Rabbi Mahane reported that the Association of Jovish Cooperatives has instructed its branches throughout Poland to accord opportunities to religious Jews to observe the Sabbath, Where no Jewish cooperatives exist, he added, religious Jews are free to organize their own cooperatives with Saturday as the day of rest.
