BEN GURION WARNS AGAINST FEELING THAT CREATION OF ISRAEL MEANS END OF ZIONISM

TEL AVIV, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Premier David Ben Gurion, addressing a Keren Hayesod conference here at the Habimah Theatre last night, declared that the Jewish people must be warned against two mistakes--the feeling that with creation of the state of Israel an end has come to the Zionist movement and to Zionist funds and that with the establishment of the Jewish state, the Zionist Organization would "persevere in the same way as in the past in its activities (conducted) prior to the formation of Israel."

The conference, attended by veteran Zionist leaders as well as visiting guests from the United States, was convened to discuss and re-examine the Zionist movement in the light of the existence of the state of Israel.

Asserting that Israel's Jewish population is nearing the 1,000,000 mark, the Israel Premier stated that it "should not be forgotten that that figure is only ten percent of the Jewish population of the world." While Israel promotes the "ingathering of the exiles from their dispersion," Mr. Ben Gurion added, this task cannot be achieved without the aid of the entire Jewish people.

No Zionist, the Premier emphasized, "could influence Israel before assuming all the duties and responsibilities of Israel citizenship." He added that any attempt to pressure the Israel Government through Zionist funds or Zionist organizations would be "interpreted as a disavowal of the state of Israel." In this country, the Premier continued, "is rested the power of sovereignty of Zionist pioneering and such power can be consolidated only through those extending their unconditional assistance." He concluded his address with an appeal for "courageous and loyal cooperation between the government and the Zionist movement."

Kaplan Expresses Disappointment in Contributions of Jews Outside Israel

Finance Minister Eliezer Kaplan, addressing the parley, said that the cost of the "war of liberation" had exceeded "by far 100,000,000 pounds," to which Jews abroad contributed less than 25 percent, while no other financial aid was received. Mr. Kaplan also noted that during the six-month April-October period, over 90 percent of its defense expenditures was covered by the Israel Government.

The Finance Minister emphasized that the people of Israel are unable to "bear single-handed the country's budget for security as well as its programs for immigration and absorption." Mr. Kaplan expressed disappointment over the fact that Jews living outside Israel "failed to contribute the maximum of their capacity for the entire assistance needed for absorption and immigration. The tens of thousands of inmates living in reception camps," he stressed, "have resulted in an inflationary tendency since they did not constitute a productive element."

Mr. Kaplan stated that "owing to the default of world Jewry," he may be compelled to ask the Knesset to impose "a further onus on the country's population" with regard to housing and other development plans. He disclosed that the Israel Govern-

ment, during the first 12 months of the new state's existence, allocated 13,000,000 pounds for housing projects.

The Finance Minister stated that it will be necessary to give up plans for a world-wide Jewish loan for Israel this year in order to avoid interference with existing fund-raising campaigns. In conclusion, Mr. Kaplan expressed optimism at prospects for the country's economic recovery, which he said would come "during the transitory years." He voiced the hope that private investment capital would "flow into Israel when the national wealth paves the way for it."

Dobkin Calls on Zionists to Immigrate to Jewish State

Eliahu Dobkin, immigration chief of the Jewish Agency, emphasized the danger of a "deadlock in immigration as a result of the depletion of reserves in the Middle East and following the closing of the migration gates of Hungary and Rumania." In an appeal directed to the 7,500,000 Jews living in English-speaking countries, Mr. Dobkin said the "hour has struck for every Zionist to ask himself whether he is now prepared to immigrate to Israel."

In recent weeks, he recalled, "we witnessed the controversy in the United States in which Premier Ben Gurion was charged with sabotaging the efforts of the United Jewish Appeal because of his daring to urge the immigration (to Israel) of American Jews." It is, therefore, Mr. Dobkin continued, "imperative" to demand implementation of the full principles of Zionism. Jews living outside Israel must be told, he concluded, that "whichever considers himself a Zionist must of duty come to Israel."

Levi Eshkol, Jewish Agency treasurer, stated that the settlement and agricultural programs alone of the Keren Hayesod involve an expenditure of 30,000,000 pounds (approximately \$84,000,000). Mr. Eshkol also said he was "privileged and grateful to announce that in recent days" thousands of immigrants in reception camps in Israel have "developed an eager tendency to settle on the land."

In a message to the parley, President Chaim Weizmann stressed that creation of the Jewish state required "Zionist high tension and Zionist volunteer contributions from the entire Jewish people, both here and abroad, for the speeding up of the ingathering from the dispersion, and for creation of conditions of absorption for masses" of immigrants. The Keren Hayesod, the Israel President's message continued, is the "only instrument for realization of the Zionist vision."

