U.W. CONCILITATION COMMISSION IS PLANNING TO ACT ON PALESTING BOUNDARIES

IARE SUCCESS, Dec 19. (JTA) -- The U.W. Palestine Conciliation Commission amounced today that it will put forth its own plan for the future boundaries of Palestine. The Commission said that a right to do this in submitting its fifth progress report to the Security Council. It emphasized that the resolution of the General Assembly session in Paris last year empowered members of the Commission to act in this direction.

The Commission indicated it will embark on this course to break the deadlook between Arabs and Israel on the territorial problems of Palestine. It added that it "bopes to undertake this tesk with the interested parties and thereby trig to a successful conclusion the mission entrusted to it by the Assembly." The Commission will reconven in Geneva January 16 to continue these negotiations and to study the final report of the Economy Survey Mission.

The second and final report of the Economic Survey Mission for the Middle East recommending long-range work projects for Syria, Lebanon and Transjordan, was signed in Paris yesterday by the mission chief, Gordon R. Clapp. The projects are designed to help employ 650,000 Palestine Arat refugees on Middle East public works programs. Hr. Clapp made it clear that the mission planned no projects for Israel, saying that the Jewish state had foreign sources for capital and technical knowledge.

TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL POSTPONES ACTION ON JERUSALEM STATUTE UNTIL JANUARY MEETING

IAKE SUCCESS, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The Trusteeship Council, by a vote of 11-0, with the Soviet delegation abstaining, decided to postpone consideration of the draft statute for Jerusalem until the Jan. 19 meeting of the Council in Geneva. The decision marks a victory for the U.S., which spensored postponement from the start.

Various motions of censure of Ierael for transferring some of its government offices to Jerusalem were then taken up for discussion suring the day, under pressure of the Arab states. However, the Trusteeship Council adjourned its session this evening when a United States amendment attempting to block the censure motions snarled meeting. Discussions on the proposed censure move will continue at the next meeting of the Council.

The Council entrusted Roger Gerreau, its president, with the task of preparing a working paper on the statute for Jerusalem, after inviting written suggestion from Council members as well as from the three Arab states now participating in the Council deliberations. M. Garreau was also authorized to receive views of other interested governments—presumably Israel and Transjorden—and institutions and organizations. This working paper must be submitted not later than January 5.

The Council then heard a report by Dr. Ralph Bunchs, representing the U.W. Secretariat, who confirmed Israel's intention to make Jewusalem the capital of the new state. Reports from U.W. observers, he said, note that new Israel Government offices are moving into Jerusalem.

ERITAIN CLAIMS FROM ANCHO-PALESTINE BANK IN ISPAEL \$5,000,000 OF FORMER GERMAN ASSETS

LONDOI, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The British Coverment has issued a writ egainst the Anglo-Palestine Bank claiming \$5,020,400 in forcer German escots, the Tel Aviv Gorrespondent of the Daily Telegraph reported toky. The dispatch stated that before the termination of the British Maskate over Palestine, Britain and Americala had agreed that the sensets of Germans, to be resettled in Australia, should be handed over by the bank to British agents, who would then transfer them to the Commonwealth

The Inglo-Palestine Benk has refused the transfer because the Israel Government claims the same amount from the bank on the grounds that all former assets of Palestine accrue to Israel as reparations from Germany.

ISRAEL MARKS "INCAPHERING OF EXILES DAY"; APRIVAL OF SECOND MILLION JEWS ANTICIPATED

THE AVIV, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- "Yom Kibbutz Galuyoth"--"Day of the Ingathering of the Exiles"--ras celebrated today throughout Israel on the occasion of the Jouish population of this country passing the 1,000,000 mark. The theme of the celebration emphasized the need for preparing for the arrival here of the second million Jous.

President Chaim Weizmann, in a special message, declared that with the start of the ingathering of the second million Joun, the history of Jewish immigration to Israel has reached a new chapter. Dr. Woizmann each that Jous throughout the world must realize that this ways of immigration to Israel is not a transitory but a progressive development, "since not one but many millions are imperative for the survival of our states."

