JENISH ACENCY REPORTS DECREASE IN SAIR OF SHEEDLIM IN UNIVED STATES AND ENGIAND

NEW YORK, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The number of persons eligible for representation at the forthcoming World Zionist Congress will be about 100,000 less than the number represented at the last Congress held in Basle in 1946, it was reported here today at the planary session of the Jewish Agency executive.

Eliahm Dobkin, executive member in charge of the Organization Department, who submitted the report, said that as a result of the sheled compaigns of the last two pads approximately 1,900,000 shelm holders are eligible for representation at the 1951 world Zionist Congress which will be held in Jerusalem early in the summer. He explained that the sheled compaigns would have shown an overall increase, except for the fact that approximately a half-million potential sheled buyers in Eastern Europe were excluded by domestic conditions prohibiting compaigns in that sizes.

Part of the loss, Mr. Dobkin said, was made up by a heavy increase in shele! buying in Israel, Latin America and the Middle East. Aside from Eastern Europe, the only two countries to show a decrease in the campaigns since 1948 were the United States and England. The speaker declared that except for Israel, all countries holding elections for the Congress will have completed their balloting by December of this year. In Israel, the holding of municipal elections in Ecvember prompted a decision to postpone Congress elections there until March. In those countries where no elections are slated because parties have voluntarily agreed on the allocation of belegates, the lists of such delegates must be turned in not later than December 1 of this year.

Mr. Dobkin gave the following breakdown on the current distribution of shekel holders: United States 774,000; Esrael 670,000; Europe 180,000; Latin America 110,000; Middle East 75,000; South Africa 80,000; other countries 91,000.

NURTH WAR CRIMES CASE OPENS IN ISRAEL; MAN CHARGED WITH MURDERING JENS IN HAZI CAMES

TELAVIV, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The fourth war crimes case to be heard in Israel opened today with a preliminary hearing in Magistrate's Court here. Tancov Hoenigman, a butcher in Hearsheld, faces 16 counts of crimes against humanity including the alleged murder of six Jews in various Mazi concentration camps.

A second Israeli woman was today committed for trial on charges of being inwolved in crimes against humanity. The woman is Ria Hines, one-time bloc captain in the Razi death camp at Auschritz.

The magistrate who committed her for trial did so on the charges that she tortured women immates of the camp by forcing them to kneel for hours on a concrete flow and hold sloft bricks. She is also accused of having struck women prisoners with whip and stick, but was cleared of charges of having killed any of the prisoners. The other Israeli women who faces trial under Israel's recently enacted law punishing Mazis or Mazi collaborators found on Israel territory is Elsa Trenk.

CORAN ARAB GOES ON TRIAL CRANGED WITH ATTEMPTING TO COMAIN DESCRIP FOR MINE

Halfa, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- A district court here today began hearing charges of epiconess against Sheekat Mohemed Shelebi, an Arab resident of a Jordan village bortering on the "Arab triangle" area in central Releating.

Charged under the "Official Secrets Act," the Arab is accessed of attempting to obtain "information valuable to the enemy." The proceedings are being held in cours because of the nature of the information involved. It was reported that he was captured after he had been entitled across the Jordan-Israel berder through an intermediary.

AND STATES ECONORIC BLOCKATE OF RESALL WILL FAIL AS WAR DID. SERRETT DECIMES

HEW YORK, Nov. 9. (37h) -- The Arab states will not be able to strangle Isreal by economic blockeds any more than they were able to bill the Jouish state by military force, Inreal Poreign Minister Moshe Sharett declared here last night at the small dinner useting of the New Tork chapter of Hadassah. Some 1,000 gasets pledged \$20,000 toward Hadassah's medical program.

Asserting that the "Arab world thinks it can strangle Israel by isolation," Hr. Shrevt declared that the "crude attempt" would fail "as long as the see and air remin free." Referring to the fact that Israel has been formally recognised by many contries in all parts of the world, Hr. Shrevtt warned the Arable that "as far as relations with Israel are concerned, the isolators are becoming isolated."

