#### Syrian Troops invade israeli territory in hilen region; kill sevee jerish rolicemen

TEL AVIV, April 4. (JTA) — Swian troops toway invaded largeli territorin the Huleh verion of northeastern Balestine and Milled seven Jewish policemen, wounded one and captured another Jew. This is the first time rin a the dispute overlarged's wight to relaim march land in the demiliterized wore between largel and Syria that such an investon occurred and such asculties were inflicted.

A report from the scene of the invasion late tonicht declared that the wounded men and the prisoner had come under United Estime protection. It was also reported that Col. Shall Beneti, top Israel Army officer, was hurrient to the scene southeast of Ein Gev, to study the situation and take there of the bodies of the dead policemen.

Prox Jerusales it was reported that the Israeli representatives on the Israel Syrian Mired Armistics Consission proposed that the members of the Consission proposed inmediately to the scene of the clash. The suggestion was turned down, without explanation by the U.S. chairman, Col. H. Bassey, whereupon the Israelis walked out of the meeting.

The Jerusalez reports also stated that U.S. military observers in the Bulch region, hurrying to the scene of the clash, were fired upon by Syrian toops and were forced to seek safety in Samahi. #### messet adopts new election law; fixes june 30 as date of national elections

JERUSALEM, April 4. (JTA) -- The Israel Parliament today adopted a first reading of the new election law, fixing June 30th as the date of the forthcoming Parliniontary elections.

The Parliament also passed the Transition Law, which provides that the present Purliament be dissolved at the very moment that the newly-elected Parliament is conwened. This law was passed in the face of opposition by Mapai, Israel's Labor Party, hich demanded that Parliament be dissolved a day prior to the elections of the new ody.

#### ISRAEL'S OPERATIONS IN HULEH CONTINUE UNMODESTED; KIDNAPED JEWS TO BE RELEASED

TEL AVIV, April 4. (JTA) -- Israel's drainess operations in the Bulch continued today without molestation by Syrian troops, while the Israel-Syrian armistice commission resumed meeting in an attempt to find a peaceful solution of the conflict arising out of Israel's reclamation of marabland in the border area.

The three members of ... Kibbutz Betar who were kidnaped yesterday by soldiers of the Arab Legion will be returned to Israel on April 8, in accordance with a decision today of a sub-committee of the Mixed Armistice Commission. Upon their retains they will be put on trial in Israel charged with unlawfully crossing the border and contacting the enemy, a government spokesman said here today.

## JUN. TRUCE CHIEF'S REPORT ON BULE SAYS SYRIA'S OBJECTIONS ARE NOT JUSTIFIED

UNITED MATIONS. N.Y., April 4. (JTA) -- An Israel delegation spokesman declared today that the Huleh marshes being reclaimed lie within Israel's territory and that the drainage project is in full accord with provisions of the armistice agreement with Syria which call for facilitating "the transition from the present truce to permanent peace in Ralestine.

The spokesman cited a March 21 report of truce supervisor Major Gen. William E. Riley to the U.W Security Council which declared: "In draining the Huleh merches, the Israelis are performing works of a civilian nature for the purpose of reclaiming land for cultivation. This work affects land in the territory under Israel control. Therefore Syria cannot on any grounds offer objections to this type of work."

Asserting that Israel found no inconsistency between the Huleh development scheme and the armistics agreement, the Israel spokesmen said the Syrian protest to the Security Council had no foundation either in fact or in law. Meanwhile, Syria's United Nations representative, Paris el Khouri, today addressed a second protest against Israel to the president of the Security Council. His communication alleged the "illegal exacuation by force" of 980 Arabs from the region of Baggara by Israel police.

## WISH DELEGATION CALLS ATTENTION OF BRITISH GOVERNMENT TO PATE OF JEWS IN IRAQ

LONDON, April 4. (JTA) -- A delomation of Jewish religious and communal leadrest today called at the Foreign Office to bring to the attention of the British Govrment the precarious situation of the Jews of Iraq as a result of the recently dopted anti-Jewish legislation of the Iraqi Government. The deputation was received y Kenneth Younger, Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, who is currently responsile for Middle Rast Affairs in the Foreign Office.

A meeting of the leaders of the British Zionist Federation adopted a resolution calling on the British Government to express its displeasure to the Iraqi Govrument over the manner in which the Arab state treats its Jows. Expressing admiration for the sacrifices made by Israel in accepting the Iraqi immigrants, the Zionist saders urged all British Jows to give fullest support to the Joint Palestine Appeal.

