RHODES. March 30. (JTA) -- Acting United Nations Palestine mediator Dr. Min J. Bunche, commenting on the Syrian Army's coup early today, said that he preand the Israeli-Syrian armistice negotiations which were earlier scheduled to begin thin a few days would be held despite the events in Damascus. London Hears Syrians May Now Halt Armistics Talks With Israel

NEW YORK, March 30. MEMICE, March 30. (JTA) -- "No more than 5,000 Jews will remain in Austria after 1950, including 1,500 to 2,000 Jewish displaced persons, "Ernest Stiessny, reswasntative of the World Jewish Congress in Vienna, declared at a gress interview.

"Today, there are about 12,000 Jews in Vienna," Stiessny said, "but there is no doubt that at least 10,000 Jews will leave the country within the next two years." he added that there are, however, some aged Jewish refugees, most of them from Spanshai, who are still returning to Austria. Though the Jewish comminity in Vienna new has its own hospital, a well-functioning social welfere organization, and a credit inatitution -- established with the aid of the Joint Distribution Committee -- "it will be pervisard to reorganize Jewish life in Vienna as it was before 1938." Stiassny said.

Stiassny charged the Austrian Government with indifference regarding the restitotion of property to former Jewish owners. The Jewish community of Vienne has to care for thousands of Jewish men, women and children, because of the failure of the everment to return their property.

DIPOLITARIAN JESS WILL NOW BE PERMITTED TO EMIGRATE DIRECTLY TO JESUSE STATE

ROME. March 30. (JTA) -- The emigration of Tripolitanian Jews to Palestins. which in the past the British have permitted only by way of Italian ports, will henceforth be permitted by a direct crossing to Heifa, it was amounced here today. Anthorities said that the first transport would leave Tripoli on Sunday and would not touch Italy.

GEMAN JEWISH COMMUNITIES REFUSE TO MERGE WITH DP AND RESUGEE CROWNIZATION

MUNICH, March 30. (JTA) -- A proposal by the Jevish Central Committee of Germany that the German Jewish communities in the United States zone merge with the Committee has been turned down by the communities. it was learned here today.

The communities, however, have agreed to the creation of a central commission for restitution, indemnification, social welfare, medical care and the organization of cultural activities. The Central Committee and the central body of the communities vill each appoint three members to a body which will take over these combined functions, it was reported.

BUMANIAN WAR CRIMINAL TO BE TRIED FOR HIS PARTICIPATION IN THE JASSY FOREOM OF 1941

EUCHAREST, March 30. (JTA) -- Gheorghe Gavrila, a former Rumanian police official, who was recently arrested in Jassy, will face a war crimes court for his participation in the 1941 Jassy massacre of Rumanian Jews, it was reported here today. Garrila was in command of a police unit at Podul Iloaie, a town near Jessy, when one of two death trains arrived with the survivors of the Jassy pogrou.

Gavrila is charged with robbing the passengers of money and valuables and of stripping the bodies of the dead Jews who had been unleaded from the train. The indictment also states that Gevrile killed a Jew who was trying to bring water to fellow prisoners. He will also face charges of trying to extort a huge sun of more from a local Jewish leader who attempted to aid the pogrom victims.

LONDON, March 30. (JTA) -- Prof. Isaac Merken, moted Crientalist and suther who forestly taught at the Universities of Leningrad and Minsh, filed Monday night at the age of 74. He reached England from Holland after the Mari invasion of the Low countries in 1940. He had made his home in Germany from 1986 to 1986 following the 1987 revolution in Russia.

In Russia, he was active in numerous Jevish groups, including the CRT, and also edited a Jevish encyclopedia published in Russian. He was an arthority on various periods of Jevish history and wrote several definitive works on the Karaites.