ABUSTUZ UNIT BYRSTEATES JURIAN CHARGES ARAB CHILDREN SHOP IN ISBAEL SOLDIERS

JEHNAIM, Nov. 9. (JTA) — An Israel military spokement today revealed that a subcommittee of the Israel-Jordan armistics commission is investigating the Arab complaint that two Arab children were killed by Breal soldiers in no man's land near laters.

The spolessen, who termed the incident "one of the most regrettable to have occurred in or near no man's land," said that the investigating group had not jet determined whether the children were killed by ballets fired by an Israel patrol or Arab infiltrees. CALLA IN FOR INCREASED PRODUCTION, ENG CORROR SATS; CALLS FOR EXPERT WORKERS

JERUSALEM, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- Premier David Ben Gurion said today that his new Cabinet would "strive for intensification of production" through Pinhas Lubianiler, Agriculture Minister, and Teacov Gori, Minister of Trade and Industry. Mr. Ben Gurion spoke at a reception for a seven-member delegation of the South African Jewish press now visiting Larael. The Israel Premier stressed that his new Cabinet does not "represent a deviation in policy."

Premier Ben Gurion also lauded the South Africans who fought in Israel's armed forces and urged the delegation to convey "Israel's tribute" to South African Jewry. Be also appealed to Jews in the British Dominion to send their "youths and skilled and argurt workers to Israel," adding that they are "more important than money." The delegation posterday made a flying visit to Bilat, Israel's southermost outpost.

THE CHRISTIAN SETTIMENT IN ISPAEL WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY BAPTISTS WITH U.S. FUNDS

TEL AVIV, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- Preparations are under way to establish a Baptist agricultural settlement near Fetach Tikvah--the first Christian settlement since the proximation of Israel statchood. Rev. R.L. Lindsey will lead the settlement, which will include a Bible school where the language of instruction will be Rebrew.

Initially, some 50 persons will reside in the settlement. Part of the funds required for the project was received from Baptists living in southern states in the U.S. The settlers will include several former Jews who joined the Baptist congregation while living in Europe. Nost of the settlers are familiar with the Hebrew language.

ISRAEL TRADE DELECATION ARRIVES IN BELGIOM; ISRAEL FIRMS MAY GET PREFERENTIAL TREADMENT

BRUSSEIS, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- An Israel trade mission arrived here to begin trade talks with the Belgian Government. It is understood that Belgium is prepared to give Israel preferential treatment in order to enable Israel firms to purchase Belgian products.

Under such a scheme Belgian exporters would sell to Israel firms which would pay in promissory notes of five to ten years duration. Both the Belgian and Israel doverments would undertake to guarantee the notes. If the scheme is approved, comarcial circles here expect the Israelis to place immediate orders for some 2,000,000 pounds (\$5,600,000) worth of orders.

KOSE INVAL, ISBAEL DIPLOMAT IN WASHINGTON, DESERVATED AS HEAD OF CONSULAR IN MINISTRAL

WASHINGTON, How. 9. (JTA) -- Moshe Tuval, First Secretary of the Israel Embasy in Washington, has been designated consul in charge of the Israel Consulate-General in Montreal, Canada. He will assume his duties there today.

Mr. Tuval has been First Secretary at the Embassy since May, 1949, and prior to that was attached to the Israel delegation to the United Entions. Be was Israel's first passport control officer in the United States, following the establishment of the Jovish state. Be was Israel's representative in Shanghai at the time of the evacuation of the Jovish community from China to Israel last year.

LAS. ANGASSADOR RETURNS TO TEL AVIV POST; SAYS HIS OFFICE TRAUR DEPENDS OF THEMSE

TEL AVIV, Now. 9. (JTA) -- United States Ambassador-James G. McDonald returned here last night to resume his duties. Asked by newmen about his reported resignation, he declared that the ultimate decision on that matter rested with President Truman. Otherwise, he added, the duration of his term in Israel is undecided.

PENCE STUDENTS ASK PARIS POLICE FOR ACTION AGAINST PURVEYORS OF ANTI-SENGTISM

FARIS, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The French Student Committee Against Racial, Rolitical and Religious Discrimination, which was involved in the recent demonstrations against a scheduled showing of the Maxi-made film "Jew Suess," today called on the Raris police to take action to prevent any further attempts at racist or fascist propaganda. The committee also asked the police to trace the source of funds of the groups carrying on such anti-Gamitic propaganda.