In an appeal directed to Jovich communities overseas, President Weizmann declared that the problem of siding the immigration of Esrael-bound Jose must be given priority over all other problems. The road for the second million Jose proceeding to Israel, he said, must be chorter than previous immigration paths because "no foundation exists for the security of the state with only 1,000,000 Joses"

Dr. Weizmann paid high tribute to the Israel Government and to the Jevish Agency for their activities in implementing the "ingathering of the exiles." He also lauded the world Zionist movement for its efforts and urged that the utmost efforts be exerted to eliminate the hardships now facing "thousands of immigrants tightly-packed in reception camps."

ISRAEL ATRLITE INAUGURATES WEEKLY SERVICE TO PARIS, LONDON, ZURICH AND ROME

THE AVIV, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The Fl Al airline, a government-subsidized company, today officially inaugurated a regular weekly schedule from Lydda to Paris, London, Zurich and Rome.

The Lydda-Paris run has been in operation for some time. The Esrael company has already concluded parts with foreign airlines which make it possible for passengers reserving passage through EL Al to obtain tickets through to New York, Vienna, Munich and Prague.

At a Formal ceremony, presided over by Minister of Communications havid Remes, the government yesterday colorrated its first year of operation of the Lydde airfield. During that year 1,600 planes, carrying 80,000 passengers, made use of its facilities, against the 27,000 passengers who landed or took off these during 1947, the peak year of the Felestine Mandato's administration. Minister Remes revealed that 100,000 pounds lad been spent in improving the airport last year.

VOW MANNETEIN GETS 18 YEARS FOR WAR CRIMES; GUILLY OF FAILING TO PROTECT JESS

HAMSURO, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- A British military court here today sentenced Razi Field Marshal Erich von Mannstein to 18 years imprisonment following his conviction on nine war orimss charges including failure to protect Jews and other Soviet citizens who were shot, hanged, gassed and drowned by Gestapo troops operating in his command area during the war.

Von Mannstein was acquitted of eight other counts, including charges that he authorized and permitted the mass killing of Jews and other readel groups and that he authorized and permitted the transfer of Jews to Gestapo installations knowing that the Jews would be exterminated. The Nazi Field Marshal refused to plead for mercy. The British have announced that won Mannstein's trial, the 938th of a German war criminal by a British military court, ends the war crimes procedution in this zone.

ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH BUJINESSMEN IN WESTERN GERMANY FORMED; PROBLEMS DISCUSSED

MUNICH, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- An association of Jevish businessmen in Western Germany was organized here today at a meeting called by the Jevish Merchants Association of Bavaria. Representative businessmen from all three Western zones attended the conference.

Complaints of "hostility" toward Jewish businessmen in German government offices were voiced at the secsion. One delegate stated that Jewish businessmen have been denied import and export licenses by German officials because the latter were officially giving preference to "established" morchants. Since the Jews spent the war years in hiding or in concentration camps they are not considered as operating "established" firms. The same delegate said that the only Jews who occasionally are granted a request by an official are those who were in business before 1935.

Other speakers at the parley deplored "the lack of credit" available to Jewish merchants. Ecuever, they expressed opposition to dealing with the Jewish Restitution Bank where, as one speaker put it, "no Jewish merchants but two non-Jews became members of the board."

MINE GURNANS AND POLES SENTENCED TO DEATH IN POLAND FOR WAR CRIMES AGAINST JEMS

WARSAW, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Hime Poles charged with war crimes were sentenced to death this part week, and a tenth to 15 years imprisonment, by various Polish courts. The specific charge was turning Jews over to the occupying Mazi authorities, who murdored them, or committing the executions themselves.

Two of the nine were sentenced by a court at Resszow, the remainder were condemned in Warsaw. One was a former Gestapo member and guard at the Cswiccim concentration camp. Among the condemned men was a former chief of the German military police at Siedlice and Gora Kalwaria, seat of the famous Gora Rabbis of the Chassidio sect.

Tombstones and memorial tablets have been erected in Jovish cemeteries in Greatochova and Plock over the mass graves of thousands of victims of the Nazis.

In Plock, the first city in Poland in which Jews settled, in 1,237 C.E., the monument marked the grave of 9,000 Jews. In Czestochowa, three tembstones were placed over a mass grave of 5,000 men, wemen and children murdered in the liquidation of the loual gravito during the Nazi occupation.

EMIGRATION OF ENTIRE JEMISH POPULATION OF POLAVID AND OTHER COUNTRIES PREDICTED IN 1950

TEL AVIV, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The entire Jewish populations of Poland, Germany, Czecholovalda, Tripolitania and Yemon will emigrate from those countries in 1950, I. Shai, director-general of the Israel Ministry of Immigration, predicted here at a press conference.

