NEGEV SHITLEMENTS REPORT ARABS INFILITRATING ISRAEL ARE PLANTING BOOKY TRAPS, LAND MINES

STRUCCUE IN GERMAN TOWN IN U.S. ZONE DESCRATED BY VANDALS; JEWS PROTEST TO A.M.G.

MUNICH, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- The Jewish community in the town of Marktredwits, in the American zone of Germany, protested today to A.M.G. and Bavarian Government officials against the desecration of its synagogue by vandals Monday night, Reuters reported.

The synagogue's doors were reported by the police to have been smashed and the interior of the house of worship was strewn with prayer books. The Holy Ark was also smashed by the vandals, the police reported.

The Marktrodwitz City Council, which was immriedly convened following the Jew-ish community's protest, issued a statement condemning the "barbaric descoration of the religious site."

RUMANIAN APPRAIS COURT UPHOLDS FIVE-YEAR JAIL SENTENCE IMPOSED ON JEWISH WAR CRIMINAL

BUCHARIST. Sept. 27. (JTA) -- The Rumanian Supreme Court this week upheld a sentence imposed on the Jewish war criminal, Janou Windisch, of Bukovina, who was found guilty of charges of misusing his authority while acting as secretary of the Judemrat of Obodovoa, in the Ukraine. The defendant received a five-year fail term Last May.

Joseph Szalley, who was formerly employed by a Jewish-owned flour mill, was sentenced to three years imprisonment, loss of civil rights and confiscation of property by a Clui court. He was found guilty of charges of misinforming the Mazi authorities during the war about the rightful expension of the mill and of denouncing Saughter of one of his former employers, leading to her deportation.

ANGLO-JEMISH ASSOCIATION STUDIES FLANS FOR RETURN ON CRPEAUS SHELFFRED BY NON-JEMS

LONDON, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- Now proposals to secure the return to the Jewish commity of at least a large proportion of Jowish war orphans placed in non-Jowish homes are being considered by the Foreign Affaire Committee of the Anglo-Jowish Assodiation for submission to the U.H. Human Rights Commission, it was reported today.

The Association was told at its meeting last night that the U.N. body rejects the claim of Orthodox Jowish groups for the return to the Jewish fold of all Jowish orphans placed in non-Jouish homes. Therefore, the Association heard, it is necessary to find a "loss rigid approach which may secure the necessary support." The Foreign Affairs Committee submitted to the Association the draft of a proposal ostablishing the principle that orphans should be brought up in the faith of their parents, but adding that this principle should "be overruled only if the vital interests of the abild are held to be in a contrary sense by an impartial body."

The proposal produced a heated discussion in which Orthodox members of the Association emphasized the danger of putting forward "rious contrary to those of Seriah cooleginatical authorities." Noville Leski also warned that the proposal would "arouse a storm cominst the Association." It was agreed to reconsider the wording of the draft.

JEWISH GROUPS ASK ERITAIN TO PROMULGATE RESTITUTION LAW IN BRITISH ZONE OF GREMARY

LOHDON, Sopt. 27. (JTA) -- Jovish groups today asked the British Government to conclust the action of American military authorities in Gormany with regard to restitution and compensation to political, resida and religious personatees.

The Jewish organizations unlatted a request to the Foreign Office saking the government to use its good offices for the preunilyation of a restitation and compensation law in the British zone of Germany corresponding to the law recently promisested in the American zone. The Jovish groups point cut that the present restitation law in the British zone concerns only such property as can be identified by its concern.

POLAND ASIS FOR EXTRADITION FROM GERMANY OF CREANIZER OF POCROMS IN BIALTISTOK AREA

MARSAW, Sept. 27. (JTA) -- The Polish National Committee for War Crimes has applied to the British cocupation authorities in Germany for the extradition of Erich Koch, it was amnounced today.

J.D.C. RECLAIMS HUNDREDS OF TORANS LOCTED BY MAZES; EMGAGES SCRIBES TO REPAIR THEM

MEN TORK, Sopt. 27, (JTA) -- Emmireds of Scrolls of the Law, delivered last month to the Paris office of the Joint Distribution Committee by the Jowish Onlineal Reconstruction Agency, have been repaired and remounted by five religious scribes especially engaged for this purpose by the J.D.C., it was amounted bore today.

One hundred and twenty of the Serolls, some of them more than 200 years old, have already been sent to Israel for mue by new immigrant communities. Other usable Serolls will be distributed to recetablished Jovish communities in Europe.
