POSTERS IN JERUSALEM CAUTION JESS AGAINST DISCROERS AT ARRIVAL OF U.N. MISSION

EMERALM, Sopt. 9. (JTA) -- Bigs postore put up all over Jerusales today continued Jovish inhabitants of the otty against being minded by an extremist Jovish religious seet which is accounted of planning to create disorders and disturbances when representatives of the U.R. Conciliation Commission's economic survey mission arrive here not week.

Headlined "So The People Will Know," and signed by a newly organized group of "religious youth," the posters violently attack the small sect of religious zealots who are known as the Neturny Karta, or Towardsan of the City.

Describing the soct as a fifth column, the postore charge that its leaders, who are agents of the British and King Abdallah of Transjordan," intend to organize a descentration in favor of internationalization of the entire city. Hembers of Returny Karta have always opposed the concept of Zionium and of a Jovish state, bettering that a Jovish state could only be ravived after the coming of the Messiah.

The unprecedented attack on them by a group of equally orthodox but less frantical, youths is apparently intended to forestall any major effort by the laturay Earts adherents to inflamme the new United Nations mission. The posters also call on the government to investigate the group and its "financial beloadre and patrons."

RUMANTIAN AND IBRAIL COMPANIES SIGN AGRESMENT TO EXCHANGE \$3,000,000 WORTH OF GOODS

EURREFT, Sopt. 9. (Eth) -- An agreement between nationalized Rumenian fires and private Jarual companies providing for the anchange of \$3,000,000 worth of goods was signed today. The Rumanians will send timber for orange crates, actile and agricultural products to Inval, while they will receive from the Javish state cityms oils, rancy blades, pharmaceuticals and artificial teeth.

Involved in the deal are the sale by Rumania of 12,000 tons of ground salt, 1,000 tons of sumflower seed cake and 900 tons of millet, the last two serving as feed for cattle. In addition, a limited barber arrangement has been concluded for emblance of Rumanian writing nearer and entitional dentures manufactured in Israel.

AMERICAN MILITARY AUTHORITIES INVESTIGATE EXCAVATION OF JEWISH MASS GRAVE AT DACHAU

MEMICH, Sept. 9. (FR) — The American Military Government in Government has begun an investigation of the opening of a mass grave at the Danhau concentration camp by Governm workers of a contracting concern which was using the soil time obtained for commercial workers.

EUROPEAN CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL RECOMMENDS ESTABLISHMENT OF WORLD COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS

STRASBOURG, Sept. 9. (JTA) -- The European Consultative Assembly posterday recommended the establishment of an international sugress owner to guarantee human rights and fundamental freedoms, just before it concluded the first cession here. The original suggestion that the Council of Europe guarantee human rights was made by Winston Cherchill and a crown of deleastes from warlow countries.

The vote in favor of the resolution was 65 to 1, with 17 abstantions. The lone opposition vote was east by a member of the British Labor delagation, as were eight of the abstaineers. The remainder of the abstaining group was composed of Conservative and Catholic representatives.
