104 EAST 41st STREET, NEW YORE 17. M. T. MAELI-TRANSJORDAN ARMISTICE PACT SIGNED ON RECORS; ABBULLAH GETS "TRIANCLE" AREA

RHODES, April 3. (JTA) -- The Transjordan-Israeli armistice pact was signed at 7:30 P.M. local time today after one month of extended negotiations. In genil. it accepts the military status quo in Palestine, except for several variations

the Negov and "triangle" areas.

The pact, which is not subject to ratification and comes into effect imme-Mately, recognizes Transfordan's right to take over control of the "triangle" area -nin-Tulkaru-Nablus. In this area, the implementation of the provisions of the pact aling with the replacement of Iraqi troops by Transjordanians, the withdrawal to the reed-upon lines and the reduction of forces may take as long as 15 weeks. In gonal. however, the pact calls for an adjustment of forces within ten days.

The Israelis gain control of the Heifa-Tel Aviv rail lines, except for one wint in fullarm. In return, they agree to pay the cost of paving 20 kilometers of ret class read in Transjerdan-held areas. The Jews will also pick up a number of ab villages in the Dead Sea and Negev areas and will again have control of the totash world in the southern tip of the Dead Sea. Arab residents of any villages taken over by the Israelis may remain there may choose to leave. If they opt to leave, the Arab villagers will be permitted take with then their movable property and livestock and will be compensated imdiately for the land which they abandon.

### Front Line Runs From Beisan Walley, in North, to Agaba, in South

The present positions in Jerusalon remain unaltered, with the Latrun road ill in Arab hands. In the north, the front line commences in the Beisan area, runs stward giving the Gilbon hills to Israel. Then it turns south, running east of the silvay line to Tulkara, giving the Gedera-Afuleh road to Israel. From Tulkara the ine follows the eastern edge of the railway line to Quigiliya, which remains Arab, turns castward to Budrus -- nine miles north of Latrun -- thereafter following the cember 30 armistice line to a point south of Jerusalen.

South of Jerusalem the line continues east from Beit Jibrin and south from bron to the Dead Sea at En Geddi. The line then joins the international frontier a the center of the Dead Sea to the Gulf of Agaba.

The reduction of forces is understood to include British troops at Aqaba e a total strength of three battalions is alloted to each side. Jerusalen will allowed two battalions for either side with another three battalions in the surunding districts. The "triangle" will contain a total of five battalions, with a similar number of Israelis facing it.

The pact also states that the military forces of both sides shall be limited defensive forces only in the areas extending ten kilometers on either side of the

front line. The only exception to this point is in the southermost tip of Palestine and the coastal strip where adherence to this principle is physically impossible.

It notes that the general previsions of the part shall not be interpreted as spation; on ultimate political nettlement between the two parties, and that the arreation lines are also agreed upon without prejuite or future nertherical southers or boundary lines or to the claims of either party relating to boundaries and critorial soltlements.

### Pact Sets Up General Armistics and Special Jerusalen Commissions

The part provides for the establishment of two commissions. One is a general statute commission composed of seven members headed by a United Nations official, second will be a special commission to deal with problems relating to the Jerusanes area. 1. Provision for free movement of traffic on vital roads, including the Beth-

h. Resumption of operations of the Latrum pumping station, provision of Rectricity in the Old City of Jerusalem and resumption of operation of the Jaffa-

The commission will also have competence to other problems which may be subtisted to it. In all cases referred to it, the special holy shall have emiliative consistence, and its decisions shall have the same force and effort as the provisions of the general emiliative agreement. The numbers of the commission will include superministives of both partial-without representatives of the United Emilians and it shall formulate plane to callengt the accept of the agreement and to effort improve-
