THE AVIV. Feb. 26. (JTA) -- A seven-man Transjordan delegation to the Rhodes istice talks arrived today on the Greek island, a report from Rhodes stated. The agetton, which includes two civilian sides, met informally with U.N. acting media-Salghe J. Burche and his chief of staff, Gen. William E. Riley.

The Transjordanians are slated to meet with Dr. Bunche tonight to cutline King mileh's demands. It is almost certain that the Transjordan delegation will not present Iraq, despite previous statements to this effect by Iraqi spokesmen and Ablah. The Israeli delegation is due to speak with Dr. Bunche tomorrow, after which vill draw up a tentative agenda for the parley which is expected to get under wednesday.

Meanwhile, the members of the Israeli delegation which will meet with Lebanese expecutatives at the border town of Ros el Nakura for armistice negotiations startng tenerrow have been named. Lebanese junior officers have already arrived at the and have begun to make arrangements for the talks, which will be held in a formes-like police station inside Israeli territory.

The evacuation of the Faluja pocket was completed this afternoon, after which U.H. officer formally turned over the area to Israeli officers. Besides the Egypdin garrison, some 1,000 Arab civilians left for Gaza. Others, who wished to go to born, could not be cleared since permission was not forthcoming from the Transjorenlans who hold that city. About 500 Arab civilians remain in the town.

The first meeting of the Israeli-Egyptian armistics commission will be held et kaja el Hafir, in the demiltarized zone, Wednesday, it was learned today. The body, copposed of three Arabs and three Jews and presided over by Gen. Biley, will meet in ascret.

An exchange of correspondence between U.M. Secretary-General Trygre Lie and Erreli Foreign Minister Moshe Shortok over the signing of the Israeli-Egyptian againtice pact was released here. Lie declared that "in reaching the agreement you and your government have significantly contributed to the cause of international peace." In his reply Shertok praised Lie's role in the Middle Eastern peace campaign and expressed the hope that "our joint peace efforts will be crowned with complete success."

CHILLATION COMMISSION REVIEWS ARAB REFUGES PROBLEM; I.R.O. HEAD TO JOIN DISCUSSIONS

JENUSALEM. Feb. 28. (JTA) -- Members of the United Nations Conciliation Commission for Palestine met here today and reviewed the problem of Palestine Arab refuses who fled the country after the outbreak of hostilities last year. Also on the tounds were a review of the Commission members' 15-day tour of the Arab capitals and Israel, preparation of a progress report to U.N. Secretary-General Trygve Lie and consideration of a proposal to call a conference of Arab Covernment officials to study the Arab refugee problem.

A communique issued after today's session also revealed that William H. Tuck, International Refugee Organization director-general, is expected to arrive here from General shortly in order to discuss the Arab refugee question with the Commission.
