NEW ISRAEL CABINET CRISIS DEVELOPING; COALITION FAILS TO SATISFY ORTHODOX DEMANDS

JERUSAIRM, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- A new Israel Government orisis is in the making and may break out at any moment, it was learned here today. The reason for the latest development appears to be the inability of the five-man Ministerial committee to resolve the demands of the Religious Bloc on the religious education of children in the immigrant work centers.

Meanwhile, Rabbi Judah L. Maimon, Minister for Religion and leader of the Mirrachi Party, has been asked not to continue his trip to the United States until the situation is clarified. Rabbi Maimon, who is now on the Riviera en route to the U.S., has been informed of the situation by cable. He was scheduled to arrive in the U.S. next week.

The situation within the five-Minister body -- which is headed by Premier David Ben Gurion -- "blew up" last night. Subsequent efforts to bridge the gap between the Religious Bloc and other members of the coalition have failed. The next major development is expected at Thursday's meeting of the full Cabinet.

Sources close to the Orthodox leaders assert that this time the crisis will not take the form of resignation of Orthodox Ministers from the Cabinet. Instead, they say, the Religious Bloc will insist upon new national elections. This demand may be presented to the Cabinet Thursday.

ISRAEL-BOYPTIAN ARMISTICE COMMISSION MEETS; DISCUSSES BOYPT'S BLOCKADE OF SUEZ CANAL

JERUSALEM, Jan. 16. (JFA) -- The special mixed Israeli-Egyptian armistice commission met today under the chairmanship of Gen. William E. Rilay, U.N. Chief of Staff for Palestine, and discussed the question of Egypt's blockede of the Susz Canal and its removal of Israel-bound consignments from ships passing through the Canal.

An official communique issued after the meeting said that the discussions were adjourned until further legal investigation is completed. Gen. Riley must report to the U.N. Security Commoil not later than Feb. 17 on the success or failure of the discussions,

An Israel military spokesman today declared that Expyt's action in blockeding the Susz Canal for Israel is a hostile act "infringing upon the freedom of the seas." The Israel representative at today's parley was It. Col. Yoshafat Harakabi.

ISRAEL'S MILITARY ATTACHES IN U.S., BRITAIN, FRANCE AND TURKET SUMMONED TO TEL AVIV

TEL AVIV, Jan. 16: (JTA) -- Israel's military attaches abroad have been summoned home for routine communitations, a military spokeman announced here today. The attaches are: Col. Vivian Hercor of the Washington Embassy Col. Eatriel School of the London Ministry; Col. David Shaltiel of the Paris Ministry; and Col. Tri Shay of Ankara Ministry.

JOHDAN PRESENTS UN WITH FAIT ACCOMPLI; INSTALLS "PROTECTOR" OF JEST BALLE HOLY PLACES.

JERUSAIM, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- In a move to present the United Nations and the Christian world with a fait accompli and to forestell the functions of a United Nations Commissioner for the Roly Flaces in Jerusalem, the Joydan Government yesterday officially installed Enghet Haghahibi, former Arab mayor of Jerusalem, as "Supreme Guardian of the Holy Flaces." Mr. Nashahibi is a member without portfolio of the Joydan Cabinet.

Catholic circles indicated today that they consider the move a violation of the status quo in relation to the Boly Places. Israel observers pointed out that in the proclamations issued in connection with the Mashabibi installation, the Hely Places over which he will be the guardian are not specified, and would seem to include the Wailing Wall and other Jevish Holy Places.

The installation ceremony took place at Rowda College, seat of the Jordan Government in the Old City of Jeruselem. It was attended by members of the Jordan Cabinet and by diplicantic representatives of Great Britain, United States, Netherlands, Turkey and Greece. However, it was boycotted by the Apostolic delegate, the Latin Ratriarch and the diplomatic representatives of France, Belgian, Italy, Spain and other Catholic countries.

Also absent from the ceremony were the Consuls of Iran, Ethiopia and Switzerland. The Consuls of Czechoslovakia, Poland and Turoslavia were not invited.

U.N. GROUP SENDS TWO EXPERTS TO ISRAEL TO ADVISE GOVERNMENT ON AGRICULTURAL PROBLEMS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- Two technical assistance experts will leave for Israel in the near future under auspices of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization as a result of an agreement signed today at F.A.O. headquarters by Israel Ambassador Abba Eban and Dr. F.T. Wahlen, chief of the expanded technical assistance program of F.A.G.

The experts will advise Israel for a period of one year. One of them will be an expert in land use, who will determine which lands are best adapted for grazing, forestry, and the production of crops. The second will be an expert in range management with special knowledge of semi-arid conditions prevailing in much of Israel.

HISE KOCH'S LAWYER INTENDS TO APPEAL LIFE IMPRISONMENT VERDICT OF GERMAN COURT

MMNICH, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- Lise Eoch, the "witch of Buchenwald" who was sentenced yesterday to life imprisonment for atrocities against the immates of the Buchenwald concentration camp, was longed today in the women's prison at Aichach, hear Augsburg. Her lawyer said that he would appeal the wordict to the West German Supreme Court.

It was the second life sentence for her. The first, imposed by an American war crimes court in 1945, was commuted to four years and she was released last year. She was immediately rearrested by the Germans. Tosterday's sentence was issued by a German court of three judges and six lay jurymen. The trial lasted seven weeks.

TURKEY, SMEDEN, PINTAND WILL GET MAISHER-FRAZER CARS ASSISSED IN ISRAEL PLANT

TEL AVIV, Jan. 16. (JEA) -- Turkey, Sweden and Finland will get the bulk of Easer-Frazer automobiles assembled in 1951 at the new assembly plant near Haife, \ the Jovich Telegraphic Assemy learned today. The arrangements were made under trade agreements. The plant is expected to turn out 20 cars a day.