Mr. Shai, who just returned from a tour of Europe and the United States, reported that 300 Jevs are Leaving France for Israel every month. These Jevs, he said, together with some 6,000 from North Africa are now waiting at Marseilles for passage to the Jevish state.

This coming year, he added, will see the arrival in Israel of 20,000 of the 45,000 Jews remaining in Germany. It will also witness the migration of 30,000 to Israel of Poland's remaining 60,000 Jews. They will pour into the new state at the rate of 2,500 a month, Mr. Shai estimated.

BOARD OF DEPUTIES. JUNISH VETERAUS PREPARE TO FIGHT ANTI-SENTISM IN BRITISH ELECTIONS

LONDON, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Jewish war veterans and the Board of Deputies of British Jewsers-making preparations to cope with enti-Sentitic propaganda which is expected to play an important part in the nationwide general elections next spring, it was learned here today.

The veterans' decision was taken at the conclusion of a recent meeting of the Association of Jouish Er-Servicemen. Speakers at that parley voiced concern that fascist activity, which had fellon off following Britain's withfrawal from Falestine, was again on the increase in London and other cities throughout the country. It is anticipated that fascist candidates, with no hope of election to Parliament, will use their candidates a vehicles for anti-Jouish compaigns.

The Beard of Deputies yeaterday formed a special subcommittee to formulate policy for the forthcoming election insofar as Jowieh matters are concerned. This development is not viewed as the formation of a "Jowish bloc." Among other functions, this group will send observers to election meetings in constituencies where fascists are contesting the Parliementary sent or where anti-Senitism is made an issue by the candidate of any party.

CLOSER TIES BETWEEN TURKISH JEWS AND OVERSEAS COMMUNICIES REPORTED BY RABBINATE

TSTANBUL, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The Chief Rabbinate of Istanbul today reported that thes between the Jewish community in this country and Jewish communities and organizations abroad since the end of World Way II have become much closer. The report noted that during this period links have also been formed among the various Jewish communities in all parts of Turkey.

Plans to send students interested in studying for the Fabbinshe to training seminaries oversees were also disolosed. The report added that during recent years the observance of religious traditions in Turkey has diminished.

DANISH RED CROSS RAISES DUIDS FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF SANATORIUM FOR CHILDREN IN ISRAEL

COPENHAGES, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The Danish Red Cross and the Save the Children Fund, together with Jewish organizations in this country, today launched a campaign to raise 500,000 crowss-shout \$125,000-sfor the establishment of a tuterculosic Lowe, for children in Israel. The Danish Government has undertaken to double the amount raised by voluntary subscriptions.

LOS ANGELES GIVES \$3,000,000 CHECK TO UNITED JEWISH APPRAL AS ADVANCE ON 1950 DRIVE

LOS ARCELES, Doc. 19. (JMA) -- A check for \$3,000,000 was presented yester-day to Berl Loöker, of Jerusaleu, clairman of the executive of the Jewish Agency, as an advance contribution of the Jewish Community of Los Angeles to the 1950 campaign of the United Jewish Appeal, which is seeking to meet needs in Israel, Europe and elsewhere totalling \$272,495,800 in the coming year.

The presentation of this check olimanos a special conference at the Ambassador Botel here during which more than 1,600 community lenders joined to celebrate "Ingathering of the Eciles" bay, which was observed throughout the state of Israel to signify the fact that Israel's Jewish population has reached the one million mark. The check was presented by Charles Brown, conference chairman.

Accepting the contribution on behalf of the United Jewish Appeal, Mr. Locker said: "It took Bread sixty years to develop into a nation of 1,000,000 Jews. With the help of American Jews, we shall gather in and absorb another million people in the next five or six years."

PHILADELPHIA ALLIED JEWISH APPEAL ANNOUNCES \$5,041,796 ALLCCATIONS FOR VARIOUS NEEDS

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Allocations totalling \$5,041,736 from the funds raised during the 1949 spring company of the Philadalphia Allied Jovich Aggest were amounced today by Scauch in Darroff, president. The Appell's board directors unanimously approved the distribution of funds to 46 local, national and overseas beneficiary agencies, following the report submitted by Edward N. Polisher, chairman of the 1949 Allocations Committee for 1950 needs.

