ISRAEL DIFLOMATS CONFER ON INTERNATIONAL SCENE; ISRAEL EXPLAINS KOREA STAND TO SOVIET

TEL AVIV. July 6. (JTA) -- Important conferences of top-ranking Israel diplonats from several countries are taking place here under the chairmanship of Foreign Minister Moshe Sharett. The conferences are of special importance as a result of the stand taken by the Israel Government on the conflict in Korea.

It is understood that Mordecai Namir, Israel's Minister to Moscow, has received specific instructions from the Foreign Office here which he will convey to the Kremlin if, and when, required. So far the Soviet Government has not asked Israel for any explanations with regard to the latter's stand on the Korean issue.

It was learned today that immediately after the Israel Cabinet had adopted its decision to support the U.N. Security Council resolution on Korea, important officials of the Israel Foreign Office visited the Soviet Minister in Tel Aviv and explained to him the Cabinet's stand.

SRAEL ASKS FRANCE FOR SECOND \$15,000,000 LOAN; REQUEST GETS FROMFT ATTENTION

TEL AVIV, July 6. (JTA) -- Israel has applied to France for a second \$15,000,-000 long-town loan, it was revealed hore today by the French commercial attache. Speaking to a press conference he said that the first \$15,000,000 had been granted over the period of the first six menths of this year for the purchase of French goods.

The attache said that the application was made by David Horowitz, Israel Under Secretary of the Finance Ministry, last week during conferences with French officials. He added that the French Finance Ministry has been ordered to give the application immediate attention.

Israel's development over the last two years has inspired great confidence in France, he said, and France is willing to assist the Jowish state by allowing Israel to use capital goods of Jows nigrating to Israel for the payment of French products, as well as by purchasing all Israel goods which can find a market in France and facilitating French investment in Israel industry.

The attache expressed the hope that the France-Israel trade pact, which has been in negotiations for many months, will be concluded soon. He said that France will give all possible aid to the development of Israel air and shipping lines.

ARAB INFILTREES ATTACK ISRAEL BEDOUINS; RAIDERS REFELLED WITH ISRAEL WEAFONS

TEL AVIV, July 6. (JTA) -- A gang of Arab infiltroes last night attacked some Bodouin tribes residing in Israel, near Beersheba. The Bodouins, who had been armed by the Israel authorities, repelled the raiders.

Israel members of the joint Israel-Egyptian mixed armistice commission have applogized to their Arab counterparts for the accidental penetration of Egyptian territory by an Israel Army patrol last week. The applogy was made at yesterday's necting of the armistice commission. At the same time, the Israelis protested vigorously against the "funtastic" charges and reports circulated by the Egyptians following the incident.

ECYPT'S REFUSAL TO SUPPORT U.N. ON KOREA DOES NOT AFFECT AMERICAN ARMS FOLICY

WASHINGTON, July 6. (JTA) -- State Department sources today indicated that there has been no change in the policy of the U.S. Government with regard to American and British shipments of arms to Egypt as a consequence of Egypt's failure to support the U.N. Socurity Council's resolution on Korea.

(In Raris, well-informed sources today said that as a result of Egypt's attitude on the Korean conflict the United States has decided to discontinue its own deliveries of arms to Egypt and is pressing Britain not to send lend-lease arms to Egypt.)

Defense Department circles today said that the question of curtailing the shipment of certain categories of arms to Atlantic Pact nations is now under discussion because of the temporary shortage of arms caused by the Korean crisis. It is believed in these circles that arms would first be withheld from nations such as Egypt which remain neutral in the Korean issue.

2,000 ISRAEL NURSES CALL WORK STOPPAGE; DEMAND HIGHER WAGES, BETTER CONDITIONS

TEL AVIV, July 6. (JTA) -- A one-day work stoppage by 2,000 nurses in Israel's public hospitals and clinics, peralyzing all activities except for emergency cases, as called here today. The nurses threaten a general strike unless their demands for improved working conditions and higher wages are not.

NEIZMANN LEAVES ISRAEL FOR EUROPEAN VACATION; ARMED FORCES SALUTE ERESIDENT

HATE:, July 6. (JTA) -- President Chain Weizmann today left Israel for a European vacution. During his absence Speaker of the Knesset Joseph Sprinzak will be Acting President.

