BRABL AIR FORCE BOMBS SYRIAN MILITARY POSITIONS; RETALIATES FOR INVASION

JERUSALEM, April 5. (JTA) -- Israel's air force tonisht carried out riscrous ortics against Syria in retaliation for the invasion by Syrian troops yesterday of sraeli territory in the demilitarized zone of the Huleh area and for the killing of even Israeli civilian policemen in the village of Hamma, on the edge of the demilitarized zone.

A military spokesman here said that Israeli planes beabed Syrian military and para military concentrations and entrenchments in the demilitarized zone. He declared that "the action was successful." He revealed that 45 concentrations had been boubed and credited the Jewish bombardiers with "scoring good hits." One of the targets was the police station in Hamma, he said. Other targets included fortified Syrian positions about 10 yards behind a read adjacent to the nearby boundary.

The Israeli spokesman declined to disclose the strength of the air units which participated in the operations. The retaliatory measures followed a meeting of the Israeli Cabinet today at which Brigadier Yigal Yadin, Chief of Staff of Israel's armed forces, was present.

Israel Determined to Defend Its Borders, High Officer Says

A high lereal officer told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency: "We are ready to repulse any attempt to infrinke upon our sovereignty in any ares, including the Bish ares, and to defend our borders." He made it clear that Israel will insist on the withdrawal of Syrian troops from the demilitarized zone held by Israel and that the authorities of the Jewish state will not tolerate any Syrian interference with their reclamation of the Bish marches.

Col. Georges Rossavy, French chairman of the Israel-Syrian Mined Armistice Commission, was severely criticised by the Israeli spokeman for turning down an Israeli suggestion yesterday that the entire Armistica Commission—which was in session when the news of the Syrian invasion of Hamma reached Israel-should immediately proceed to the scene of the clash. The Israeli official said that the lives of the seven policemen killed by the Syrians could have been saved, had the Commission proceeded at once to Hamma.

The bodies of the dead Islandis were recovered today after intervention by United Wattons observers. Several other policemen, taken prisoner by the Syrian soldiers during yesterday's invasion, were permitted to return to Israeli territory today under an arremement made by the U.N. observers.

Col. Bennet de Ridder, U.M. acting chief truce officer, flew today to Demacus to discuss the situation with high Syrian officials. It is understood that he criticized Col. Bossavy for "inefficient and incompetent" handling of the situation by refusing to proceed to the scene of the clash.

MAKEL WILL FILE COMPIAINT WITH SECURITY CONCIL AGAINST STRIAN ATTACKS

JERUSALEM, April 5. (JTA) -- The Israel Coverment will file a complaint with United Sations Security Council against the actions of Syrian forces in the Euleh gion of northeastern Israel where several weeks of intermittent firing by the Anals: Jewish workers culminated posterday in an invasion of the village of Hamma in Iseal territory.

It is understood that the Israeli demarche will charge the Syrians with detherebyly planning the invasion of the Israeli village, which lies within a demitarized zone. The Israeli Government will back this charge by pointing on that experatory work on the Haleh reclamation project, to which the Syrians only recently sor objection, was started four months ago with the full incodes of the Syrians and a U.R. staff in Palestine. It is understood that the Israeli complaint will charge year violations of the armistice acrossment between March 15 and April 3, ending with asterdar's attack in which seven Jows were tilled.

NOTED NATIONS RECEIVES REPORT OF STRIAN CROSSING INTO ISPAEL; REPORT HELD CONFIDENTIAL

UNITED MATRIES, H.Y., April 5. (JTA) -- The United Sations has received a reort on the new incidents on the Israel-Syrian border, United Sations sources ininsted today. The report, from the U.S. observers on the scene, was held confidential and its contents not disclosed.

It was learned, however, that the United Nations has been informed that the Green Covernment is taking a very firm position on its right to carry out civilian evelopment projects in the Huleh area and on the principle that such work involves no violation whatever of the Israel-Syrian armistice agreement.

MARS OF FIRE OF CATHERING ADDRESSED BY HER CURIOR; TWO ISPARLI SOLDIESS WOURDED

JECULE, April 5. (JTA) -- Premier Devid Bon Gurion was exposed to sumfire from Arab Lagionnaires pesterday when, accompanied by Brigadier Tical Yadin, Chief of Staff of the Israel Army, he inveiled an obelisque at Kiryat Anavim in memory of members of the Palmoch who fell in an attempt to lift the siese of Jerusalem Suring the Israel liberation wer.

Kiryat Ameria is a settlement in the Jerusalem-Hel Aviv corridor, morth of Jerusalem. Israel sources charmed that the Jordan troops opened fire without proveextion, slightly wounded too Israel soldiers. They recoverly denied reports broadment by the Jordan radio that ten fully-equipped Israeli soldiers had crossed the Frontier near Kiryat Ameria. The Arab radio said that "Jordanian forces repulsed the stackers, killing one and wounding two."

In a brief speech dedication the memorial, the Promier paid tribute to the heroism of the Palench youths who had fallen and declared it was "the most precious seapon of Invael." The memorial was built with funds contributed by families of the fallen troops and the mettlers of the Reynt America cross.

IZHIRG NAZIS ATTACK JENS: SHOUT "JENS AND AMERICANS GET CUT": 30 JENS INJURED

VIENNA, April 5. (JTA) -- A band of some 60 former members of Mazi youth ormizations last night precipitated the first serious outbreak of anti-Smittlem in mutria since the end of the wer. Before the riot was over nearly 30 Jows had been inred, at least a Gozen seriously.

The Mazis gathered in front of a theatre in Salzburg where the film "Ismortal sloved," produced by Veit Harlan, director of the Mazi-made anti-Semitic film "Jow bass," was being shown. A desconstration—the second this week-against the film had sen scheduled by Jews and others protesting the showing of Harlan's production. The aris began shouting: "Jews and Americans get out."

Fighting broke out shortly thereafter and the police intervened. Jewish leaders who participated in the demonstration charge that the police made little or no ttempt to halt the Mazi provocation, but turned on the Jews instead. The police broad the Jews into a cul de sec and them together with the Mazis, awang truncheous, is the demonstrators broke and ran, police, Mazis and many bystenders joined in the stack, using clube and throwing stones.

Among the twelve persons seriously injured were: Pinkas Spiegal, member of the executive of the Salaburg Jewish community; Ferdinand Putz, chairman of the league of Socialist Fighters for Freedom; Frieda Scharf; and Stefan Crustein, who suffered a fractured shull. One woman, unmaned, is reported to be in serious consition in a hospital. All the sewerely injured victims were hit in the head.

The only positive action taken by the police during the riot was to disperse the Mari horde when it attempted to storm the headquarters of the Jowish Community after it ran out of individual Jewish victims. One high ranking police official was beard to remark during the riot: "You Jews should be beheaded." One result of the affair was that the management of the theatre withdrew the film.

Horman Hinziger, president of the Salzburg Jevish Community, immediately lodged a protest with the local authorities. He charged that Hitler Youth movement members were involved. A spokesmen for the community revealed that hefore the protest threatening telephone calls had been received from the Hazis. The Socialist League, which we involved in the demonstration, protested to Minister of the Interior Ochar Helmer seminat the police behaviour in the riot, charging that they beat the peaceful demonstrators to a far greater extent than the Masi provocateurs.
