases have been handled.

Direct damage to agriculture as a result of the fighting, Rabbi Fishman stated, amounts to \$10,000,000. The next leraeli budget will include an appropriation of \$1,000,000 for robuilding agricultural settlements damaged during the war.

Hundreds of Orthodox Jows demonstrated outside the offices of the State Coun-511 protesting the importation of non-kooher meet into Israel. A representative of the demonstrature who was invited into the Council leambers to confer with the Orthodox members of that body demanded the immediate enactment of legislation barring the imnort of any non-kosher meet into Israel.

## JEMISH INFANTS ON CYPRUS LIVING UNDER DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS; 600 BABIES NOW IN CAMPS

FAMAGUSTA, Cyprus, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- With the coming of the first heavy rains in Cyprus, 1,200 Jewish parents here today petitioned Rabbi A. Schreibaum, representative of the Jewish Agency, to bring to the immediate attention of the British authorities on the island the condition of Jewish infants in the Cyprict camps.

Six hundred babies under six months of age are presently in the Kylotymhou camp, while 400 more children are due to be born within the next two months. Rabbi Schreibaum said today that the discontinuation of infant quotes to Palestine-which were granted by the former Palestine High Commissioner, Sir Alan Cunningham, on humanitarian grounds--is the most serious problem encountered in administering the camps on Cyprus, where a total of 11.200 Jova are still detained.

The Jovish Agency representative assorted that 60 percent of the babies living in the Cyprus informant camps do not have cribs, while their chief source of nourishment cames from cammed, dehydrated potatees. The Missen hats in which most of them live, Rabbi Schreibaum said, have no source of heat whatseever and it is impossible to provide the infants with proper bathing facilities.

Joint Distribution Committee physicians on the island are now preparing a medical report on conditions among the detained Jews here, which will be submitted within a few days to Sir Godfrey Collins, commissioner for the IP compa

## Habeas Corpus Application of 564 Cyprus Detainees to be Heard This Week

EXESSIA, Cyprus, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Judge Griffith Williams of the Cyprus Supruss Court will hear next Saturday a habeas corpus application filed November 22 by Mordechal Serling and 563 other Jows of military age detained in the Kylowbou comp, it was reported here over the week-end. # NOTORIOUS FRENCH ANTI-SEMETE, FROP, PETRI LAUROUR, SEVERENCED TO 20 YEARS IMPRISONMENT

PARIS, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Prof. Fenri Lebrous, who held the "chair of anti-Semitiam" at the Sorbones during the Nazi coorpation of the French capital, was sentenced over the week-end to 20 years solltery confinement.

The educator stated in his defense that he had established an institute for Jewish studies in order to permit him to combat "Hithorite anti-Judaism," but the presention read into the trial testimony an article by Prof. Labrous in which he attabled five Catholic priests for assisting Jew to escape the Nazis and for demonsions Nazi persecution of members of that race.

## JEWISH INFORMER EXECUTED IN POLAND FOR TORTURING JEWS TO DEATH IN NAZI CAMPS

MARSAW, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Isidor Silbiger, reputedly the most feared Jewish informer in a number of Nazi concentration camps during the war, was henged this weekend in Bytom for his war crimes, it was reported here today, The court trial established that he porsonally beat several Jews to death in the Boleslaviec concentration camp, most of whree immates were Dutch Jews.

Josef Kolodziei, a member of the Ukrainian Nationalist Organization, which was notorious for its anti-Semitic atoricites during the war, was sentenced to death by the court in Nova Sel for initiating the mass murder of 2,000 Jews in the town of Jaslovice.

# ISRAELI ENVOY TO U.S. HOPES HEBREM UNIVERSITY IN JERUSALEM WILL BE SPIRITUAL CENTER

NEW YORK, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- The hope that Jerusalem and the Hebrev University there will become the "opiritual center of our people" was voiced here last flight by Israeli representative to the United States Eliahu Epstein, addressing a meeting of the American Friends of the Hebrev University.

Mr. Epstein disclosed that the Hebrev University is using Talmudic literature for scientific research, propering a now edition of the Hebrev Bible and translating into Rebrev the works of the ancient Greek philosophere. Asserting that the institution has also played an important role in guiding the "material upbuilding of Inracl," the Israeli representative stated that the University's research in "chemistry, physics and goology has proved of the greatest value."

# BETCH SAYS ISRAEL WILL ACHIEVE VICTORY AFTER ALL OF PALESTINE IS CCCUPIED BY JEMS

MRN YORK, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- Menachem Beigin, addressing a reception tendered him by the Brith Trumpeldor of America Last night, declared that Inreal will not have achieved victory until all of Falestine is eccupied by Jews now scattered throughout the world. #### THIS IN SO. AFRICA DIFFER ON NEED TO ESTABLISH SEPARATE JEWISH POLITICAL ORGANIZATION

JOHANNESBURG, So. Africa, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- An exchange of opinions with regard to the newly-organized Jewish group to support the present Nationalist government was bublished this west in the Case Times, at the invitation of the newspaper.

A.M. Molemet, secretary of the Caye branch of the South African Board of Jewish Deputies, emphasized that the attempt to organize Jewish support as such for the
government would be a grave disservice to the jewish community. Jews, he pointed out,
participate in politics as citizens and not as members of a Jewish group. He said
that the Board of Jewish Deputies had no connection with the Jewish group which is
attempting to establish a separate political organization for Jews, and he deprecated
this attempts.

J. Nossel, organizer of the new group, in his reply to Melamet, reitorated his intention to attempt to achieve "closer relations and better understanding between the Jews and Maticallets." He thought his method would bring results and dhraged the Beard with being partiesn and unrepresentative. Commenting on the controversy, the political correspondent of the Cape Nationalist organ, Die Burger, criticized the Heard as being anti-Nationalist.

#### REFORM RABBI OPPOSES PLAN TO MAKE ISRAELI RADBINATE SUPRIME RELIGIOUS AUTHORITY

TORONTO, Dec. 6. (JTA) -- "The state of Israel cannot become a seat of worldwide religious authority," Rabbi Abraham L. Feinberg stated here at a dinner tendered him by his congregation. More than 500 members of the congregation and leading representatives of the Jewish and non-Jewish communities here attended the function at which Dr. Relson Glueck, president of Febrey Union College, was the principal speaker.

The statement by Rabbi Feinberg came as a reply to the Rabbinteal Council of America which amnounced recently that it would seek recognition of the Chief Rabbinate of Israel as the supreme religious authority for all Jowe. Indicating that such a move would be resisted by Liberal Judaism, Rabbi Feinberg said: "Jows in every land have the right and duty to feathen Judaism on the background of their our environment, with a maximal tie to tradition. Liberal Judaism labors with faith that the Jevish spiritual genius can function anywhere on earth, however conscious it may be of rootage in anniont Palestine, and reliance on today's Israeli republic."

## MONUMENT HONORING ERERCH JEWISH VETERANS UNVETLED IN PARIS; POSTHUMOUS AWARDS MADE