The President left aboard the Ierael vessel Kednah which flew a brand new Presidential flag presented to Dr. Weizmann by Communications Minister David Remoz. The President inspected an honor guard before he and his party bearded the vessel. Fort guns fired a 21-gun salute as the Kednah steamed out of the port. Ierael fighter planes circled everhead and escerted the ship until it left Israel territorial waters.

SWEDEN SATISFIED WITH ISPAEL'S REPLY ON BERNADOTTE CASE; CONSIDERS AFFAIR SETTLED

STOCKHOLM, July 6. (JTA) -- The Swedish Government last night announced that it considers closed an exchange of notes with Israel over the assassination in Jorusalen of Count Bolke Bernadotte when he was the United Matter modiator for Ralestine. Early recognition of Israel by Sweden is expected to follow. The correspondence was concluded with a note to Israel from the Swedish Foreign Office. The note said in part:

"The Swedish Government notes with satisfaction that the Government of Israel admits without circumlecution and regrets the aborteonings in the Israel police inquiry in the case which have been pointed out by the Swedish authorities. The Swedish Government notes further that the Government of Israel accepts full responsibility for what has occurred in this respect. The Swedish Government wishes to express its expectation that since conditions in Israel have now been stabilized, continued investigation will one day throw full light on the whole case."

9,000 ROLISH JEWS MICRATED TO ISRAEL SINCE LAST OCTOBER, MINISTER TO WARSAW REPORTS

PARES, July 6. (JTA) -- Cvor 9,000 Jows, including 2,500 children under 14 yours of ago, have left Poland for Israel since the resumption of Jowish enigration from Poland last October, Israel Barzilai, Israel Minister to Warsaw, who is here on route to Israel, declared today. He added that 12,000 passports have been issued to Israel-bound Jows since October and more are expected so that some 4,500 more Jows will leave this month and next.

Mr. Berzilai, who is returning home to report on the first 20 transports of Jews to leave Poland since last year and to discuss plans for future transports, is also carrying the text of a new trade pact between Israel and Poland. The second Israel-Pollah commercial agreement, signed last May, provided for a substantial increase in the shipment of goods from Poland which were needed nest in the Jowish state and a reduction in the proportion of goods not needed as desperately.

DESCENDANTS OF PORTUGUESE JEWISH FAMILY REVIVE CLAIM FOR POSSESSION OF LABRADOR

THE HAGUE, July 6. (JTA) -- The claim of the Pertuguese Jovish family De La Benha to the possession of Labraday, Canadian peninsula, was revived here today by our descendants of the De La Penha family who started a search for documents to prove conclusively their right to the peninsula, Routers reported.

According to records secured by the descendants of the De La Fenha family in anada and in Lendon, King William the Third of Britain was saved from drowning in a hipwrock in 1695 by Joseph De La Fenha, an Amsterdam Jowish merchant. In gratitude fing William gave De La Fenha hareditary tenure forever of Labrador. This grant was legalized in 1697 in a document signed at Hot Lee Halace in Holland and renewed in 1732 and 1768, the descendants of the De La Fenha family claim.

One of the descendants, Tobias Green of Montreal, discovered in 1927 the priginal 1732 and 1768 decements. Some time later, a Dutchman in London found the priginal 1697 decement between the leaves of a book between the Dutch library there.

The Lebrador case cane to light in 1927 when Isaac De La Penha, a Montreal Jow who is a direct descendant of the Ansterdam merchant, filed a lawsuit claiming Labrador. The case had been prepared for a period of several years and a representative of the family was going from Holland to Canada to support the claim on behalf of all the descendants. However, the second World War broke out while the case was under consideration and it was delayed. Many members of the family were killed in the Cornan concentration cames.

The case came up again after the war, when a number of Belgian descendants sought to contact P.H. Molhado, one of the Dutch descendants. Mr. Molhado has now formed a commission together with other descendants of the De La Penha family to contact all other direct descendants living outside Holland and to begin enother suit.

FIRST ELECTIONS IN 20 YEARS HELD FOR JEWISH COMMUNITY COUNCILS IN ISTANBUL

ETANBUL, July 6. (JTA) -- The first elections in 20 years for officers of local Jawich councils have just been held in two sections of the city of Istanbul. In the center of the city, where some 37,000 Jews dwell, elections will probably not be held until the end of the summer.

Elections were conducted under the recently-adopted law returning to the various minority communities control over communal affairs. The local community councils administer synagogues, Jowish schools and welfare institutions.

