ETHER ANNOUNCES POSTPONEMENT OF DR. WEIZMANN'S VISIT TO U.S. BECAUSE OF ILLINESS

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- The White House announced today that the visit Mr. Chaim Weizmann, President of Israel, to the United States has been postponed mtil late in April, because of Dr. Weizmann's health.

The Israeli President was expected to attend a New York dinner arranged by the American Committee for the Weizmann Institute of Science on February 19. Presiist fruman hoped to be present at the testimonial dinner for Dr. Weizmann.

The text of the White House statement reads as follows:

The President has learned with deep regret that Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President if the State Council of Israel, has been compelled by illness to postpone his visit the United States until April. The White House has been informed that Dr. Weizmm's illness is not of a serious character and that he will be able to preside over to mevly-elected Constituent Assembly. However, his physicians have counseled him sainst exposure to a sharp change in weather conditions and have strongly urged that b wit until the Spring."

The White House also made public the text of a cablegram sent by President ham to President Weizmann, reading: "Deeply regret to learn of your illness. We mail praying for your speedy and complete recovery. Looking forward to our meetin again. Sincerely yours, Harry S. Truman."

In his cablegram to the President, Dr. Weizmann said: "I regret to inform you the ty physicians decline permit me to undertake a voyage to the United States beim Spring. I should, accordingly, be grateful if you could find it possible to tree to the postponement of the function to a suitable date in the latter part of iril. I am deeply conscious of your friendship. With renewed assurances of my high esteem. Sincerely yours. Chaim Weizmann."

EVIN RECEIVES ISRAELI REPRESENTATIVE; GETS SHERTOK'S REPLY TO BRITISH RECOGNITION

LONDON, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- Foreign Socretary Ernest Bevin today received I.J. Linton, acting Israeli representative here, who conveyed the reply of Israeli Foreign Muister Moshe Shertok to Bevin's message announcing de facto recognition of Israel by the British Government.

Following his visit to Bevin, Linton conferred with a number of high officials of the British Foreign Office. No details of the conversations were revealed. However, it is understood that they were devoted primarily to questions of diplomatic protocol connected with the establishment of diplomatic relations between Israel and British.

Significance is attached here to the fact that Bevin received Shertok's reply proceedly and not through British Foreign Office officials. Questions concerning the exhange of diplomatic representatives between Britain and Israel will be discussed by Cyril Marriott, British consul-general in Haifa, with the Israeli Foreign office in Tel Aviv, it is believed here.

When asked in the House of Commons today whether the British representative to Israel had been appointed, Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin asked the questioner to "sit for a day." Left-wing Labor member Emrys Hughes asked anid laughter: "In view of the esteem in which the Foreign Secretary is held in Tel Aviv, can he not be permised to go there himself?" Bevin replied: "I might be successful."

INAL READY TO MEET TRANSJORDAN ON ARMISTICE TALKS; AGREEMENT WITH EGYPT EXPECTED

TEL AVIV, Feb. 2. MATURE NATURALIZATION PROPOSAL MODIFIED TO PERMIT ALIFNS TO REMAIN IN COUNTRY

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- A spokesman for President Peron announced tothat the Constitutional Commission, after consulting "high national leaders," mofied the section in the draft on constitutional reforms which proposed that foreigngreating in Argentina more than two years must either become naturalized or are the country.

850 JEMISH IMMICRANTS REACHED U.S. IN LAST THREE MONTHS, U.S.N.A. REPORTS

NEW YORK, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- A total of 3,850 Jewish immigrants, many of them displaced persons, reached the United States in the last three months, entering ports hilferent parts of the country, according to a survey completed today by Edwin members, president of United Service for New Americans.

Of this figure, Rosenberg reported, approximately 2,500 received some form a sesistance from U.S.N.A. The bulk of the newcomers arrived in New York, Boston, in Fractisco and Miami. During this same period, the report said, "Whited Service for New Americans expended \$2,500,000 to bring newcomers into the country, to assist these already here and for medical care and hospitalization, clothing, vocational beining and for special assistance to orphaned Jewish children reaching the U.S."

During the months of November, December and January, the report continued, ISMA assisted an average of 12,000 individuals monthly in the form of direct rules, social work guidance, dental and medical care, vocational guidance and other rubblitative services. The agency aided an average of 6,000 American citizens each with in arranging for the filing of necessary legal documents to bring relatives wi friends from Europe to this country, the report stated.

15 JEMISH REFUGEES ARRIVE IN N.Y. FROM GERMANY; MAJORITY ARE SPONSORED BY HIAS

NEW YORK, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- The S.S. Marine Shark arrived here today from a many with nearly 400 displaced persons, including 153 Jews of whom 112 were sponsately MIAS. The vessel is the seventh DF ship to reach these shores under terms of the Displaced Persons Act of 1948, making the total number of DF's brought to the LS to date 3,909, of whom 1,494 were Jews. A statement issued by HIAS headquarters have said that 1,054 of the Jewish DF's who have arrived in this country under the Finingration law were sponsored by HIAS.

