ONLY 3,000 JEMISH REFUGEES REMAIN IN ITALY, ISRAELI CONSUL GENERAL AT ROME DISCLOSES

TEL AVIV, April 4. (JTA) -- Only shout three to four thousand Jewish refugees remain in Italian displaced persons camps and will be transferred to Israel soon, Arth Gren, Izraeli copaul general at Smos, said on his arrival here today.

In all, since the end of the war, he eaid, 40,000 Jewish refugees and 20,000 illegal immigrants had passed through Italy en route to Israel. He expressed warm appreciation for the treatment the Italian Government and people had extended to those refugees.

Oren declared the Italian Jewish community now numbers 30,000. Commerical negotiations between Israel and Italy will be started seen in Rome, he added, following the arrival there of Richard Cinton, newly-appointed Israeli commercial attache.

ROME, April 4. (JTA) -- Representatives of the Joint Distribution Committee nd the HIAS in Italy have set up a coordinating committee to facilitate the applicaions of Jewish displaced persons in this country who desire to imnigrate to the Unted States under the Displaced Persons Act of 1948, it was reported here.

Meanwhile, it was revealed by Louis Horowitz, J.D.C. director for Italy, that recently-announced International Refugee Organization-Italian Government-J.D.C. greement designed to speed the transfer of Jewish DP's from this country to Israel as not yet some into effect. HIAS OFFICE IN BUCHAREST PROCESSING 2,000 JEWS LEAVING FOR OVERSEAS; NOWE COING TO ESPASEL

NEW YORK, April 4. (JTA) -- The HIAS office in Bucharest is currently processing more than 2,000 emigration cases, it was revealed today by Isaac L. Asofsky, executive director, on the basis of a report just received from the organization's director in Rumania, Dr. Mauriciu Zengher. The report said that the prospective emigrants are being aided to go to 38 countries.

Despite government restrictions on emigration, the HIAS office in Rumania last year "aided hundreds of Jows to leave that country," the report said. Most of the countries to which the Rumanian Jews will go to are in Latin America. None of the 2,000 currently being processed for emigration by the HIAS are proceeding to Israel, the report revealed.