1.R.O. DIRECTOR METCRES ON ABSORPTION OF 5.200 JEWISH "HARD CORE" REFUGERS BY INVASIA

GENEVA, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The group of "hard core" Jewish refugees from China which arrived at Haples on the International Refugee Organization ressel Anna Salen last weakend included the last of some 5,200 such refugees from various countries when the Israel Government accepted under an agreement with the I.R.O., Donald Kings-ley, I.R.O. director-general, amnounced here today. Mr. Kingsley added that the I.R.O. agreed to pay \$3,500,000 to Israel toward the cost of care for the "hard core" reiniges.

In a letter to Israel representative Adler-Rudel, Mr. Kingsley declared: "I wish to express my deep personal appreciation for the great humanitarian contribution which your government so generously made to the solution of this distressing problem." The Israel representative, in turn, thanked the I.R.O. By the arrangements it made to transport the ill and aged Jews from China.

GENNIS TOLD THEY ARE WELCOME IN CANADA; JEWISH PROTEST TO GOMENMENT HAS NO ENVECT

MONTREAL, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- Motwithstanding a protest by the Canadian Jewish Congress that "the admission of Masis among any German immigrants who may be allowed into this country will endarger the harmonious pattern of Canadian life and will complicate the security problems of the country," the authorities are proceeding with their plans to open the gates of this country to German rationals.

According to a report from Frankfurt, where a Carada exhibition was recently opened, the head of the Caradian mission to Germany, T.C.Davis, welcomed German exhibitors to next summer's Caradian Internetional Trade Fair in Toronto, and said: "I can assure you that German exhibitors and buyers will be given a good welcome there and an opportunity to buy and sell in this new world market place. Become of German origin now constitute the third largest ethnic group in Carada. We welcome German settlers."

Strong opposition to the "building up of Germany as a military potential and a possible threat to the peace of the world," was voiced in a resolution adopted by delegates to the sixth bigmmial conference of the National Council of Jewish Women of Canada, held in Winnipsg last week.

ANGER EX-SAZI APPOINTED TO HIGH OFFICE IN GERMA PROTUCE OF SCHLESHED-HOISTEIN

BMSURG, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The new Schleswig-Holstein government, headed by treksi Helter Bertrem, has appointed another former Hazi official, Dr. Ernst Kracht, director of the provincial Minister-President's office. The appointment has occasioned much protest, even in the Danish newspapers across the border.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF CHRISTIANS AND JEWS MEETS IN WASHINGTON TO DOMBAT RELIGIOUS BIAS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The 22nd annual meeting of the Rational Conference of Christians and Jews opened here today at the Mayflower Hotel to consider the moblems of fighting religious prejudice and discrimination on a global scale.

The three-day parley will adopt a nation-wide campaign goal of \$3,542,475 to finance an expanded program in 1951 and will elect new officers. Rominated for reelection are Dr. Everett R. Ulinchy, president of the Conference, and Charles E. Wilam. Roger W. Strauss and Thomas E. Braniff. as national co-chairmen.

Highlights of the meeting will be a message from President Truman and the presentation of silver medals by the Conference to all past chairmen of Brotherhood West. Recipients of the swards are Harold R. Stassen for his leadership in 1946; the late John G. Winant, 1947; Robert P. Patterson, 1948; Nelson A. Rockefeller, 1949; and John L. Sullivan, 1950.

MEETS ADOPT PLAN ON PROVIDING JEWISH CHAPIAINS FOR AMERICAN ARMED FORCES

NEW YORK, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- The Rabbinical Alumni of the Yeshiva University, at an all-day conference here today, adopted a program to supply 39 Jewish chaplains moded in the American armed forces by the end of this year, and 110 chaplains by Nuy. 1971.

Under the plan, accepted by the rabbis, each graduate will be drafted, first, by the rabbinical group in line with the terms of eligibility set-up by the military autorities. Within these limits the rabbis will then be requested to volunteer for saplaincy duty under a priority system similar to that being used by selective service officials. The call to duty will be determined by lot--drawn by a member of the biversity faculty.

