THRANK CHARGES ERITAIN WITH SUPPLYING U.S. TANNES TO EGYPT; FIVE TANNES CAPTURED

THE AVIV. DEC. 16. (JTA) -- A spokesman for the Israeli Government today charged Britain with supplying the Arabs with American-made tanks. Five such tanks were knocked out by the Israeli Army on the Egyptian front in a battle ten days ago. the spokesman said.

The five tanks, it was established, were of an American model shipped to England in 1948. They were reshipped by Britain to Egypt during the past two months as reinforcements, the Israeli spokesman said. Each tank weighs seven tons and mounts a 75-millimeter gum and a heavy machinegun. These type of tanks were first seen in the Palestine war early this month.

(The War Office in London today denied that the five tanks were of a type made in the United States according to British specifications, or that Pritzin had recently sent them to Egypt. Routers reported.)

JEMISH AGENCY COVERS FIRST PAYMENT ON ISRAELI LOAN; BANK DEPOSITS RISE IN ISRAEL

TEL AVIV. Dec. 16. (JTA) -- The Jewish Agency yesterday deposited \$2.000.000 in Israeli banks to cover ten percent of the \$20,000,000 national internal loan which the Agency agreed on June 15 of this year to guarantee, Elieser Kaplan, Israeli Finance Minister, told a press conference here today.

According to the terms of the loan issue, one-tenth of the total was due to be repayed yesterday. The funds deposited consist in part of cash and in part of foreign exchange which can be used to pay for imports, as provided for in the terms of the issue.

Meanwhile, David Horovitz, Under Secretary for the Treasury, disclosed that the greatest part of the Israeli war budget has been raised internally, rather than from funds arriving from abroad. He announced that the major part of \$150,000,000 needed to provide housing for immigrants next year is expected to come from abroad. He also said that bank deposits throughout the country have risen considerably during the past times months.

The Israeli State Council today received proposals from the Cabinet Education Committee calling for a national education bucget of \$6,400,000 and for the establishment of the first free education system in Jerusalem. The proposals of the Committee, headed by David Remez, Minister for Communications, would leave the country's education system unchanged until after the Constituent Assembly meets next year.

One-half of the Israel1 education budget will be met by the government and the remainder by the Jewish Agency. Local authorities will nearly double the government's contribution, supplying \$11,000,000. It is estimated that some 2.500 teachers will be needed to teach 80,000 elementary school pupils, including 3,000 newly arrived immigrant children. In Jerusalem the government will provide two-thirds of the education budget, while the municipality provides the remainder.

INRAEL READY TO MEET BRITAIN BALWAY ON RECOGNITION, ISRAELI OFFICIAL INDICATES

LOYDON, Dec. 16. (JPA) -- Israel is ready to meet Britain halfway if an approach is made on the recognition of the Jevich state, it was indicated in Tel Aviv by Walter Eytan in behalf of the Israel! BEVIN ASES U.N. MEDIATOR TO CONTACT ISRAELI GOVERNMENT ON DOWNED ERETESH PLANE

LONDON, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- British Air Minister Arthur Benderson today told the House of Commons that Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin has as and the United Nations acting Palestine mediator, Dr. Ralph Duncae, to contact the Israell Government connection with a British report that an R.A.F. Mosquito was shot down near Tel Aviv on Nov. 20 by an Israell fighter and crashed into the sea, tilling two orew members.

Henderson stated that "if the mediator can establish the facts as we see them, we shall make strong representations to the Jewish authorities." Earlier, Conservative leader Anthony Eden present henderson for specific information concerning the alleged attack on the British craft.

Opposition leader Winston Churchill asked why it was necessary to undertake a filight "over this very dangerous and delicate area." He later urged that the fovernment pureus "this matter rigorously to ascertain whether cruel or outrageous measures had not been taken against our airmen."

The British Air Ministry, in disclosing the alleged attack on the $R_aA_aF_a$ plane, said lest night that the oraft was based in the Suez Canal zone and was on a high allettude treating flight when it was fixed on.

(Asked by correspondents in Tel Aviv today about the Eritish report on the shooting down of an R.A.F. Mosquito, an Israell Government spokesman refused to disclose the nationality of the downed plane. "Our fighter pilot spotted a Mosquito warplane that was not ours. Since we are at war, we had to assume it had hostile intentions and therefore it was shot coun," he said.)

