us, delegation at lausanne withdraws support for caza plan; seeks arab refugee return

LAUSANNE, June 5. (JTA) -- A striking change in U.S. policy in the U.N. Conditation Commission has taken place in the last 46 hours since the arrival here of Excend Hare, deputy director of the Office of Near Eastern and African Affairs in the State Department it was learned today. As a result of new directives from Washington, Commission Sources state, the American delegation has withdrawn its support for the 'Graz Flan' as formulated in letters to the Commission by the Israeli delegation. It was first breached from U.N. quarters and called for ceding the Egypt-held Gaza strip to Israel along with its population of Arab residents and refugees.

(Week-end reports from Lake Success declared that on May 21 the Israeli delestion in Lausanne submitted a proposal offering to admit 230,000 Arab refugees to Israeli territory on condition that the 150-mile Gaza coastal strip be ceded to the Mexish state. Similar reports last week emanating from Lausanne were denied by Israeli authorities in Tel Aviv.)

The Americans have now thrown their weight behind the latest Arab proposals at a token of good faith. They require that prior to any peace settlement the Iraeli Government should allow the immediate return of all refugees from western chiles, Lydda, the Ramleh district, Beersheba and those from the Musrara quarter of Ismaelem-a total estimated at 100,000 to 150,000 Arabs.

At the same time, the U.S. delegation has let it be known that the Commission wald interpret any reduction in the status of the Israeli delegation here as equivalent to an Israeli walk-out from the Lausanne peace talks. This is the Commission's response to the departure of half the Israeli delegation last week and to unofficial ramings that it might not be worthwhile for Dr. Walter Eytan, director-general of the Israeli Foreign Ministry and chief Israeli delegate, to return to Lausanne during the unfruitful phase of the talks.

It is already becoming clear that the conciliation theory advanced by the Combission has been singularly unproductive. The gap between the Israelia and the Arabs is vider today than five weeks ago before the conciliation process was started. The exectation of the Commission that Dr. Eytan would come back from his present visit to Tel Aviv armed with new and more helpful instructions seems to be based more on shall thinking than on convincing evidence.

The Jerusalem subcommittee is to resume consideration temerrow of eight separate plans for internationalization of the Holy Places. Three main issues remain: the complicated French plan for part internationalization with tribunals and other amplex guarantees, the General Assembly's outright internationalization proposal which is now subported by the United States and Israel's project for the partition of Jerusalem between Transjordan and Israel, with a U.N. commission to supervise the researces of pilgrims and the well-being of the Holy Places.

SEWUCTH IN JERUSALEM MARRED BY CLASH BETWEEN ISRAELI MP'S AND ULTRA-CRTHODOX CRUUP

JERUSALEM, June 5. (JTA) -- Serious clashes took place here yesterday at an tyrovised road-block between Israeli military police and members of Naurei Kartha, a ultra-Orthodo Jewish group, in which three soldiers and several civilians were injured.

The ultra-Orthodox group set up the read-block to prevent the soldiers from ringing food on Shavuoth to their colleagues a few yards distant at their posts of thy. When the military police began to remove the block, the Nturei Kartha band trew stones and bottles at them. Reinforcements came up and helped the MP's distres the attackers, several of whom were beaten.

Shavucth, along with the Sabbath, was celebrated in cities, towns and collective settlements throughout Israel with singing, dancing and celebrations, in which children layed a major part. Thousands made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. School and Indergarten children, dressed in white and crowned with garlands of flowers, marched a masse bringing the traditional first fruits of the land-grain, vegetables, fruit, tres, calves and fowl--to the buildings here of the Jewish National Fund. Fully 1,000 children participated in observance of Shavucth in Tel Aviv alone.

VIRIAN PREMIER AND EX-MUFTI REACH MILITARY PACT; SPECIAL MUFTI REGIMENT TO BE FORMED

NEW YORK, June 5. (JTA) -- The ex-Mufti of Jerusalem and Syrian Premier Husni Aylm have reached an agreement on military cooperation, the New York Times reported they from Beirüt. The dispatch said that a special regiment of Mufti followers will formed and attached to the regular Syrian Army.

The report noted that "ostensibly they (the Mufti's troops) are to aid in the rent of an Israeli attack on Syria, but they could equally well be used in the event of a dispute with King Abdullah." The new agreement provides that 2,000 picked Palstinians with previous military training will be formed in a special unit, with about the set of them reported to be German-trained. The dispatch added that the Mufti ill provide his unit with a full shipload of small arms, which is said to have alterly been received from Greece.