Ben Gurion's Remarks Not Aimed at Z.O.A., Daniel Frisch Declares

NEW YORK, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Daniel Frisch, president of the Zionist Organization of America, asked to comment on Mr. Ben Gurion's speech, stated that "by no stretch of the imagination could the Israel Premier have had the Z.O.A. in mind." He said the Z.O.A. pursues a policy of mutual cooperation with the Israel Government, based on the premise of one not mixing in the internal affairs of the other.

FUNDS WILL NOT COME TO ISRAEL FROM ABROAD UNLESS GOVERNMENT IS MODIFIED, BEGIN SAYS

TEL AVIV, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- "Gold and silver will no longer stream to Israel from the Diaspora countries if a radical modification of the country's regime" does not occur, Menachem Beigin, leader of the Herut Party, declared here last night at a dinner tendered in his honor on the occasion of his return from an extensive overseas trip. He said that Israel's trade balance deficit was 30,000,000 pounds (\$84,000,000) and said it was "beyond coverage."

BEN GURION HAILS SOVIET FIGHT AGAINST NAZIS, AID TO ISRAEL ON ANNIVERSARY OF REVOLUTION

TEL AVIV, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- In a message to Marshal Joseph Stalin, Premier of the Soviet Union, on the occasion of the 32d anniversary of the October Revolution, Premier David Ben Gurion today declared: "The Jewish people, building its own state afresh in its historic homeland, will not forget Soviet Russia's courageous fight against the Nazi enemy and (its) faithful help in the establishment of the Israel state."

Pavel Yershov, Soviet Minister to Tel Aviv, yesterday told a meeting at Beth Haam, sponsored by the Israel Communist Party and Mapam, that the "Soviet Union extends its friendship to all progressive elements and is also prepared to help peace-loving peoples against warmongers the world over." Other speakers at the meeting, including Communist Shmuel Mikunis and Mapam leaders Jacob Rittin and Moshe Sneh, called for Israel to stand firm on the Jerusalem issue and for "unhindered access to the Red Sea." They also called on Israel to "rely on important Soviet support."

The new city of Jerusalem witnessed yesterday the unusual sight of two large Soviet flags hoisted atop the Russian building, one wing of which is now occupied by the Israel Supreme Court, the other wing by Russian Orthodox Archimandrite Leonid.

Israel's district commissioner referred the matter to the Foreign Ministry which inquired of the Russian embassy whether it was proper to raise the Soviet flag on a building occupied by an Israel Government institution. Official sources are convinced that the flags were flown because of a misunderstanding.

THREE EAST EUROPEAN COUNTRIES REPLY TO HISTADRUT APPEAL FOR AID IN EMIGRATION OF JEWS

TEL AVIV, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The Histadrut executive, disclosing that it had sent cables three times during September and October to trade unions in East European countries asking their assistance in expediting the emigration of Israel-bound Jews, reported today that it had received replies from Rumania, Poland and Czechoslovakia. Replies have not been received, it was added, from the Soviet Union and Hungary.

The reply from the Central Trade Union Federation of Rumania said it was unable to deal with the request and suggested that the matter be handled through Israel-Rumanian diplomatic channels. The Czech and Polish trade unions displayed a positive attitude in their replies, it was reported. The Histadrut also said that on Oct. 9 it made a direct appeal to Vassili Kuznetsov, president of the Soviet Trade Unions Federation, stating that Hungary had failed to reply to its message and that Rumania's answer was unsatisfactory.

CHILE AND ISRAEL GOVERNMENTS AGREE TO ESTABLISH DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR RELATIONS

BUENOS AIRES, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The establishment of diplomatic and consular relations between Israel and Chile was assured today following the initialing of formal documents in the Foreign Office headquarters of Chile in Santiago, it was reported here today from the Chilean capital.

Samuel Gorin, Israel liaison official, signed the papers for the Israel Government. It was reliably learned here that Israel Minister to Argentina and Uruguay, Dr. Yaacov Tsur, will also represent his government in Santiago.

ISRAEL SEEKING NEW APPROACH TO PALESTINE PROBLEM IN U.N.; CONCILIATION BODY MEETS

LAKE SUCCESS, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The Israel delegation has begun to sound out other delegations in the search for a new approach to the Palestine problem, it was learned here today.