STERRIST LEADER TESTIFIES HE KNEW HOTELING OF GROUP WHICH ASSASSINATED BERNADOFTE

HAIFA, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- The trial of Nethan Friedman-Yollin, leader of the Stern Group, and his aids M. Schmulovitz, was adjourned in Acre today and will resume Monday. A lengthy cross-examination by the presenter highlighted today's preceding.

Friedman-Yellin denied any knowledge of or commention with the "Fatherland Front," reportedly a splinter of the Sternist organization. He told the court that he had beard of this group only from newspaper reports. A leaflet signed "Fatherland Front" claimed responsibility for the assassination of Count Bernadotte, the late U.S. Palestine mediator.

BRITISH FOREIGH OFFICE SETTMATES ISRAEL HAS TAKEN OVER \$380,000,000 OF ARAB ASSETS

IONDON, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- The Israeli Government has taken over 95,000,000 pounds (\$380,000,000) of Arab assets in Israel, according to an estimate made by the Foreign Orfice here for the British Government.

This calculation includes the value of Arab Haifa and Jaffa, now in Israeli hands, and will be used, British sources say, as a basis for figuring the amount of restitution to be raid to the Arabs by Brael.

No decision has yet been reached on a proposal made by the British Foreign Office that the bulk of the Palestine sterling belance in London should be held as security against ultimate settlement of the Arab refugee account by Jerael. The amount involved is calculated here as about 35 to 40 million pounds.

While there have been cortain limited releases of funds in Israel's account recently, these were held strictly to cover essential purchases from the sterling area, such as petroleum, wheat and other foodstuffs.

It is now learned that considerable sums have been released in the last few months to what is termed the "Arab Felestine accounts" No detailed figures are available, but there is confirmation that large amounts have been freed from the so-called "frozen No. 2 account" through Baroleys Bank to the Ottomon Bank for payment in Rablus and Hebron.

This money, ecoording to financial circles here, must automatically find its way to Amman, Transfordan, under present circumstances and thus provide substantial reserves of convertible storling currency for use by King Abdullah's government.

It is becoming clear that the British Government is convinced that the great bulk of Arab refugees will not return to their homes and that alternative homes must be found for them without unduly upsetting existing social structures.

One serious resettlement problem, according to Middle East experts here, in that the introduction of large numbers of Palestine Arabs into Transjorden, Syria or Ireq would immediately produce a sharp social crists in those countries. For the standard of life of the Palestine Arabs has been materially above that in the neighboring states. The consequence of such mass discontent song the restitled Palestine Arabs might be far-reaching and upsetting for the present regimes in those countries.

U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL OPTIMISTIC ON PRACE IN PALESTINE; LAUDS GENOCIDE CONVENTION

NEW YORK, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- Optimism regarding the possibility of peace in Falsetine was expressed here today by U.H. Scoretary General Prygge Lie upon his return from the Paris ossion of the United Nations General Assembly.

Mr. Lie also expressed satisfaction with the adoption by the General Assembly of the generale convention to cutlaw the mass murder of recidil and religious groups, and especially with the fact that the international pact, immediately after its adoption, was signed by the representatives of trenty governments. He also lauded the adoption of the Declaration of Human Rights by the Assembly.

head of senate judiciary committee says congress will definitely liberalize DP law

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16. (JTA) - Sen. Alexander Wiley, chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, in a statement to the press, asserted today that "beyond the shadow of a doubt," the new Congress will amend the present DP law to remove "its administrative enable and iron out its inequities." The Judiciary Committee handles displaced persons questions.

The Senator also made public a letter he received a few days ago from Ugo Carusi, chairman of the Displaced Fersons Commission, in which the latter points out that the complexity of the DP immigration law is one of the chief factors holding up progress in the progrem. Carusi also sharply attacked the disputed "out-off" date in the law-which makes only those DP's who entered the refuges camps before Doc. 22, 195, eligible for admission to the Uss, and thus bars thousands of Folish Jows who fled Foland to the Uss, zone in Germany soon after the outbreak of post-war pogrems in Foland.

Sen. Wiley listed five goals which he said should "remain among the most important ones in our future displaced persons policy." They are: 1. Fulfillment of our humanitarian responsibilities to the displaced persons, "irrespective of race, orsed or national origin; 2. Re-uniting of relatives and kin; 3. Adequate screening "agains the possible infilitration of Soviet agents and subversive-minded individuals;" h. Advancing the national welfare by trying to bring in persons who can fill manpower shortages in key job specialties; and, 5. Fullect cooperation with church, citizens and other groups seeking homes and jobe for the DP's "to avoid unnecessary delays and prevent dislocation among our our citizens."