"The serious position of the Jews of Iraq which might lead to similar developments in other Arab countries, makes it-imperative that every effort be made to achieve a general peace settlement between Israel and the Arab states," E. Goodman, political secretary of the Anadas Israel Organization, said today at a meeting of the European executive of the organization.

#### eritish parliamentary delegation finds relations improved between israel and britain

TEL AVIV, Ayril 4. (JTA) -- The marked improvement in relations between Israel and Britain was mirrored in the fact that during its entire eight-day stay in the Jewish state the British Parliamentary delogation never once heard any hostile or adverse remark about Britain, R. Glenvil Hall, leader of the delogation, told a press conference here just before his group returned home.

He said that the delegation, which came to Israel at the invitation of the Knoset, had gained the impression that any differences between the new Jewish state and Britain could be "ironed out in an atmosphere of understanding and mutual appreciation."

### HUNGARY NO LONGER PRACTS SALGRATION OF JEWS, ISRAELI MINISTER OF IMMIGRATION REPORTS

NEW YORK, April 4. (JR) - Hungary no longer pormits the emigration of Jows to Israel, Noshe Shaptro, Israeli Minister of Interior, Health and Immigration, to-day told a press conference here. Even the emigration of 3,000 Jews under an existing Israeli-Hungarian agreement is meeting with difficulties, he declared.

On the other hand, emigration from Rumania to Israel has increased, the Minister reported. Jewish emigration from Foland is in its last steams, he revealed, adding that there are today about 42,000 Jews loft in Foland, must of whom do not think in terms of emigrating to Israel. Mevertheless, Israel will admit 120,000 immigrants within the next four months—the largest immigration record in the history of the Jewish state—he pointed out. Most of the newcomers will be Jows from Iwaq and Rumania, he said.

### CHANGE OF MANS OF ANGLO-PAIRSTINE BANK EFFECTED; NEW WAME IS ISRAEL MATIONAL BANK

TRE AVIV, April 4. (JTA) -- The change of name of the Anglo-Palestine Bank to Bank Heleumi L'Israel-Israel National Bank-was registered today in the District Court here, with an official statement that as of January 19 the Israel Rational Bank had taken over from the Anglo-Palestine Bank all shares, except for 5,976 ordinary shares and 8,385 preferred shares. The capital of the National Bank is now 3,000,000 Israeli pounds divided into three categories of shares.

#### WISH COMMUTTES IN TIALY SUPPORE ISPARL'S CLAIM FOR REPARATIONS FROM GRIMANY

ROME, April 4. (JTA) — The fourth Congress of the Union of Italian Jevish mammities concluded here after adopting a resolution supporting Israel's claim for 1,500,000,000 in reparations from Germany and expressing the conference's disappoint over the progressive readmission of Germany to the family of nations without it swing shown the will to compensate for the moral and material damages caused the way. Forty-tho delegandes representing 23 communities attended the parley.

Another resolution declared that the remilitarization of Germany is a threat o world peace, and called upon the Allied powers to destroy German nationalism and o re-emains their policies toward Germany. A third resolution scored the freeing t Razi war criminals by the Allies. Other resolutions hailed the work of the World swish Congress and pledged cooperation in the upbuilding of Israel.

Dr. Baffaele Cantoni, president of the Union, reported that in the five years mich have elapsed since the last Congress, the Council of the Union has won the armoval of the Italian Ministry of Interior and the respect of the Vatican for its consistent line of action in behalf of Jevish rights. Other speakers said that the sture of Italy's 35,000 Jews is not bright unless Jews who became Christian converts buring the persecutions of the Fascist regime return to the Jevish community. Dr. Cantoni was re-elected president of the Union. For the first time in the history of the Council of the Union a woman, Tullis Zevi, was named to the 15-member Council.

#### AUSTRALIANS AGAIN RECEIVING ANTI-SEMITIC LITERATURE FROM SWEDISH PAMPHLETEER

SYMME, April 4. (JTA) -- After a brief respite of several months anti-Semitic literature is again being received in Australia from Einar Aberg, notorious Swediah anti-Semite, whose activities the Swediah anthorities are pleased to half. Steps are being taken to bring the matter to the attention of the Swediah and Australian anthorities.