Included in the allocations which went to \$6 member agencies serving Jewish needs throughout the world was a sum of \$1,605,3% for local organizations serving Philadelphia needs; \$3,164,000 for overseas work; and \$271,500 for national agencies. The United Jewish Appeal received the largest appropriation. A total of \$2,900,000 was granted to the U.J.A.

VICE-PRESIDENT BARKLEY CALLS ISRAEL A FREE MATION ESSENTIAL TO U.S. SECURITY

MTAMI, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Paying tribute to the Jewish state as an "cutpost of democracy," Vice-President Albon W. Barkley called yesterday for maximum support to Israel as a "free nation that is so essential to the scentily of our own Liberty and ideals." Addressing an all-day conference, the Vice-President told more than 1,000 Jewish leaders assembled at the Westview Country Club that aid to 13:309. through the United Jewish Appeal "is more than a Jouleh problem—"it is a humanitorian problem."

The Miami conference heard Mr. Barkley declare that he was proud as an American that the United States was instrumental in the birth of Israelas an independent nation and that our government recommended the admission of the Jewish state into the United Nations.

In his address the Vice-Fresdant emphasized that the United Jovish Appeal was a vital factor in the future development of Israel. "Israel is not financially strong enough to provide for the newscaers who are coming in at the rate of some 200,000 a year. It is not strong enough to take care of the immigrants alone, to provide housing, hespitals, to care for the children and to reclaim the land and prepare it for settlement. We must help the Jowish state because Israel is not economically strong enough at the present time to meet these needs," Mr. Barklay dealared.

HADASSAH DISPATCHES \$1,000,000 TO ISRAEL TO MARK ARRIVAL OF MILLIONTH JEW IN STATE

HEW YORK, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Marking the entry of the 1,000,000th Jew into Israel, Endassah, the women's Zionist organization of America, today cabled the sum of \$1,000,000 to the Jewish state.

The funds transmitted today bring to a total of \$2,000,000 the amount of money dispatched by Edussah to Earnel since Cotober 1 of this year. The current campaign goal of the organization is \$5,535,000.

327,000 JEES LIVING IN AGENTINA; RESIDE IN 3,400 CITIES, TOWNS AND VILLAGES

BURNCS AIRES, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- There are some 327,000 Jour living in 3,402 Argentinian cities, towns and villages, it was estimated by Yedidio Efron, noted Zionist educational leader, in an article published here in "Di Yiddishe Zoitung."

Mr. Efron bases his estimate on statistical material compiled by the Jewish Colonization Society and other sources in the country, as well as a 1946 census of Jews which revealed that there were about 320,000 Jews in Argentina at that time. At that time, Mr. Efron points out in his article, the Jews composed 2.2 of the population of the country, and the 207,000 Jews living in Buence Aires made up 7.1 percent of the city's total.

FIVE JEWISH MRITTERS RECEIVE LITERARY PRIZES FOR REST WORKS PUBLISHED THIS YEAR

NEW YORK, Dac. 19. (JTA) -- Five prizes of \$500 each were awarded this weekend to three Yiddish and two Hebrew writers whose works were selected as the best
literary works in Yiddish and Hebrew published in the U.S. this year. The Yiddish
winners were: Joseph Rolinch and H. Rosenblatt for their books of poetry; and Bezalel Sherman for his study "Jows and Other Ethnic Groups in the United States." The
Hebrew winners were Harry Sackler, for a volume of short stories, "Rainbow in the
Okonds"; and Daniel Pereky, for a book of essays.

The presentation coremony, which was held in the auditorium of the New School for Social Research, was ettended by several hundred people and presided over by S. Miger, noted Jowish critic. Speakers included Mr. Louis Lawed, the sponsor of the foundation which ewarded the prizes; Monackem Ribelow, editor of the Hebrew weekly Radorr; B.I. Byalcotopsky, Jewish poet; Moses Feinstein, educator, and others.

N.Y. STATE EXECUTIVE OF A.L.P. SUPPORTS ISPAEL'S POSITION ON STATUS OF JERUSALEM

MEN TORK, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- The state executive committee of the American Labor Party has adopted a resolution declaring that Jorusalem belongs to Israel and calling on the U.N. Security Council to reopen the question of the Holy City's status with a view to recognizing Israel administration of the new city of Jerusalem, it was amounted here yesterday.
