OMMUNISTS DEMONSTRATE IN JERUSALEM AND TEL AVIV ACAINST U.S. INTERVENTION IN KOREA

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- Communist demonstrations against the Israel Gov-

In this city some 50 persons marched through the streets carrying Hebrew and English banners reading: "Hands Off Korea," "We Want Peace" and "End American agression." The demonstrators attracted little attention.

In Tel Aviv several hundred Communists carried banners reading: "Israel for the Israelis, Kerea for the Koreans." They held a meeting near the American consulte which was addressed by a speaker who condemned American intervention in Korea.

The left-wing Socialist Mapam Party has called 50 mass meetings in various parts of Israel to protest against the Israel Government's decision to support the U.N. Socurity Council resolution on Korea. The main slegan of the rallies are; "Heads Off Korea."

The United States Embassy here announced that all American Air Force reserve pilots must report to the air attache at the embassy within 72 hours.

FIVE ARAB STATES SUPPORT UNITED NATIONS RESCLUTION ON CRASE-FIRE IN KOREA

LAKE SUCCESS, July 9. (JTA) -- Iraq, Syria, Saudi Arabia and Yomon today joined Lebanon in sending a non-committal reply to the United Nations in support of the Security Council resolution of June 25 which called for a cease-fire in Korea and ordered the North Koreans to halt their invasion of South Korea.

The replies do not specifically mention the Security Council's resolution of June 27 which calls on members of the U.N. "to furnish such assistance to the Republic of Korea as may be necessary to repolithe armed attack and to restore international peace and security in the area."

This action on the part of the five members of the Arab League virtually expresses disapproval of the stand taken by Egypt in abstaining from support of the Security Council resolution on aid to Korea. A reported Saudi Arabian note to Cairo was understood to stress that Egypt's decision ran "counter to Saudi Arabian policy."

It was reported from Cairo that Egypt is disappointed over the guarded resolutions of the other Arab states. The most influential newspapers in Cairo-representing both the Wafd Party and the more conservative political forces-have expressed surprise and chagrin at the action of the other Arab League members and criticized them for failing to demonstrate pan-Arab solidarity.

U.N. israel police aperehend 105 infiltrees in raid on arab village near jerusalem

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- In a sudden raid, Israel police this week-end swept down on the Arab village of Abu Gosh, west of here, and rounded up 105 infiltrees. The raid was begun at dawn and a currew was immediately begun. Folice began a house-to-house search demanding to see Israel Government identity cards, which were issued only to Arabs and Jowish residents in Israel.

Today the muktar of the villago telegraphed Joseph Sprinzak, Acting President of Israel, Premier David Ben Gurion and Foreign Minister Mosho Sharett pleading with them to postpone the deportation of the infiltrees until after they had given a hearing to a delegation from the village. HISTADRUT CALLS ON NURSES TO END FOUR-DAY STRIKE AS ORDERLIES JOIN WALK-OUT

TEL AVIV, July 9. (JTA) -- The executive council of the Histadrut today called on some 2,000 nurses in Israel hospitals and clinics who are now in the fourth day of a nationwide strike to return to work by Tuesday.

Meanwhile, about 100 orderlies today walked off their jobs and joined the nurses. Several hundred doctors have threatoned to stop work unless their demands for improvement in wages and working conditions are met.

At the same time the Histadrut executive expressed support of the nurses demands. It threatened, however, that if the nurses did not return to work the matter would be turned ever to the Histadrut secretarist for action. Earlier this well-end the executive criticized the nurses for going on strike "without adequate consultation."

Endassah representatives told a press conference that the organization, which operates a wide network of hospitals and clinics, had agreed to the ware demands of the nurses but could not agree to a seven-hour working day. A reduction in hours would mean a reduction in the number of beds which Endassah facilities could offer, they said, adding that if the strike continues patients may have to be sent home from hospitals.

ISRAEL TO CELEBRATE 3,000TH ANNIVERSARY OF JERUSALEM AS FIS CAFITAL IN 1952

TEL AVIV, July 9. (JTA) -- Israel will colourate the 3,000th anniversary of Jerusalon as its capital in the spring of 1952, it was announced here today at a public relly.

Speaking at the meeting, Fereign Minister Meshe Sharett declared: "The stronger we make our position in Jerusalem by construction and population, the scener we will bring about an international arrangement for Jerusalem as the capital of Israel."

N.F. ACQUIRED 1,000,000 DUNAMS OF ARAB LAND; PAID \$30,000,000 TO ISRAEL GOVERNMENT

TEL AVIV, July 9. (JTA) -- A million dumms (250,000 mores) of land abandoned y Arabs in Israel was bought last year by the Jewish Mational Fund, it was announced his week-end by Dr. Abrohan Granot, head of the J.N.F., at a reception tendered to in on the occasion of his sixtieth birthday. Dr. Granot revealed that more than 30,000,000 was paid for this land by the J.N.F. to the Israel Government, which is he custodion of abandoned Arab property.