BRAINS OF BRITISH GENERAL WID HELPED HAGANAH WILL BE RE-INTERRED TODAY AT ARLINGTON

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- Israel military officials will pay a final tribute to Maj. Gen. Orde C. Wingate, British officer who helped train the Haganah, to-more at re-interment services at Arlington National Commetery here.

Gen. Wingate will be re-buried with the remains of U.S. Army Air Force men with whom he died in an air crash in Burma on March 25, 1944. The impact of the crash was such that individual bodies were indistinguishable.

Israel military attache Colonel Chaim Herzog and Wing Commander Yehuda Giladi vill participate in memorial services and lay a weath on the grave. American Air love Chief of Chaplains Major General Charles Corpenter will officiate. High ranking British officers will also take part.

During his service as a British intelligence officer in Palestine, Wingate ownized special units among the Haganah. At Ain Harod, in the Emek, Wingate expended facilities at a school which trained Haganah officers. He organized special night squads" of Jews who helped put down Arab uprisings and defended the oil pipelin from Irag to Haifa.

The remains were first buried in India and later removed to a single mausolsm at Manila, in the Philippine Islands. The final burial at Arlington was agreed to by the British Government because a majority of those involved in the crash were Asricans.

RUNISTS IN MEXICO URGED BY DR. HEIMANN TO AID ISRAEL; ATTACES ISRAEL'S PROFESSIVE MANY

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- Zionists in Mexico were urged today to "throw in every ounce of energy to help carry Israel's stargering burdens" in an address delivered by Dr. Emanuel Neumann at a meeting held under the auspices of the Zionist organizations of Mexico.

Dr. Neumann charged at the same time that Israel's economic difficulties, largely due to the tremendous immigration, have been aggravated by "the perpetuation of policies on the part of the government which tended to discourage private capital" as well as by "a policy which tends to weaken organized Zionism" in countries outside of Israel.

The re-shuffle of the Israel Cabinet and the appointment of a non-Socialist Minister for Trade and Industry cannot be considered as "sufficiently far-reaching changes," Dr. Neumann Said. "One obvious lesson of the Cabinet crisis is the urgent need a strong liberal center party such as could be provided by a urnon of all General Zionists in Israel," he added. "General Zionists the world over must urge and demand the healing of the breach caused by the formation of the Progressive Party."

COMMITTEE FORMED TO SELECT AMERICAN SOCIAL SERVICE WORKERS FOR ISRAEL PROGRAM

NEW YORK, Nov. 9. (JTA) -- A committee of prominent professionals and laymon has been established to select qualified trained American social workers to take up a 15-month assignment to help rehabilitate and establish newly arriving immigrants in Israel, it was announced here today by the National Committee to Select Social Workers for Israel.

Included in the 15 month assignment with Malben, social welfare agency jointly established in Israel by the Israel Government, the Zewish Agency and the Joint Distribution Committee, is a three month orientation course. The committee's announcement said that round-trip fare will be paid for those who complete the 15-month contract. The salary offered for case workers and supervisors "is sufficient for maintaining a reasonably adequate standard of living in Israel," the announcement added.

Case workers should be under 40 years of age, experienced graduates of a recomized social service school or its equivalent and should have a working browledge of Middish, German and French. For supervisory personnel the ere limit is 45, the ducation and experience qualifications are the same as for case workers, except that they must have had five years of supervisory experience.

DESTREE DOCTOR SELECTED BY ISRAEL COVERNMENT TO CONDUCT TUBERCULOSIS SURVEY IN COUNTRY

DENVER, Nov. 9. (JTA) - Dr. Allan Buret, medical director of the National Jevish Hospital of Denver, has been selected by the Israel Government to conduct a two-coulosis survey in the Jevish state, it was announced here today. Dr. Hurst will leste for Israel this month, the announcement said.

M. KUUSSKYLISKY RETURNS FROM ISRAEL: IREPARED ISRAEL'S ORCHESTRA FOR U.S. TOUR
