Details were not disclosed but it was indicated that the principals were Falestine Arch refugees and Arch adherents of the exiled Mufti of Jerussian. The refugees were said to be complaining over the shorteges of food, while the Mufti! followers were understood to be demonstrating against the proposal of King Abdullah to ammer the Arch bursts of Palestine.

## U.N. POLITICAL COMMITTEE WILL RESUME ITS DISCUSSIONS TODAY ON FUTURE OF JERUSALEM

LAES SUCCESS, Dec. 4. (JFA) -- The U.H. subcommittee of the Special Political Committee is expected to submit a report texerrow on a resolution it adopted Thursday recommending U.H. internationalization of the Jorquelen area. The vote was 9-5, with two abstantions. The subcommittee's report, it was predicted here today, is not expected to find favor in the 59-employ Social Political Committee.