The J.N.F. director also disclosed that his organization this year invested 20,000,000 in establishing new settlements. About 10,000 new imaigrants, he said, re at present engaged in afferestation projects carried out by the Jewish National und. Mere then 3,000,000 troos were planted by the J.N.F. last year and 5,000,000 recos will be planted this year. The organization is also active in reclamation of easer land in the Negov and in financing housing projects, Dr. Granet reported.

The budget of the Jowish National Fund for this year is about \$50,000,000, f which \$30,000,000 has been collected from Jows in all parts of the world, notably in the United States. The remainder is being covered by leans, including a \$6,000,000 can from Swiss banks and a \$4,000,000 lean from French banks. The Jowish National and is also negotiating a \$6,000,000 lean with Swedich financiers. Dr. Granot said.

MERICAN AND FRENCH CONSULS ATTEND CEREMONY IN ISRAEL SETTLEMENT "ADOPTED" BY U.S. JEES

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- The United States and French consuls here this sek-ond attended a ceremony at the Neve Ilan settlement whichwes "adopted" by the lionist region of Long Island, New York, and populated by Fronch and Belgian immigrants who, as Maquis, fought the Nazis.

The ceremony marked the laying of a cornerstone of a kindergarten in the collective settlement. The funds for the building were raised among Zionists in Long Island. The Long Island Region has also sent refrigorators and egg incubators to the settlement.

At a luncheon which followed the coronony, the American and French consuls praised the achievements of the settlement which was founded three years ago on land colongong to the Jowish National Fund. Other speakers included H. Goorge Ryne, former dean of New York University, who amnounced that he came here to negotiate with the Israel authorities for the inclusion of the Jowish state in the framework of the Save the Children Organization." of which he is a vice-president.

AMERICAN MIZRACHI LEADERS CONFER WITH ISRAEL MINISTER OF REESTABLISHING SANHEDRIN

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- American Mizrachi leaders, who have just arrived in Israel, are conforring with Minister of Religion Judeh L. Mainen on the possibility of reviving the Sanhedrin, ancient Jewish tribunal. The American religious Zienists, headed by Pineas Churgin, president of the Mizrachi Organization of the U.S., ere also discussing with Dr. Mainen plans for the establishment of an institute for higher Jewish studies and various religious problems pertaining to Israel.

TERUSALEM TO INCREASE FREQUENCY OF WATER DISTRIBUTION AS RESULT OF NEW MAINS

JERUSALEM, July 9. (JTA) -- As a result of the new water supply system recently completed here, water will now be distributed every sixth day instead of every seventh day, it has been announced by Mayor Daniel Auster. In about two weeks water distribution will be made every fifth day and so on, until by the end of August water will be flowing freely all week long, the Mayor added.

eresentatives of juvish organizations flam end of jevish DP froblem in Germany

MUTICH, July 9. (JTA) -- Flans to remove all displaced Jews from Germany by 951 were discussed at a parley between HLAS and Joint Distribution Committee repreentatives at Berchtesgaden, it was learned here today.

The conferees were told that under the new U.S. DP Immigration Act some 5,000 Jows would entor the U.S., while Canada, Australia, Israel, South American ountries and others would take an additional 25,000 persons, thus ending the Jewsh DP problem.

OLISH COVERNMENT REPORTED LIMITING ISSUANCE OF PASSPORTS TO ISRAEL IMMIGRANTS

LONDON, July 9. (JTA) -- The Folish Government has decided to limit the number of passports it issues to Israel-bound Jews, it was reported here today from farsaw. The number to be issued will be 150 a day until the end of August, it was aid. Simultaneously, it was reported that the government has decided to intensify to anti-Zionist reoperands.

Bertrand Ruesel warns against anti-simitism; says it caused spain's decarenteer's fall

SYDNEY, July 9. (JTA) -- Anti-Semitism is an obstacle to world government, ortrand Russell, noted philosopher who is visiting Australia on a lecture tour, declared hore this week-end.

"Hostility to Jews is the most single unfortunate and beastly example of race rejudice," Mr. Russell said. "Those attributing traditional faults to Jows are more-y rationalizing." He pointed out that the personation of Jows in Spain in the Middle was caused the decay of that country and that Germany was defeated in the second orded war because of Hitler's anti-Jowish policy.

Delegates from CRT organizations in thirty countries of Europe, North America, South America, North Africa and South Africa and Israel will participate in the sessions. A general survey of the organization's activities will be presented, and organizational and financial metters will be discussed.
