-2-DR. BURGER DENIES HE RECOMMENDED LIFTING OF ARMS EMBARGO ON IBRAEL AND ARAB COUNTRIES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3. (JTA) -- Dr. Raigh J. Bunohe, United Nations mediator for Palestine, denied today that he had flatly recommended lifting of the U.N. ban on the export of arms to the Near East.

Dr. Bunche, whose report on the successful Arab-Israeli armistice negotiations will be considered by the United Nations Security Council tomorrow morning, said it was up to the Security Council to decide if it was necessary to continue restrictions on war material for the Near East. He said he would be ready to make suggestions if asked by the Council.

Rep. Jacob K. Javits today called on Secretary of State Dean Acheson to oppose lifting the arms embargo for the Near East. In a speech before the House of Representatives this afternoon, Rep. Javits asked that The Secretary of State announce U.S. policy on the United Nations are sharps and ares that the U.S. delegate to the Security Council Should oppose a lifting of the embargo." The disbarge should stand until peace, not armistice, exists in the Noar East, he insisted. Rep. Arthur G. Klein of New York also demanded that the U.S. exert its influence to seal off the flow of aims to the Arabs to prevent a renewal of warfare in the Rear Rast. He also asked that pressure be brought on England and France to halt arms chipments to the Averba.

An appeal for a continued arms empargo for the Hear East was addressed to secretary of State Dean Acheson today by Sen. "Alexander Wiley. "In a special letter, he wrond that Mr. Acheson instruct Merron Austin to cast his vote at the United Hations Security Council tomorrow for the continuation of the embargo.

Sen. Wiley backed up Israeli authorities who have warned that lifting of the embargo now would only encourage a disastrous arms race, promote new hostilities, and be a serious economic handicap to Israel and the already over-armed Arab states.

U.S., ERTTISH DELEGATIONS INDICATE SUPPORT FOR LIGHTING OF U.M. ARMS BAN ON MIDDLE EAST

U.N. BODY URGES ALL GOVERNMENTS TO STUDY INTERNATIONAL PACT, ON MISSING NAZI VIOTIMS

CHEVA, Aug. 3. (JTA) -- A resolution requesting the U.H. Secretary General to transmit immediately to all government the draft of an international convention under which missing Rati and war victims would be declared legally dead was adopted here today by a special committee of the U.H. Social and Economic Commoli which beam consideration systems of the recommendations contained in the draft.

The resolution was introduced by the representative of human's with the provision that all governments give coveral consideration to the draft of the part with a view that the agreement may be adopted at the next seasion of the U.M. General Assembly, which is to open in September at Funning Relations. The international pact, if adopted, will not only enable curriving relatives to claim the property of the missing persons, but will also multo it legal for many to re-mary,

Appearing before the U.N. special committee, Investi representative Dr. M. Kahany explanated that several million few periable as Nast viotims in extermination camps and their surviving relatives cannot legally establish their death because of the lack of cfiticial people.

"The Inrael: Government," he pointed out, "is especially interested in the early conclusion of an international convention with regard to missing persons because of the large number of surviving relatives who are now residing in Inrael."

Dr. Julius Kath-Guchy, representative of Polana, proposed that the recommendations culmitted by the special committee on the declaration of death of missing persons be postponed until the most session of the Zonomio and Social Council.

SOUTHEASTERN TOWNS IN TURKEY ARE LEST WITHOUT JEWS; ALL ENIGRATE FROM COUNTRY

HTANEU, Aug. 3. (JTA) - The two coutheastern Turkish towns of Marsels and Disrbakir were reported today as being completely without Jown following the departure of 300 Jown from there for Invent. Almost all the small Jewish communities of that area are reported as having been commissing 11 ituridated.

These Jouinh communities, which were considered the most angiant in Turkey, were completely included from the world and from Turkinh Jewry. They had no link with Judaism other than religion and Hebrev traditions, which differ from those of the Sepheric Jewn living in the country.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3. (JTA) -- The Senate Democratic Policy Committee decided today to invite Chairman Pat McCarran of the Senate Judiciary Committee before the met week to explain his blocking of the House-approved displaced portrons bill-

BUENCS AIRES, Aug. 3. (JTA) -- Yaacov Tsur, Israeli Minister to Argentine, today told a press conference that President Peron expressed deep sympathy for Israel and lauded the Argentine Jews in a conversation with him.

The Israeli diplomat said that separate fund-raising compaigns by Jewish groups in Argentina do not help the cause of Israel. He appealed to the Jews of Argentina to send chalutain to the Jewish ptate.

Jevish groups in Argentina today began the commemoration of the 100th emiveracy of the birth of Dr. Max Norden, which falls on August 5. Several public sectings have already taken place in Beacon Sires. The entire Jevish press dedicates special articles to the memory of Dr. Norden and suphesizes not only his contribution to modern Zionims. but also to world literature.

FOOD PARCELS SENT TO ISRAEL MUST BE PREPAID IN U.S., HEW YORK CONSULATE ANNOUNCES

MEM YEMF, Aug. 3. -- Effective this week, duty on all standard food paredle sent to Israel must be prepaid in the U.S., and such percels on to mailed only through enthorized agencies, it was announced today by the Consulate General of Tareas.

The duty on these percels amounts to 30 mils per kilogram, that is, about a cents per pound, and will be collected by authorized agencies, a list of which may be obtained at the Compulate. No more than one parcel may be sent to any one person within one month.

Self-packed food pureals, which do not conform to the regulations for standard pureals, will be limited to \$1.5 younds. The duty or such percels amounts to be mile per thingeou, that is about \$7 conts per pound, and must be paid in Larges! by the rectylent. No more than two pureals may be sent to any one family in one month, the anneuncomput said.