REFORES URGED TO CLAIM THEIR PROPERTY IN GERMANY BEFORE EXPIRATION OF 1948 DEADLINE

PARIS, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- Joel H. Fisher, American Joint Distribution Committee general counsel in Europe, today issued an emphatic reminder to former residents of Germany that it will soon be too late to make claims on non-German currency and security assets still being held in that country.

December 31 of this year has been fixed as the deadline for such claims, he pointed out, noting also that, under an agreement concluded between American, Britisl and French military governments, the regulations apply to all non-German nationals, both Jewich and non-Jewish.

Insufficient publicity on the deadline date Fisher dealared, has left too many emigrants now living in Israel, the United States and other countries, ignorant of their rights. Fromt action is required if they are still to qualify for their rightful property, he added. Currency and securities involved are those being hald in Garmany under the terms of Military Government Lew No. 53. Only non-German currency, and securities expressed in non-Gorman currency, are involved.

For applications to warrant consideration, army regulations provide that they must be accompanied by evidence of ownership and proof that the property is free of external and internal restitution claims. Once tills to a claim has been granted, the non-readdent owner is free to remove his property from the country.

All applications for recognition of title should be sent to the office of the Finance Advisor, CMUS, APO 742, U.S. Army, if the property is located in the American zone. British some claims should be filed with the British Finance Division and those located in the French zone of Germany should be addressed to the French Finance Division.

HEVISION OF PRAYER BOOK BY PSYCHOLOGISTS URGED AT CONFERENCE OF JEVISH CHAFLAIRS

NEW YORK, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- A recommendation that the prayer book currently used by Jostsh chaplains be revised was presented yesterday at a conference of the Division of Religious Activities of the Jostsh Welfare board. Frank L. Well, president of the J.W.B., told the 52 chaplains attending the conference that Jewish chaplains have a greater responsibility in the armed forces today than during varying.

Rabbis Israel Gerber, of Fitchburg, Mass., and Ronald Gittelsohn, of Rockvillo Contro, L.I., emphasized that hospitalized Jewish veterans require special devotional literature and urged that prayer bools prepared for Jewish veterans who are mentally ill be "carofully screened by psychologists and psychiatrists" to eliminate "many mystic elements from religions"

2.0.A. URGES CHECKING OF UNAUPHORIZED EFFORTS FOR ISRAEL IN UNITED STATES

A resolution made public by the Z.O.A. requests that the United Falestine Appeal, the American Zioniat Emergency Council and the American section of the Jewish Agency, as duly constituted Zionist bodies, assert their proper authority "to ensure an ordered and effective organization of all such activities on the American scene,"

At the same time the Zioniet Organization of America announced today that within the next two weeks, three chips carrying gifts procured through the Food for Israel drive will leave from the harbors of New Orleans, Philadelphia now York.

POLICY OF ARAB-JEMISH RAPPROCHEMENT OUTLINED BY ISRAELI ENVOY AT MAGNES MEMORIAL

NEW YORK, Dec. 16. (JTA) -- Leaders of all walks of Jewish life tonight attended a memorial meeting honoring the late Judah L. Magnes, former president of Bebrew University in Jerusalam, who died here in October. Eliahu Epstein, Israeli representative in Washington, and former Governor Herbert H. Lehman, were among the principal speakers at the memorial, which was held at Temphe Bennu-El.

Paying tribute to Dr. Magnes, Epstein said that although Magnes' practical suggestions to reach relations of mutual friendship and trust between Jews and Arabs may be outdated by now, his underlying conception is fully shared by the people and government of lerael today.

"While we consider the strengthening of Israel as the main guarantee for our survival, we will simultaneously launch a far-sighted and statesmanlike policy of rapprochement and understanding with the Arab countries," the Israeli any tated. "We wish to preserve and continue to develop the western features of our civilization. We must remember, however, that our destiny will depend in many respects on what will happen in the Middle East. Nothing would be more dangerous than to follow a polloy of "splendid isolation" or complete indifference to developments in Arab countries, Turkey, Tran and even India."

Leiman emphasized that "Dr. Magnos could have remained a greatly beloved and respected member of our American jovish community, which offered him many honors and a safe and comparatively easy life. His deep-rooted interest and devotion, however, lay in Palestine."
