PRITY COUNCIL VOTES TO ADMIT ISRAEL TO U.N. MEMBERSHIP; VOTE IS 9 TO 1

LAKE SUCCESS, March 4. (JTA) -- The U.N. Security Council tonight voted, by s to one, with one abstention, to recommend the admission of Israel to the United tions. Final approval must be given by the General Assembly which will begin meetg again April 5.

Britain abstained, while Egypt cast the lone negative ballot. Specifically e Council adopted a resolution proposed at the last minute by the United States, which the Council recognizes that Israel "is a peace-loving state fully capable carrying cut its obligations under the Charter.

Explaining the British position, Sir Terrence Shone, in a carefully prepared stement, told the Council that his government was obliged to abstain until Israel d "clarified" its position with respect to the future of Jerusalem and the Palesine Arab refugees.

At a press conference immediately following the Council's vote, Autrey S. hm, Israeli representative at the U.N. declared: "The Council has given decisive sternational recognition of Israel's character as an independent peace-loving state. reiding controversial entanglements on the international scene, Israel seeks in the nited Nations a comprehensive framework for a peaceful foreign policy." He pledged brael's cooperation through the U.M. to rehabilitate the Middle East by regional ecoenic planning.

The effect of Britain's abstention, Eban said, would have to be considered by the Israeli Government. Asked to explain this reference, Eban said he was referas to the inevitable psychological reaction, while admitting the abstention would

RECORS, March 4. (JTA) -- The Israeli-Transjordan armistics talks opened here formally today with a mine-minute joint session at which acting U.N. mediator Ralph J. Following the conclusion of this busimess, Dr. Bunche made a short, formal speech of welcome to the delegates.

The atmosphere at the brief session was strained and the Arab delegates refused to be introduced to their Jewish counterparts. The Transjordanians filed out mediately after the session was concluded. In view of this attitude, Reuven Shihead of the Israeli delegation, prepared to fly back to Tel Aviv for consultations with his government.

### - 5 -H ACENCY ESTABLISHES ECONOMIC DEPARTMENT TO STIMULATE U.S., INVESTMENTS FOR ISRAEL

NEW YORK. Merch 4. (JTA) -- The establishment in New York of an economic . ment by the Jewish Agency "for the puresse of stimulating and mobilizing tean investment capital for the development of Igrael," was announced at a gress erence here today. The conference was addressed by Dr. Nahum Goldmann, acting wan of the American section of the Agency's executive, and by Robert R. Nathan. towney's economic adviser.

"The economic department will welcome inquiries from individuals, firms and sizations throughout America with respect to investments, tourist traffic and ral economic information. To the maximum extent of its ability, the department l serve all inquirers," Dr. Goldmann said.

Mr. Nathan stated that the newly established department will secure detailed omation from Israel with respect to opportunities for particular industries and mts. and will make these data readily available to American interests. He cited emmple by pointing out that daviously excellent opportunities offer themselves the field of hotel investments at the present time and that the economic department my preparing a comprehensive brochure dealing with all aspects of this question r the benefit of the American investor.

"In all its activities, the economic department is working in close occuperaon with the Israeli Government and its representatives in the United States," Nathan id. "The department has also an office in Jorusalem with which it is in constant munication for the two-day flow of information."

#### H.F. LEADERS DISCUSS LAND ACQUISITION PROGRAM: CONSIDER INSURANCE PLAN

NEW YORK, March 4. (JTA) -- A plan for the Jewish National Fund to launch cantaign for individuals to buy insurance policies naming the organization as beneiciary was presented here today in connection with the extraordinary conference of be J.W.F. which will continue through Sunday at the Waldorf-Astoria. The proceeds from these policies would be used to set up a reserve fund for land redemption purposes.

At a preliminary meeting today, delegates to the conference considered a progen for large-scale land acquisition in Israel. The program, which has been worked out by the financial experts of the Jewish National Fund, provides for housing for the incoming immigrants and for the expansion of the agricultural economy and reclamation of waste lands. One of its features is the settling on farms of large numbers of Ismeli soldiers who have expressed a desire for farm life. Dr. Joseph Weiss, financial export of the J.N.F., was the principal speaker.

REPORT ON JEWISH ALL-DAY SCHOOLS SHOWS INCREMENT IN PUPILS; 120 SCHOOLS EXIST IN U.S.

NEW YORK, March 4. (FEA) -- A total of 18,397 pupils are now attending 120 living all-day schools in the United States, it was amnowed today by Michael A. Swritzky, president of the American Association for Switz Blausston, on the boats of a study just completed by the Americation. More than 12,000 of them are enrolled in Bw York's 60 schools: the remainder attend 25 schools located in 35 other cities.

This enrollment represents a 15 percent increase in registration over that of 1946, when the latest study on enrollment in all-day schools was made by the Association. Of the total all-day school enrollment 13,650 are boys and 5,134 girls.
