ISRAEL SATISFIED WITH U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL'S ACTION ON SYRIAN DISPUTE

LAKE SUCCESS, April 18. (JTA) -- The Security Council's decision to defer further consideration of the Israeli-Syrian dispute until after it has heard a report from Major General William E. Riley, U.N. truce chief in Palestine, was welcomed today in Israeli circles as providing an opportunity for settlement of the issues on the local level through the Mixed Armistice Commission.

In U.N. circles it is considered "quite likely" that when the Security Council next meets it will have before it a progress report from Col. Bennet de Ridder, acting truce chief who will chair the meeting of the Mixed Armistice Commission. These same circles believe that if the report shows that progress is being made on a local level the Council will again defer action.

BRITISH STATESMAN EULOGIZES 60,000 JEWS WHO DIED IN ANTI-NAZI REVOLT IN WARSAW GHETTO

LONDON, April 18. (JTA) -- The eighth anniversary of the Jewish uprising against superior Nazi forces in the Warsaw Ghetto was observed here tonight at a memorial meeting arranged by the World Jewish Congress at which Lord Henderson of the British Foreign Office was one of the principal speakers.

"The 60,000 Jews who died gloriously in the bitter five-week battle in the Warsaw ghetto may seem few in comparison with the total of Jews exterminated by the Nazis in the camps of Oswiecim, Maidanek and Treblinka, but they take an assured place in history as a result of their unparalleled resistance in the face of overwhelming odds," Lord Henderson said.

Reviewing in detail the Nazi persecution of Jews, the British statesman said that the Jewish defenders of the Warsaw Ghetto gave the world "an example of unparalleled heroism that will never be forgotten." It would be inconceivable, he declared, if the German people had no stirrings of conscience "for the heinous acts of the Third Reich" and if they were without any wish to make such material reparation to the Jews as lay in their power.

"There could be no greater reflection upon the new democratic Germany than a refusal to look the tragic facts in the face and to do whatever possible to repair the great wrong," Lord Henderson continued. He said he recognized that it is "beyond the capacity of Germany either now or in the future to provide such material indemnification that would be adequate to the crimes committed." Nevertheless, he pointed out, reasonable amends would do much to assuage the bitter recollections of the Jewish people and to pave the way for a new understanding between world Jewry and democratic Germany.

Lord Henderson expressed the hope that the young state of Israel "will thrive economically and culturally as a peaceful democratic country, and that it will provide new opportunities for its people to make their own special contributions to the progress, happiness and well-being of mankind." ISRAEL TO GET EXPERTS FROM INTERNATIONAL LABOR ORGANIZATION; PACT SIGNED IN GENEVA

GENEVA, April 18. (JTA) -- The Government of Israel and the International Labor Organization, specialized organ of the United Nations, have signed an agreement providing for the I.L.O. to supply labor and social insurance experts to assist the Jewish state, it was announced here. Dr. I. Kahany, Israel representative in Geneva, and David Morse, Director-General of the I.L.O., were the signatories.

The experts will be placed at Israel's disposal for a period of six to twelve months, with the U.N. unit paying transportation expenses and salaries of the personnel to and from Israel. The Jewish state will pay the local transportation expenses and the daily living allowances of the experts.

The agreement also provides for Israel to supply a number of candidates for I.L.O. fellowships in foreign countries where the candidates will study new methods of labor and social insurance administration worked out there. The expenses of these men and women will be shared equally by the I.L.C. and the Israel Government.

ISRAEL'S RECLAMATION PROJECT IN HULEH WILL ALSO BENEFIT SYRIA, BRITISH SCHOLAR SAYS

LONDON, April 18. (JTA) -- The importance of the reclamation of the Huleh area for the economic future of Israel was emphasized here last night by Sir Clarmont Skrine, noted British scholar and explorer, speaking before the Royal Geographical Society.

Sir Clarmont, who is a director of the Jerusalem Electric Corporation, analyzed Israel's economic difficulties and expressed certainty that the Jewish state would ultimately succeed in overcoming them. Of the Huleh reclamation scheme, he said: "The project will not only increase the absorptive capacity of Israel, but will also contribute to raise the standard of health of the population on both sides of the marshes which are now being drained--on the Syrian side no less than on the Israeli side."

EXTREMISTS SEEK TO DECLARE PRESENT ISRAELI CABINET "UNLAWFUL"; APPLY TO SUPREME COURT

JERUSALEM, April 18. (JTA) -- Members of Parliament Hillel Kook-Berachon and Eli Jabotinsky today filed an application with the Israeli Supreme Court asking that it issue an order demanding that President Weizmann rule the present Cabinet "unlawful" because it does not enjoy the confidence of Parliament.

The applicants argued that the President had no right to appoint the members of the present Cabinet to serve as a caretaker government until the national elections. The Court has not yet decided whether to consider the applications. Both Kook and Jabotinsky were elected to the Knesset as members of the Herut Party, but recently broke with it and asked Parliament to consider them a separate faction.

HISTADRUT REJECTS PROPOSAL TO INVITE LEFT-WING LABOR DELEGATION TO ISRAEL

TEL AVIV, April 18. (JTA) -- The executive committee of the Histadrut, the Jewish Labor Federation of Israel, voted down a proposal to invite a delegation of the World Federation of Trade Unions to visit Israel. The leftist-controlled federation had requested an invitation to enable its representatives to inquire why the Histadrut had withdrawn from membership in the international body.

The decision not to extend the invitation was taken by a vote of 32 to 16 after a stormy session in which the left-wing Mapai Party members in the committee pressed for the invitation and frequently clashed with the Mapai majority.

