SENATE GETS BILL TO ADMIT EUROPEAN WAR ORPHANS TO U.S. REGARDLESS OF QUOTAS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Sen. Robert H. Humphrey today introduced legislation in the Senate to admit European war orphans to the United States without regard for quotas.

His bill would permit United States families to adopt orphans who are still homeless as a result of the war. It would also permit immigration of children under 21 who have but one parent remaining who is unable to provide for the child's care.

JEWISH WAR VETERANS BAN POSTS FROM PARTICIPATING IN DEMONSTRATIONS THAT MAY BECOME RIOTS

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- The Jewish War Veterans of the U.S. has forbidden all units of the organization "from initiating or participating in any public demonstration which poses a potential consequence of riot or public disorder," it was announced here today.

A J.W.V. post may, however, request permission to participate in a public expression against Communism or Fascism, but may not undertake action without the sanction of a special three-man committee. The organization also directed its units throughout the country to apply a "quarantine treatment to public appearances of, or utterances by, Communists, Fascists and all other subversive elements."

JEWISH AGENCY WILL ASSIST IN DEVELOPMENT OF JEWISH DAY SCHOOLS IN UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- The establishment of a Department of Culture and Education to work in cooperation with local Jewish educational and cultural groups outside of Israel, was announced today by the Jewish Agency. The new department will be headed by Dr. Hayim Greenberg, member of the American section of the Agency executive, and will have offices in New York and Jerusalem.

The New York office, under the directorship of Dr. Benjamin Halpern, former managing editor of the Jewish Frontier, will serve the needs of Jewish communities in the Western hemisphere, Australia, New Zealand and the Philippine Republic. The Jerusalem office will deal with Jewish communities in Europe, Asia and Africa.

The new department plans to assist in the development of Jewish day schools, particularly in the United States. It will also seek the establishment of chairs, at outstanding universities, in the Hebrew language and Jewish culture and the addition of modern Hebrew to the language curricula of public high schools in major cities.

THREE YIDDISH AND TWO HEBREW WRITERS RECEIVE ANNUAL LOUIS LAMED LITERARY PRIZES

NEW YORK, Sept. 22..(JTA) -- Three Yiddish and two Hebrew writers were the winners today of the annual \$500 Louis Lamed Literary Prizes for the best works published in Yiddish and Hebrew in the United States during the past year.

The Yiddish writers awarded prizes are J. Rolnick, H. Rosenblatt and Bezalel Sherman. The first two received the awards for books of poetry. Mr. Sherman was cited for his book, "Jews and Other Ethnic Groups in the United States."

The Hebrew winners were Harry Sackler -- for a volume of short stories, "Rainbow in the Clouds" -- and Daniel Forsky -- for a book of essays. Mr. Sackler received the prize for the third time. The prizes will be presented at a public celebration in New York to be held toward the end of this year.

LIPSKY RESIGNS PRESIDENCY OF RED MOGEN DOVID; SAYS ZIONIST COUNCIL NEEDS HIS TIME

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Louis Lipsky today announced his resignation as president of the American Red Mogen David. The statement said that his action was taken on account of his new duties as chairman of the American Zionist Council.

WESTCHESTER ZIONISTS URGE RECALL OF DR. SILVER TO ZIONIST LEADERSHIP

MAHAROCKE, N.Y., Sept. 22. (JTA) -- A resolution urging that Dr. Abba Hillel Silver be called back to the leadership of Zionist political work in America was adopted here last night by the executive board of the Westchester Zionist Region, it was announced today by Joseph W. Greenleaf, president.

The resolution expressed concern over the "recent political developments which threaten the continued progress of the state of Israel." It emphasized that "in furtherance of the effective mobilization of American public opinion on behalf of the state of Israel full use should be made of all the resources of American leadership in the Zionist movement."

200 FORD TRUCKS SHIPPED TO ISRAEL; PURCHASE MADE POSSIBLE BY EXPORT-IMPORT BANK LOAN

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Two hundred Ford trucks, paid for from funds which Israel received in the Export-Import Bank loan, were shipped today to the Jewish state. Dr. Shaul Lipshitz, representative of the Ford Motor Company in Israel and former chairman of the Tel Aviv Chamber of Commerce, who is now in New York, said that this is the biggest single shipment of trucks Israel has ever received.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF JEWISH WOMEN TO HOLD 19TH TRIENNIAL CONVENTION NEXT MONTH

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- The National Council of Jewish Women will hold its 19th triennial convention in Baltimore from Oct. 23-28, it was announced today. The convention, marking the Council's 56th anniversary, will be attended by delegates representing 85,000 members throughout the U.S. and Canada.

HENRY MORGENTHAU BACK IN HOSPITAL; HIS WIFE DIES IN NEW YORK HOSPITAL AT AGE OF 57

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Funeral services for Mrs. Henry Morgenthau Jr., wife of the general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal who died here last night at the age of 57, will be held in Temple Emanu-El tomorrow morning, it was announced today.

Mr. Morgenthau, meanwhile, returned to New York Hospital yesterday from which he was discharged last week and is reported suffering from a mild cardiac condition. Mrs. Morgenthau, who was the niece of former Governor Herbert H. Lehman, was active in numerous charitable causes, including the U.J.A. Messages of condolences were received today by Mr. Morgenthau from numerous leaders, including President Truman.

DR. JOSEPH RUFEISEN, FORMER HEAD OF CZECH ZIONIST ORGANIZATION, DIES IN TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, Sept. 22. (JTA) -- Dr. Joseph Rufeisen, member of the Zionist Actions Committee and a former member of the Czechoslovak Parliament who served as head of the Zionist Organization in Czechoslovakia for 20 years, died today of a heart attack at the age of 63. He was stricken in a Tel Aviv court while serving as a defense counsel.
