### EARLI FINANCE MINISTER FREDICTS RESTCRATION OF UNITY IN U.J.A. "WITHIN FEW DAYS"

NEW MCRK, Feb. 25. (JTA) -- The belief that unity will be rectored in the United Jevish Appeal "within a few days" and that the 1949 U.J.A. campaign will then eset "in full swing" was expressed here today at a press conference by Israeli Fimars Minister Eliezer Kaplan, who is scheduled to leave on Sunday for Paris on rote home.

Paying tribute to President Truman and to the board and staff of the Export-Eport Bank for showing "a most sympathetic understanding and consideration" for the mode of the Jewish state in making the \$100,000,000 loan available to Israel, Kaplan mis that the loan will strongthen economic and financial relations between Israel and the United States. "It is a demonstration of confidence in the stability of the state d israel and its economic structure," he stated.

The Israeli Minister emphasized at the same time that in addition to financial exces like taxation at home and international borrowing, Israel now needs contribution and must attract investment by private capital, especially for the absorption of new igniorants.

# ESTEIN NAMED ISRAELI AMBASSADOR TO U.S.: MCDCNALD BECOMES U.S. AMBASSADOR TO ISRAEL

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25. (JTA) -- President Truman today announced the nomination of Jemes G. McDonald to surve as first Ambassador of the United States to Israel. McDonald has been special representative to Israel since July 1948.

The nomination follows agreement by the two nations to establish Embassies in Washington and Tel Aviv. The State Department said that the Government of Israel had informed the United States that Eliahu Epstein, former special representative to the United States, has been appointed Israeli Ambassador to this country.

The Israell Ambassador today assumed the name of Eliahn Elath. Elath is an old Hebrew word for Aqaba and Ambassador Elath is following a present-day trend in Israel by changing his old name for a Hebrew one, the Israell Embassy explained.

# ISRAELI GENERAL ZIONISTS ASK ACTIONS COMMITTEE MEETING ON SILVER, NEUMANN RESIGNATIONS

TEL AVIV, Feb. 25. (JTA) -- A demand that the Zionist Actions Committee be called into session immediately to consider the resignations of Drs. Abba Hillel Siler and Emanuel Neumann from the Jewish Agency executive was voiced today by the General Zionist Federation of Israel, in a statement issued here.

Meanwhile, conflicting attitudes on the question of the resignations were taken this week by Israeli newspapers representing verious shades of political opinion. The labor newspaper Davar celled on Drs. Silvor and Neumann to withdraw their resignations. The General Zionist Haboker charges that the opposition to Drs. Silvor and Neumann took every action to limit the influence of the Zionist Organization of America, while the Revisionist Hamashkif demanded an explanation of the situation regarding the resignations.

(Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council, today expressed the congratulations of the American Zionist movement to the government of Israel for the successful completion of the negotiations at Rhodes culminating in the Expytian-Israeli armistice. In a wire sent to Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Shartok, Dr. Silver, in behalf of the Council, which represents all official Zionist todies in the United States, lauded the "magnificent stand taken by Israel in pursuit of an honorable peace.")

## REBENICAL DELECATION CALLS ON WEIZMANN; CHIEF RABBI BESTOWS BLESSING ON HIM

RECOVOTH, Feb. 25. (JTA) -- A rabbinical delegation led by Chief Rabbi Isaac Errog called on President Weizmann here yesterday and congratulated him on his election to the Presidency of Israel.

Responding to the rabbis' greetings, Dr. Weizmann told members of the delegation: "Do as in the days of the Prophete. Do not hesitate to criticize the President Manager this is warranted." Chief Rabbi Herzog, at the conclusion of the visit, placed his hands on President Weizmann's head and pronounced a traditional blessing.

Meanwhile, preparations are now being completed in Tel Aviv for Dr. Weizmann's wish to the city on Tuesday, when he will be the municipality's guest of honor.

### ES. ARMY IN AUSTRIA LIFTS BAN ON EMIGRATION OF JEWS BETWEEN 18 AND 15 TO TERRAT.

VINEWA, Feb. 25. (JTA) -- The United States Army today lifted the ban on emigration to Israel from Austria of refugnes between the ages of 16 and 45. An Army golsems said that the ban has been lifted for all "except those in military consortes."

Jovish organizations here predicted an immediate spurt in emigration as a restation of the heavy action. It is expected that by July, all the prospective emigrants to Irseal will have been transferred except about four to five thousand who wish to signife to other destinations. The Joint Distribution Committee will continue to ear for these refugees until they can be resettled.

The decree establishing the Directorate states at this action is necessary because "the manpower of the country must be satched" that "future generations may constitute an ethnically homogeneous entity."

Manufile, the Jewish community here has not been stirred much by an announceat by the pro-Feronist Oreanizacion Israelita Argentina that all applications for tes for Jewish innigrants, even close blood relations of Argentine residents, must cleared by the O.I.A. before being forwarded to the appropriate government agency. to amouncement has been accepted as an official confirmation that there is discrimation between Jews and non-Jews, since for the latter there is no extra procedure estite the regular government service for studying applications for visas.

Similarly, the Jevs do not expect much from the O.I.A.'s announcement that the w federal Constitution will contain an article that "Argentina does not recognize by racial differences." They still remember that during the recent election campaign to 6.I.A. promised that the Constitution would declare racial persecution a high oring on the sema level as treason. That promise has never been carried out.

A recent development which is causing a great deal of concern here is the hast practice of notaries in the Greater Buencs Aires area to enter the religion dall parties to real estate transactions within 25 kilometers of the coast. This strip has been declared a "security zone." Since many Jews have purchased real esut in the Buence Aires area in recent years, as a hodge against inflation, there is morn in the community over the government's reasons for seeking this information. is official explanation has been made.

WOUS, JEAS BRING SUTE FOR EXPUSSION FROM MORPPEAN ROYAL ALLPGEDLY OF RACIAL GROUNDS

MONTREAL, Fob. 25. (JTA) -- Legal proceedings were begun today against the Ant Tropblant Lodge, Ltd., in the Superior Court of Terre Bonne district arising of of a case of alloged anti-Jewish discrimination by the hotel. The plaintiffs mai. Milit and Mathan Colimb, of New York, and the defendant is J.B. Ryun, heir to titleislphia locomotive fortune. The plaintiffs are cooking \$2,100 in damages.

A declaration filed by the plaintiffs alleges "malicious, inhuman and unwarnoted breach of contract and non-execution of obligation," as well as "unjust and permated discrimination because of race and crosd of plaintiffs." The plaintiffs dig they were denied "civil rights granted plaintiffs by law, in addition to a brack of contract. The defendant has no right to discriminate between guests, since to bitel's services are public services," the complaint says.
