CANADIAN JEWISH CONGRESS DENIES GOVT. FRACTICES DISCRIMINATION IN ADMISSION OF DP'S

MUNTRALA, Sopt. 18. (NYA) -- The Canadian Jostah Congress today released in open Letter addressed to Rabbi Abruhan L.