The last time the Australian Jews protested to the Swedish Minister to Australia, the latter said that Abers's further use of the mails for distributing antibentite proposands would bring the law in Sweden down in him. This time Abers is not only sending his own tracts to individual Australian businessen, but is also acting as a distributing agent for anti-Semites operating ou. of St. Louis and Pietermaritzming, South Africa.

## RIPTON PARLIAMENT TO GET BILL ADVOCATING BAN ON PACTAL DISCRIMINATION IN HOTRIS

TORDON, April 4. (JTA) -- A bill to outlaw racial discrimination in hotels and motion picture houses will be introduced in the House of Commons Friday by Labor-life R.W. Soremson. The bill defines discrimination as the refusal, denial or withholding of accommodations, facilities or privileges on account of race or other.

## ALWARD MEDICAL SORE LACCEPTS \$200,000 EXCUST MICH STIRULARS RACIAL DISCROSSION

BORNE, April h. (JRA) -- A \$200,000 bequest to establish a scholarship fund "preferabl," for applicants of Angle-Seron ancestry" was accepted by the Envard Medical School, it was reported here today.

The acceptance of the bequest was protected by Walter C. Carrington, president of the university's Society for Minority Rights. "Acceptance of this new fundwill contribute to recial discrimination at Harvard," Mr. Carrington charged.

#### Duates of Liberal jewish seminary volunteer as chaptains in U.S. Armed forces

NEW YORK, April 4. (JTA) -- Virtually all eligible members of the 1951 graating class of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in Cincinnati d New York have volunteered for service in the chaptaincy, according to an announcent today by Dr. Belson Glueck, president. College-Institute students, like other hological students and clergymen, are greaty from military draft.

The Division of Beligious Activities of the Jewish Welfare Board had been also by the armed forces to have 111 Jewish chaplains on active duty by June 30. is expected that these will be supplied in equal numbers from Jewish Reform, Conservative and Orthodox groups. #### MAIGRANTS FROM YEMEN WILL VOTE FOR ISPARL'S LABOR PARTY, DAVAR EDITOR PREDICTS

NEW YORK, April 4. (JTA) -- The conviction that a large number of religious punigrants in Israel, especially immigrants from Yomen and Iraq, will vote for the kepsi in the forthcoming Parliamentary elections was expressed here today by Don Pines, managing editor of Davar, Israeli abor paper. He spoke at a press luncheon condered him by Zionist Isborites here.

Mr. Pines reviewed the present situation in Isrcel and declared that the newcomers from Yemen are not satisfied with the Mizrachi and the Agudah organizations. He revealed that there is a sharp difference of opinion on religious matters ben the Israel Rabbinate and the spiritual leaders of the Yemenite community in Israel.

#### "CHILDREN TO PALESTINE" HOLDS FIRST ANNUAL DISN'S; ATTENDED BY CHRISTIANS AND JEWS

NEW YORK, April 4. (JEA) -- More than 500 leading Jews and non-Jews tonight attended the first amount dinner of Children to Palestine, an organization of Christians and Jews engaged in a program of humanitarian services for orphaned Jewish children in Tarnel.

We appeals for funds were made; but the speakers emphasized that they hope the activities of the organization represent a sound approach to the strengthening of friendly relations among people of all faiths. Principal speakers included Judge Robert P. Ratterson, former Secretary of War; Benjamin Cohen, Assistant Secretary General of the United Metions; Martha Sharp, Special Assistant to the chairman of the National Securities Resources Board, Spyro Skource, theatre magnate; and Mary Pickford.

Organized by a group of Christians and Jows in 1943, Children to Falestine has found that in following the history of children made homeless by Mazi anti-Semitism, American youth can be made sware of the potential plicht of any minority group and sharpened to recognize and to act against discrimination. The organization is conducting its educational activities through the use of working services, films and projects for use in schools, churches and community groups.

## BALTIMORE BOARD OF EDUCATION PRESENTED WITH TAIMED PRINTED IN ROST-RAZI GERMANY

BAIFINORS, Ma., April 4. (JTA) -- A set of the first Talmud to be printed in Rebrew in post-Hitler Germany was presented here last night to the Board of Jevish Education by Harry Greenstein, executive director of the Associated Jevish Charities. The 19-volume edition was given to Mr. Greenstein by the Joint Distribution Committee in recognition of the role he played in its publication, while serving in Germany as advisor on Jewish affairs to the American Military Government.