50 IMMICRANTS ARRIVE IN HAIFA FROM TURKEY; HOLIDAY DELAYS LANDING OF SEVERAL HUNDREDS

HAIFA, June 6. (JTA) -- A group of 250 Jewish immigrants from Turkey arrived are today. Several hundred immigrants whose vessels brought them into Enifa's waters festerday were not able to disembark because of the Shavuoth holiday. Many of the new trivals who paid their first visit to Tel Aviv's bathing beach today were enthusistically greeted by the thousands of bathers.

BIDERS OF "ARYANIZED" PROPERTY IN AUSTRIA CLASH WITH EX-CONCENTRATION CAMP INMATES

VIEWA, June 5. (JTA) -- New clashes have been occurring in Vienna between blders of "Aryenized" property who tried to hold a meeting to denounce restitution has which would force them to return such property to former owners. Jewish and man-Jewish former inmates of concentration camps demonstrated against the "Aryanizer" who declared that they had "saved the lives of many Jews" by "buying" their property and thus "enabling the Jews to emigrate."

In one clash, three ex-Wazis suffered minor injuries, preventing the rally fra being held. The same day the organization of former concentration camp inmates prested against amnesty legislation for former Wazis in Austria.

BELLIN CHIEF RABBI ACCUSES EVANGELICAL BISHOP OF PROTECTING NAZI WAR CRIMINALS

BERLIN, June 5. (JTA) -- The Chief Rabbi of Berlin, Rabbi Stevens Schwarzsthild, accused the Evangelical Bishop of Berlin, Bishop Otto Dibelius, of protecting lize war criminals, Reuters reported today.

Rabbi Schwarzschild, in an open letter to Bishop Dibelius published in the Berlin Jewish weekly "Dor Weg," said: "You are reported to have written to Baroness Simerin von Krosigk, wife of the Nazi Government finance minister now serving a loger sentence for war crimes, describing the Nuremberg trials as an act of revenge on the part of the victorious nations. You described the trials as incomprehensible intentity. Speaking as a rabbi, may I ask you whether your letter is not incomprehensible uncedliness?"

PISITION OF JEWS IN NORTH ALGERIA BETTER THAN IN MORCCCO, ORT OFFICIAL REPORTS

PARIS, June 5. (JTA) -- The position of Jews in northern Algeria is "infinitely better" than in Morocco, Dr. David Lvovitch, executive chairman of the World Worldon, reported today upon his return from a tour of CRT schools in Morocco and Algeria. He was accompanied by Salomon Grumbach, former chairman of the French Countle of the Republic and a leader of the GRT movement in France.

Dr. Lvovitch said that 660 students are now enrolled in the Casablanca CRT-Uliance Israelite Universelle trade school established in 1946. No more rupils can be accepted there, he said, until a new training center outside the city is opened, site for a new building was recently donated by Jules Senouf, president of the CRT in Morocco, while construction of a new girls' school is also planned, he added.

DUMINIAN TOWN MARKS ANNIVERSARY OF DEPORTATION OF ITS JEWISH POPULATION TO AUSCHWITZ

BUCHAREST, June 5. (JTA) -- The town of Targu-Mures, in Transylvania, today Pried the fifth anniversary of the deportation of its entire Jewish population to the Pashwitz death camp by the pro-Nazi authorities. The ceremony was sponsored by the ground the town.

The chief speaker, Francisc Welczer, head of the local branch of the Jewish Paccratic Committee, told the huge crowd which gathered in front of a memorial to the ficting of fascism that by making all racial discrimination a punishable offense the resent Rumanian Government was guaranteeing that such atrocities would never again occur.

Q.J.F.W.F. CALLS PARLEY TO REVIEW PROBLEMS FACING SMALL JEWISH COMMUNITIES IN U.S.

CLEVELAND, June 5. (JTA) -- The problems faced by small Jewish communities in meeting local, national, and overseas needs will be the focus of discussion at the Omierence of Small Communities sponsored by the East Central Region of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds on June 17-19 at the Whitcomb Hotel in St. Mesch. Mich., it was announced here today. The conference, the first of its kind, will be limited to Jewish communities which do not employ a professional executive but conduct their activities entirely through volunteers.