THE CETS BILL TO OUTLAW MAILING OF PRINTED MATTER LIBELLING RACIAL GROUPS

WHENDOTON, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- A group libel law that would make it illegal, the between states, import into the United States or mail any printed or mimeophil material designed to stir up racial or religious hatred was introduced in the gas today by a bi-partisen group of five Representatives.

Co-sponsored by Representatives Jacob K. Javits, Arthur G. Klein, Kenneth B. stug, William L. Dawson and Eugene J. Kecgh, the measure is based on a study contact by the American Jewish Congress.

The bill makes it unlawful for any person "with intent to create ill will single racial or religious group within the United States or any of its territor-involvely" to bring into the country or disseminate by mail or "by common carrier" printed or mimeographed material identifying any person or group with his race or identifying should be shou

The measure carries the provision that "no person shall be convicted under its section if such statement is true or was honestly believed by him upon reasonable gounds, to be true. The burden of coming forward with evidence upon the issues furth, honest belief, reasonableness of belief and intent to create ill will shall sum the defendant, but the burden of proof beyond a reasonable doubt upon the entire sees shall be upon the prosecution."

The bill makes it a misdemeanor to disseminate such literature. Any person or mans convicted under the act would be liable to not more than \$1,000 fine or one ar infisomment or both. As a further safeguard, the measure requires that no proming for violations of the act can be instituted by any district attorney without trior approval of the Attorney-General. The prosecution of any case by a district through the supervision of the Attorney-General.

Congressman Klein, Javits, and Keating told a press conference that their meaum was not designed to attack anti-Semitic literature alone but to safeguard Nesws, Catholics, Protestants and other racial or religious minority groups from mulius attack.

ALBANY, N.Y., Feb. 2. (JTA) -- A bill to revise and implement existing legislum marring religous end racial discrimination in public places was introduced in % State Legislature yesterday. The bill was prepared in cooperation with a committo of the American Jewish Congress.

The bill would authorize the filing of complaints by victims of racial or relights discrimination with the State Commission Against Discrimination, which would the beauthorized to proceed in the same manner it now does in cases of employment bias.

LEGICAL BAR ASSOCIATION URGES SENATE NOT TO RATIFY U.N. CONVENTION ON GENOCIDE

CHICAGO, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- The House of Delegates of the American Bar Associatia, with earlier unanimously approved a resolution calling on the U.S. delegation the little Nations to delay at least for one year final action on the proposed intended coverant on human rights, yesterday unanimously adopted a resolution alling on the United States not to ratify the U.N. convention outlawing genocide.

The action was taken on a resolution submitted by the Association's president, but E. Holman, of Seattle, which said that the U.N. genecide convention should not happened by the Senate "until and unless there has been accorded the time and operatly for adequate public discussion and understanding of the convention."

MANITE OF ZIONIST CONTRIBUTORS CALLS FOR IMMEDIATE LAUNCHING OF U.J.A. CAMPAIGN

NEW YORK, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- The Committee of Zionist Contributors to the Unlied Jevish Appeal, in an open letter signed by 21 members from communities throughat the country, and addressed to the chairmen of the two major constituent agencies of the U.J.A-the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal-toby called for the immediate launching of the United Jevish Appeal campaign for 1949 without waiting for the selection of a general chairman.

Declaring that "the acceptance of Henry Montor is an impossibility" and that 'amy Morgenthau, Jr. would be acceptable only without Montor," the Committee expressed the conviction that there was no use for further delay in organizing the U.J.A. campains since "every hour of delay is paid for by the lives and suffering of Jews in large and Israel."

MITTED ISRAEL APPEAL CAMPAIGN OPENED IN MONTREAL; THIRD OF QUOTA RAISED AT DINNER

MONTHEAL, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- A total of \$510,000 was raised here last night at simmer which marked the opening of the United Israel Appeal in Montreal. The quota for this city is \$1,500,000. Hyman Grover, national chairman of the U.I.A. in Canala, resided at the gathering.

The dinner was the largest in attendance of any Jewish communal function ever add in Montreal. Speakers included Aubrey S. Eban, Israeli representative to the Unted Mations; Shimon Hacohen, of Israel, who is now touring Canada on behalf of the waish National Fund and Keren Hayesed, and Semuel Bronfman, president of the Canadian with Congress and honorary Dominion chairman of the United Israel Appeal.

Mr. Bronfman said that British recognition of Israel was the final fulfilltant of the Balfour Declaration. It was a vindication of the faith "that the bond of friendship which had been established during preceding centuries between the British and Jewish peoples had been established not for a season, but for all time," is stated.

RESIDENT WEIZMANN MAY SOON VISIT SOUTH AMERICA; SENDS MESSAGE TO JEWS THERE

MONTEVIDEO, Feb. 2. (JTA) -- Arieh Chill, Jewish Agency representative in latin America, who recently arranged a tour of Israel by leading Jewish industrialists from this continent, arrived here today from Tel Aviv.

Chill said that he was instructed by Israeli President Chaim Weizmann to control amessage from him to Latin-American Jewry. The message, which extended cordial sestings to the Jewish communities in Latin America, expressed the hope that Dr. Weimann would be able to pay a visit to South America soon.

WITH HOUSE CONTINUES TO RECEIVE MESSAGES HAILING U.S. RECOGNITION OF ISRAEL