At the same time, it was learned that Israel is preparing a memorandum to be circulated to all delegations later this week, calling for a total rejection of the U.N. Conciliation Commission plan for the demilitarization and internationalization of the Jerusalem area. The memorandum will analyze the commission instrument in detail and will urge all delegations to turn it down when it comes before the Assembly.

In its private discussions with delegations, now being carried on, it is understood that the Israelis are seeking to arrive at constructive proposals that could replace the Commission plan. One probable prospect is a resolution limited to the establishment of international control of the Holy Places. It is not yet known, however, whether such a proposal will come from the Israel delegation itself.

Meanwhile the Commission met in another closed meeting in New York late this afternoon. Neither Arab nor Israel representatives were invited and it was not revealed what the Commission members would discuss.

Survey Mission Will Ask U.N. Aid for Israel in Middle East Report

JERUSALEM, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Israel is included in long-term proposals for the economic development of the Middle East, which is the objective of the second report now being prepared by the Survey Mission of the United Nations Conciliation Commission for Palestine, it was learned today from a U.N. spokesman.

The report is under way and will be submitted to the Conciliation Commission in a month, but it may not be ready in time for discussion by the U.N. General Assembly, it was stated. One of the groups of experts surveying the Middle East, headed by Dr. John Murray of Britain, is due to arrive in Tel Aviv Wednesday for a study of Israel's financial and economic problems. A second group, headed by Sir Herbert Stewart, British agricultural expert, will arrive next week to inspect Israel plans, achievements and needs in farming.

DEADLINE EXTENDED ON ALLOCATION OF FUNDS FROM U.S. \$100,000,000 LOAN TO PROJECTS

TEL AVIV, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Israel Finance Minister Eliezer Kaplan this week-end told the Knesset Finance Committee that the Export-Import Bank has extended the Dec. 15 deadline for submission of projects for which the remainder of its \$100,000,000 loan to Israel is to be used. Minister Kaplan also announced that the Bank had consented to the interchangeability of credits approved earlier for various projects.

In submitting proposals for continued development of Israel, Minister Kaplan suggested that the government should contribute \$6,000,000 to the capital of the Amidar Housing Company, \$5,000,000 for facilitating mortgages for individuals who have lived in Palestine not less than five years and \$6,000,000 to the construction of new housing for new immigrants.

Seven executive directors of United Jewish Appeal campaigns in large cities of the United States were received this week-end by Israel Premier David Ben Gurion. They told the Premier that they fully realized that continued immigration and settlement were the immediate tasks ahead, and that the costs of discharging those obligations must be met by American Jewry and, to a great extent, through the agency of the United Jewish Appeal.

ISRAEL-AUSTRIAN TRADE PACT TALKS SUSPENDED WHILE ISRAEL DELEGATION AWAITS ADVICES

VIENNA, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Negotiations for a trade pact between Austria and Israel were suspended today for a period of three weeks owing to the departure of a member of the Israel delegation to Israel to confer with the Israel Government.

The positions of the two delegations differ only with regard to the terms of payment for the goods which will be exchanged under the pact. The Austrian National Bank, it was reported, will approach the Anglo-Palestine Bank regarding the extent to which blocked Jewish assets in Austria--which it is reported will pay for 20 to 30 percent of the goods traded--shall be transferred. Earlier, the Israel delegation proposed an arrangement for the exchange of goods valued at \$5,000,000 to \$8,000,000 during a trial period of unlimited duration.

NEW AMERICAN GOVERNOR OF BAVARIA PLEDGES CONTINUED COOPERATION WITH JEWISH LEADERS

FRANKFURT, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- Clarence Bolde, new American Governor of Bavaria, this week-end promised to continue the policy of cooperation with Jewish leaders established by his predecessor, Murray Van Wagoner.

Gov. Bolde, formerly a high-ranking member of Mr. Van Wagoner's staff, gave this pledge on the occasion of his introduction by Mr. Van Wagoner to Chief Rabbi of this city, Dr. Aaron Ohrenstein, and Jewish community president Dr. Julius Spanier. Dr. Ohrenstein pledged the loyalty of Bavarian Jews to the American occupation authorities and expressed to the outgoing governor the gratitude of the Jews for his understanding of their problems.

AUSTRALIAN ATTORNEY-GENERAL ASKED TO INCLUDE GROUP LIBEL IN PRESENT DEFAMATION LAW

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A request to the New South Wales Attorney-General to consider an amendment to the existing provincial defamation law which would provide "redress to people defamed" by virtue of group libel was made today during a debate in the New South Wales legislative assembly by Abram Landa, deputy for Bondi. Attorney-General C.E. Martin said that he will take up the matter with the Minister of Justice and the Colonial Secretary, who are charged with administration of such acts.