BAVARIAN COURT FINDS DR. AUERBACH "ABOVE REPROACH" IN GRANTING RESTITUTION CREDIT

FRANKFURT, April 18. (JTA) -- Dr. Philip Auerbach, former director of the Bavarian State Restitution Office who is now under arrest, was found to be "above reproach" in his handling of credit, it was announced today by Richard Ringelmann, Secretary of State for Bavaria.

The announcement was made following conclusion of a special investigation by the Bavarian Supreme Court of Accounts which established that Dr. Auerbach never advanced any credit without first notifying the Minister of Finance. The investigation also established that most of the loans have been repaid. Whenever Dr. Auerbach discovered forgeries in the credit documents, he himself reported the matter to the proper authorities, the investigators emphasized in their report.

Dr. Auerbach who several days ago made an unsuccessful attempt to commit suicide, was still in the prison hospital today. His lawyer said that Dr. Auerbach was "in a temporary state of depression" when he attempted to take his life.

MAYORS OF MUNICH AND HAMBURG OPPOSE SHOWING OF FILM BY ANTI-SEMITIC PRODUCER

MUNICH, April 18. (JTA) -- The film "Immortal Beloved" produced by the anti-Semitic director Veit Harlan will not be shown in Munich, it was announced here today by Mayor Thomas Wimmer.

Labor unions in Munich announced that their members will hold public demonstrations should the film by the anti-Semitic producer--who also made the notorious anti-Semitic film "Jew Süss" for the Nazis--be shown in any of the city's motion picture houses.

In Hamburg, Mayor Max Brauer declared that he is opposed to showing the "Immortal Beloved" in any of Hamburg's cinemas since its producer, Harlan, is "identified with Nazism and anti-Semitism."

A German court at Schweinfurt today sentenced Erich Boettiger and Otto Giese each to four years imprisonment for the murder of four Jews near the town of Goerlitz, in Silesia, on June 30, 1934. Four other defendants in the same case were acquitted.

CHILD MORTALITY AMONG JEWS DECREASES IN TUNIS; GOVERNMENT LAUDS OSE ACTIVITIES

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- Child mortality among Jews in Tunis decreased considerably last year due to the expansion of activities of the OSE, Jewish health organization, it was reported here today by the American OSE Committee.

The report is based on a letter by the director of the Government Statistical Bureau in Tunis. The letter also stated that a survey conducted by the Tunis municipality established that "the decrease in child mortality among Jews in the city was due exclusively to the medical and child-care activities of the OSE."

CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO JOINS IN SOVIET CAMPAIGN AGAINST ISRAEL; ATTACKS BEN GURION

VIENNA, April 18. (JTA) -- Radio Prague has joined the anti-Israel campaign being conducted by other Communist radio stations. In a "Manifesto to Working People," the Czechoslovak radio strongly criticized the government headed by Premier David Ben Gurion and blamed it for the "flourishing black-market" in the Jewish state.

AMERICAN JEWS TO OBSERVE TODAY THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE REVOLT IN WARSAW GHETTO

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- Five national Jewish organizations today called on American Jews to light six candles tomorrow night to commemorate the 6,000,000 Jews murdered by Nazism in Europe. Tomorrow is the eighth anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising.

The organizations calling for observance of the anniversary are: Jewish Labor Committee; Workmen's Circle; Jewish National Workers Alliance; Yiddish Writers Union; and, World Congress for Jewish Culture.

ANNIVERSARY OF JEWISH UPRISING AGAINST NAZIS IN WARSAW GHETTO OBSERVED IN PARIS

PARIS, April 18. (JTA) -- The anniversary of the Jewish revolt against the Nazi command in the Warsaw ghetto was observed here today at a mass meeting in Lancy Theatre arranged by the Federation of Jewish Societies. The federation is also arranging for tomorrow a special meeting for Jewish youths to commemorate the 6,000,000 Jews annihilated by the Nazis in Europe.

JEWISH STUDENTS AT BERLIN UNIVERSITY TO MARK WARSAW UPRISING ANNIVERSARY

BERLIN, April 18. (JTA) -- The Association of Jewish Students at Berlin University will commemorate the eight anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto uprising at the headquarters of the Berlin Jewish Community. The memorial meeting tomorrow will be addressed by a representative of the rabbinate, a representative of the city's Jewish community and one from the student group.

AMERICAN ZIONIST LABOR GROUP RAISES \$1,000,000 IN NEW YORK FOR ISRAELI BONDS

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- More than \$1,000,000 in cash and pledges for Israeli bonds was raised here today at an intimate gathering of leaders of the Farband, labor Zionist fraternal order, held at Savoy Plaza Hotel and addressed by Golda Myerson, Israel's Minister of Labor.

DR. MORDECAI KAPLAN HONORED ON HIS 70TH BIRTHDAY; HIS ROLE IN JEWISH LIFE CITED

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- Jewish leaders from all walks of life last night honored Dr. Mordecai Kaplan, founder of the Jewish Reconstructionist movement, on the occasion of his 70th birthday, at a dinner at the Waldorf Astoria.

Former Judge Simon H. Rifkind, who was chairman, emphasized the role which Dr. Kaplan played in aiding the development of Jewish culture and education in the United States. A book containing tributes to his career was presented to Dr. Kaplan. Among the congratulatory messages was one from Dr. Chaim Weizmann, President of Israel.

ARIZONA GOVERNOR SIGNS LAW REGULATING THE SALE OF KOSHER MEAT IN THE STATE

TUSCON, Ariz., April 18. (JTA) -- A law regulating the sale of kosher foods was put into effect in Arizona this week following its signature by the Governor.

The law provides penalties for sale of food falsely described as kosher and bans sale of kosher and non-kosher meats in the same store unless the store displays signs stating that both kosher and non-kosher meat are sold and signs are placed over each kind of meat stating whether it is kosher or non kosher.
