BRITISH AUTHORITIES IN GERMANY EVICT JEWISH FAMILIES FROM THEIR HOMES NEAR COLOGRE

LOWDON, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The World Jevish Congress has protested to the British Government against an order by the British compation authorities in General evicting six Javish funtilies in Junkersbore, near Cologes, from their homes in order to make billate available for Belgian troops being brought into the town, the Congress amounced here today.

A similar protest will be placed with the Belgian Government, and representations have been made to General L. Bishop, British military commander in Germany, by the Central Committee of Liberated Jown. The order is to take effect tonogrow.

The W.B.C. has pointed out that the six Jovish families are exampled from confiscations by the authorities because they have a special status as victims of the Manis. A spokeman for the local German suthorities has expressed himself as papead to the eviction of the Jows, and the town's mayor has stated that other accommodations could be found for the Bealan trecome.