400 JEWS SAIL FROM SHANGHAI FOR ISRAEL; COME FROM THREE CITIES IN COMMUNIST CHINA

SHANGHAI, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A group of 400 Jews from Shanghai, Tientsin and Harbin--all in Communist China--sailed from here today for Israel aboard the S.S. "Worcester Victory."

(A report from Singapore today declared that many of the city's 1,200 Jews believe that the time has come for them to migrate to the Jewish state. Since last April 65 Jews have already departed for Israel, the dispatch added.)

HUNGARIAN JEWS COMMEMORATE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF FASCIST EXECUTION OF CHANNA SZENES

BUDAPEST, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The Jews of Hungary today commemorated the fifth anniversary of the execution of Channa Szenes, Jewish heroine from Palestine who was executed by the pro-Nazi regime after she had parachuted behind the enemy lines during the war on an Allied mission and had been captured. Representatives of the Israel legation and many Jewish groups and Chief Rabbi I. Horshkovits attended the services.

GSE DENIES REPORT JEWISH HEALTH GROUP IN POLAND DECIDED TO LIQUIDATE ITS ACTIVITIES

PARIS, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A statement denying a report emanating from Warsaw last week declaring that the "TOZ"--Polish equivalent of the GSE, Jewish health society--has decided to liquidate its activities in Poland was issued here today by the central board of the GSE.

GROUP OF ARGENTINE JEWS BUYS BUILDING TO HOUSE ISRAEL LEGATION AT BUENOS AIRES

BUENOS AIRES, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- A group of Argentine Jews, headed by Elias Teubal, has decided to buy a building for the Israel Legation here to be presented as a gift to the state of Israel, it was announced today. The building will cost 1,500,000 pesos (\$375,000) which the group is donating and will replace the rented quarters which the Israel Legation occupies at present.

AMPAL OFFERS \$6,250,000 WORTH OF SECURITIES IN U.S.; TO AID ISRAEL HOUSING, DEVELOPMENT

NEW YORK, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- AMPAL, the American Palestine Trading Corporation, has filed documents registering new issues of three percent, 10-year bonds and 200,000 shares of Class A \$10 par value stock with the Securities and Exchange Commission here, it was announced this week-end. The total sum sought for investment purposes is \$6,250,000.

The registration certificates declared that the bonds will be sold at 100 percent of their principal amount, while the stock will be marketed at \$11 per share. The proceeds of the sale will be used as follows: Housing construction, \$2,500,000; transportation and industrial cooperatives, \$2,500,000; loans to public works projects and the establishment of industries in the Negev and exports from the U.S., \$1,000,000.

U.N. ORDER TO ISRAEL ARMY TO EVACUATE JERUSALEM WOULD BE "CRIME," MIZRACHI LEADER SAYS

NEW YORK, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- "The United Nations would commit a crime of first magnitude if it ordered the Israel Army to evacuate Jerusalem, leaving the city defenseless and easy prey to further invasion," Rabbi Wolf Gold, world Mizrahi leader and chairman of the Jerusalem Developments Commission of the Jewish Agency, last night told a meeting of national leaders of the American Mizrahi.

Rabbi Gold, who is also a member of the three-man praesidium of the World Mizrahi Organization, declared that "it is obvious that no nation in the world is willing or prepared to safeguard the Holy City against another invasion, and therefore no nation has the moral right to tell Israel's forces to leave that city. No power today," he added, "can guarantee that Jerusalem will not again be invaded by the enemy."

AMERICAN JEWS MUST DEVELOP OWN INDIGENOUS JEWISH CULTURE. STAVISKY TELLS JWB PARLEY

NEW YORK, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- American Jews must look to their own inner resources for the development in this country of an indigenous culture in a blending of highest Jewish values and the best in American life, Michael Stavitsky, president of the American Association for Jewish Education, declared this week-end at the 36th annual meeting of the New York Metropolitan Section of the National Jewish Welfare Board. Mr. Stavitsky saw in the establishment of the state of Israel the possibility of a process of cultural "give and take" between the largest Jewish group in the world and Israel.

UNESCO DECIDES TO INCLUDE IN EXHIBITION DOCUMENTS EMANCIPATING FRENCH JEWS IN 1791

PARIS, Nov. 7. (JTA) -- The U.N. Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, acting on a suggestion from the cultural department of the World Jewish Congress, has decided to include the 1791 decree for the emancipation of French Jews in its exhibition of historic documents dedicated to the development of human rights.