MIZPACHI CRITICIZES CINCINNATI REFORM LEADITS FOR BOYCOTTING ISRAEL'S MINISTER MALMON

NEW YORK, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- Dr. Pinkhos Churgin, president of the Migrachi Organization of America, today issued a statement severely criticizing Dr. Welson Shack president of the Hebrev Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, for declining an invitation to be among the local sponsors of a visit to Cincinnati of Rabbi Judah L. Maimon, Israel Minister of Religion. Rabbi Maimon is scheduled to arrive in the United States on January 23 for a four-week tour arranged by the Mizrachi organization.

Dr. Glueck and a number of other leaders of the Reform movement in Cincinnati declined the invitation, declaring that they questioned the status of religious freedom in Israel today, especially for non-Orthodox Jews. Those who joined Dr. Glusck in turning down the invitation include Lester A. Jaffe, chairman of the board of the Hebrew Union College, and Philip Mayers, vice-president of the Union of American Helmey Congregations.

In his statement. Dr. Churgin charged Dr. Glueck and his group with "acting in extraordinary bad faith which ill becomes any leaders in the American Jevish community." Dr. Churgin said that Rabbi Maimon, as a member of the Israel Cabinet, "at the very least deserves the same de jure recognition which these Reform religious leaders accord to non-religious or even anti-religious ministers from Israel." He pointed out that Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, also a Reform rabbi,accepted the honorary chairmanship of the reception committee formed in Cleveland for Minister Maimon.

ANNA ROSENBERG'S ACCUSERS MAY FACE PERFURY CHARGES; SENATE COMMITTEE STARTS ACTION

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16, (JTA) -- The Senate Armed Services Committee, which unanimously cleared Assistant Secretary of Defense Anna M. Rosenberg of accusations of being a Communist, yesterday moved toward a court test of whether Mrs. Rosenberg's accusers can be charged with perjury.

The committee asked the Justice Department to determine whether there is evidence of perjury on the part of those who testified against Mrs. Rosenberg. Attorney General J. Howard McGrath was told by the committee that from the testimony there "appears to be a distinct possibility some of the witnesses may have committed perjury, subornation of perjury or perhaps other criminal offenses.

GEORGIA LEGISIATURE PASSES BILL AIMED AT CHECKING ACTIVITIES OF KU KUUK KIAN

ATIAWA, Georgia, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- In an effort to check Ku Klur Klan activities, the George House of Representatives passed a bill outlawing the hood and mask of the Ku Klur Klan and banning the burning of crosses on private property without the owner's consent. The bill, which was passed by a vote of 149-1, now goes to the Senate.

MEN YORK SUPRIME COURT UPHOLDS "RELEASED TIME" PHOM SCHOOL FOR RELIGIOUS TRAINING

MEN YORK, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- The Appellate Division of the State Serreme Court in Brooklyn yesterday upheld the constitutionality of the state's "released time" progrean whereby children are excused from school one hour a week to attend religious classes conducted off the school grounds.

ISRAEL DIFLOMATS ASSIGNED TO FOUR LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRIES CONFER IN ARGENTINA

BURNOS AIRES, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- A conference of Israel diplomats and "honorary Israel consuls" from Argentina, Umuguay, Paraguay and Chile under the chairman-ship of Yaccov Tsur, Israel Minister to all four countries, concluded here today.

A communique issued after the conference revealed that the parley considered the various technical problems concerned with representing Israel interests on several diplomatic levels. It added that "a number of conclusions were reached" which are expected to lead to great efficiency in the various consulates. Israel's position on the world scene was also discussed.

WINE AMERICAN NEWSPARERS SEND REPORTERS TO ISRAEL FOR THREE-WEEK SURVEY

NEW YORK, Jan. 16. (JTA) -- Nine newspapermen representing major metropolitan dailies across the country will leave tomorrow on a survey trip to Israel to report on the immigration, settlement and rehabilitation programs supported there with funds raised through the United Jewish Arpeal, it was amounced by Edward M.M. Warburg, General Chairman of the U.J.A.

The newspapermen will spend three weeks in Israel, during which time they will inspect reception camps and "work villages" for newly-arrived immigrants from Europe, North Africa and the Near East. They will also tour Israel's major cities and meet with top Israel Government officials, including Fremier David Ben Gurion.

Making the trip aboard a TMA Constellation are: George Carroll, New York Journal American Harry B. Wilson, St. Louis Globe-Democrat; Otto Zausmer, Boston Globe; Grace Davidson, Boston Fost; Dickson Preston, CL. "sland Press; Max Wiener, Newark News; David Earno, Chicago Sun-Times; Richard Pearce, San Francisco Emminer; and George Cassidy, Brooklyn Engle. Upon return from Israel, several of the newspapermen will stop in Paris to inspect homes for refugees and other installations maintained by the Joint Distribution Committee.

P.S. GOURGEY NAMED TO REPRESENT INDIAN JEWRY AT FORTECOMING WORLD ZIDNIST CONCRESS

BOMBAY, Jan. 16, (JTA) -- P.S. Gourgey, honorary secretary of the Etmbay Zionist Association, will represent Indian Zionists at the forthcoming World Zionist Congress this gummar.

He was declared elected when the only other candidate for Indian Zionian's single seat to the Congress, H. Cynowicz, failed to obtain the necessary signatures to a nominating petition. Her Congress, a non-party man, is known to incline toward Orthodory.

At previous congresses, the Indian delegation has also represented the 1,500 Jews of Afghanistan, but this time Afghan Jews are attempting to send their own representative, according to reports from Eabel, where many of the Afghanistan Jews live. The basis for their representation, however, is not clear because it is known that no shekolim -- symbol of members-ip in the Zionist movement -- were sold in the country.