JEWISH RELIGIOUS LEADERS IN RUMANIA URGED TO LEAD JEWS ON "ROAD TO SOCIALISM"

VIENNA, July 6. (JTA) -- A conforence of heads of Bucharest synagogues was told by H. Sorban Leibevici, general secretary of the Federation of Jowish Communities of Rumania, that leaders of Jowish religious institutions "must guide the Jowish population on the read to productive labor, secialism and peace," it was reported in the latest issue of Unirea, publication of the Jowish Democratic Committee of Rumania, which just arrived here.

BOUTH AFRICAN JEWS SEND SEVEN-MAN DELECATION TO JEWISH CONFERENCE IN LONDON

JCHANNESDERG July 6. (JTA) -- The South African Jewish Board of Deputies today announced the appointment of a seven-man delegation to the Conference of Jewish Representative Bodies of the British Commonwealth which will take place in London from July 16 to July 28.

In a statement, the Board makes it clear that its acceptance of the invitation to attend the conference is not to be construed as an endersement of any suggestion for the creation of a new Commonwealth body. At the same time, the Board emphasizes that it attaches great importance to the proposed discussions at the parloy on the subject of coordinating the activities of Jowish organizations working in the international field.

"The Board is not committed to the establishment of a single unified organization which would speak for all the Jowish communities outside of Israel," the statement said. "At this stage it is not certain that such an organization is either practicable or desirable. On the other hand, there is no doubt that the present situation, in which so many parallel, sometimes competing, bedies function independently, is alterether unsatisfactory."

MEIR CROSSMAN APPEALS IN ARGENTINA FOR AID TO ISRAEL; WANTS FUNDS AND MANPOWER

EUENOS AIRES, July 6. (JTA) -- A call for Argontino Jows to supply both manpower and funds to Israel was voiced here last night by Meir Grossman, veteran Rovisionist leader, who arrived in this country to aid the Argentine United Jewish Appeal cantairs.

Speaking at a Zionist banquet, Mr. Grossman declared that Jews throughout the world have a stahe in Israel, therefore they have the right to influence its policies. He said that the economic situation of the Jowish state is "grave" and called for grivate investment in Israel as a symbol of middle class initiative in building the state. Finally, he asserted that Zionism's aims will not have been realized until a majority of the Jows of the world live in "historic Palestine."

Z.O.A. APPOINTS COMMITTEE TO FORMILATE FOLICY ON PROBLEMS OF WORLD ZIONIST MOVEMENT

CHICAGO, July 6. (JTA) -- A policy committee to help Benjamin G. Browdy, president of the Zionist Organization of America, in formulating the policy of the Z.O.A. on questions dealing with the entire Zionist movement was appointed last night by the newly-elected Z.O.A. national executive.

The members of the committee are Judge Louis E. Levinthal, Dr. Israel Goldstoin, Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Rabbi Irving Millor, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, Louis Lipsky, Judge Simon Rifkind, Devey Stone and Dr. Samuel Margeshes. Ex-officio members are Mr. Browdy, Rudelf G. Sonneborn and N. Mortimer May.

SOME BUSINESS FIRMS WHICH SUPPORTED MERWIN K. HART ARE WITHDRAWING SUPPORT

The dean of Jewish journalism and one of the most colorful personalities in merican Journy, Mr. Cahan has attained a distinctive place in American literature is a novelist and short story writer. However, most of his years were devoted to wilding up the Forward and to comenting the Jovish Labor movement. His "Rise of avid Lovinsky" has been acclaimed as one of the best American novels of this beneration.

Mr. Cahan is a strong supporter of Israel. A chair in labor history has been stablished in his name at the Febrew University in Jerusalem. He has been fighting cumunism ever since the Communist Party came to power in Russia.

EMISH COMMUNITY OF VANCOUVER BARS FUBLICITY FOR UNEMDORSED FUND-RAISING FUNCTIONS

VANCOUVER, July 6. (JTA) -- The Jovish Community Council of Vancouver has deided to ber community publicity and mailing facilities to any fund-raising affair ponsored by a Jovish organization which has not received the prior endorsement of the council. This means that any unendersed function will not be able to obtain space in the Jovish Vostorn Bullotin, official organ of the Council, or use the community mailing list.

This move was taken in an effort to cut down the number of fund-raising af - lairs being run simultaneously by different Jowish organizations. The Community Combillad been operating a voluntary endersement bureau as a means of avoiding conflicting dates, but too many groups were not writing in for date clearance, thus necessitating more stringent regulation.