David J. Ross, program committee chairman, pointed out that "small community laders are becoming increasingly concerned with the relation of the small community to the national Jewish scene as well as the kind of local central community organization best suited for a well-rounded service program. The time has come when we, as leders in small communities, want to get together to take inventory of our assets and or programs, to learn from each other, to seek perspectives not only for today but for the constructive years of tomorrow.

Among the questions which will be discussed at the Conference are: budgeting resources to assure support of all valid causes; coping with the problem of multiplicity of appeals; maintaining and developing the interest of young people in accepting responsibilities for Jewish communal life; and developing leadership and insuring videspread community participation in Jewish communal activities.

ERALLI POPULATION NOW 1.000.000, MRS. MYERSON SAYS ON ARPIVAL IN U.S. FOR UJA DRIVE

NEW YORK, June 5. (JTA) -- Israeli Labor Minister Mrs. Golda Myerson, who arived here by air yesterday to undertake a nationwide speaking tour in behalf of the United Jewish Appeal, declared in a statement that the population of Israel has reached the 1,000,000 mark. Of this total, she said, 900,000 are Jews while the reainder are Arabs.

Mrs. Myerson emphasized that there are still 1,500,000 Jews living in Europe Mi North Africa "who need or want to come to Israel." The Israeli Labor Minister aid that the Tel Aviv government has instituted a four-year immigration plan envisagas the doubling of Israel's population by the middle of 1953. Replying to a question, she declared that the Israeli Government would not suspend immigration under any ircumstances, despite the present shortage of housing.

"Faced with the alternative of halting the immigration of those who must come cur country, or of solving the housing problem, we are determined to solve the using problem," she oteted. "Not one immigrant shall be denied entrance to Israel ecause we do not have a house for him." Disclosing that at present more than 60,000 evarrivals are compelled to live in tents or barracks at reception camps because of be critical housing situation, Mrs. Mysrcon said that the only obstacle in the way busing was lack of funds. "We have the trained manpower and the land," She tressed. "If the Jevish communities of the United States will furnish the United evish Appeal with adequate funds, we can lick the housing problem in a relatively that time, despite the fact that 30,000 new immigrants come in every month."

Mrs. Myerson revealed that 11 women now sit in the 120-member Israeli Knesset. he added that women were playing an equal role with men in developing and building new state, "as they did during the hestilities."

ENGLISH-JEWISH PUBLISHERS WILL HOLD 1950 CONVENTION IN CINCINNATI; PLAN ANNUAL AWARD

NEW YORK, June 5. (JTA) -- The executive committee of the American Association of English-Jevish Newspapers, meeting at the Hotel Statler here, selected Dr. Alemander Brin and Dr. Joseph G. Brin of Boston, editors and publishers of the Jewish Edwoate to serve on a committee granting an annual award by the Association to the Exercise publisher who has rendered the greatest service during the year for the admission of American ideals."

The executive committee accepted the invitation of Dr. Nelson Glueck, president of Hebrew Union College, to hold the Association's next convention in February, 1950, in Cincinnati, on the occasion of the observance of the 75th academic year of the College. Members of the executive committee, representing newspapers in eight states, were present at the meeting which was presided over by Philip Slomovitz, president of the Association.

Jack Miller, editor of the Jewish Times of Baltimore, was delegated to meet with the Committee on Post Office Affairs of the U.S. House of Representatives, to present the Association's view in opposition to proposed increases in second class wistl rates. It was indicated that the proposed increases in rates would endanger the existence of many weekly newspapers, and the Association has appealed to Congressional leaders to oppose such action.

SUIT TO BAR "OLIVER TWIST" AND "MERCHANT OF VENICE" FROM N.Y. SCHOOLS FILED IN BROOKLYN

NEW YORK, June 5. (JTA) -- A taxpayer's suit to exclude two classic works-"Cliver Twist" and "The Merchant Of Venice"--from New York City's public schools was filed in Brooklyn Supreme Court yesterday by Abraham J. Alexander.

Alexander charged that the books are "avowedly anti-Semitic and anti-religious" and "intensify prejudice and are vehicles to spread intolerance" among pupils of the city's schools. The petition names as respondents the Board of Education, Board of Superintendents and Dr. William Jansen, Superintendent of Schools. A hearing on the petition was set for next week.

MONTEVIDEO JEMS RAISE INITIAL \$125,000 FOR ISRAEL; RED MCGEN DOVID COMMITTEE FORMED
