Agency's Decision on U.J.A. Saved Drive This Year, Goldmann Says

Dr. Goldmann stated that the decision of the majority of the Agency executive th regard to the U.J.A. saved the Appeal's campaign in 1949. The main issue, he mid, was the refusal by Drag Silver and Heumann and American Zionist bodies to accept majority decision of the Amency executive. Such a policy, he added, if allowed to muil, would destroy the voluntary democratic system prevailing in the Zionist precent.

The imposition of the will of individual personalities upon the Zionist Emport is not admissible." Dr. Goldmann declared. "I fought it in the past and All fight it in the future. Mobody denies the great merits of Dr. Silver but we simils not forget also other great Zionist leaders in America, such as the late Dr. Stroben S. Wise.

The decision of the Jewish Agency executive with regard to the U.J.A. establimed the authority of the executive in America and saved the Zionist movement from willing into a centralized direction. The full autonomy of local Zionist bodies with i right to defy the central authority would have broken the Zionist organization, kliman concluded.

Dr. Goldstein said: "Speaking for the General Zionists, I can say that if . Silver and Neumann would wire that they withdraw their resignations tomorrow that they are returning to the Jewish Agency executive, there would be a widegreat satisfaction.

"A good deal has been said here that on account of financial considerations is Zionists sacrificed to the non-Zionists. Others argued here that the Zionists tel a victory because the position of the Jewish Agency had been maintained. My firm Assistion is that American Zionists can regain their leadership in the field of fundming-if they lost it-as soon as they are prepared to throw themselves into fundmising with the same zonl and passion of self-sacrifice with which they throw themselves into the political struggle."
