ISRAEL SATISFIED WITH U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL'S ACTION ON SYRIAN DISPUTE

IARE SUCCESS, April 18. (JTA) -- The Security Council's decision to defer further consideration of the Israeli-Syrian dispute until after it has heard a report from Major General William E. Riley, U.N. truce chief in Palestine, was welcomed today in Israeli circles as providing an opportunity for settlement of the issues on the local level through the Mixed Armistice Commission.

In U.W. circles it is considered "quite likely" that when the Security Council next meets it will have before it a progress report from Col. Bennet de Ridder, acting truce chief who will chair the meeting of the Mixed Armietice Commission. These same circles believe that if the seport shows that progress is being made on a local level the Council will again defer action.

BRITISH STATESMAN EULOGIZES 60,000 JEWS WHO DIED IN ANTI-MAZI REVOLT IN WARSAW CHETTO

LONDOW, April 18. (JTh) -- The eighth anniversary of the Jewish uprising against supprior Nazi forces in the Warraw Chetto was observed here tonight at a memorial meeting arranged by the World Jewish Congress at which Lord Headerson of the British Foreign Office was one of the principal speakers.

"The 60,000 Jews who died gloriously in the bitter five-week battle in the Warsaw ghatto may seem few in comparison with the total of Jews exterminated by the Mazia in the camps of Oswiecim, Maidamek and Treblinks, but they take an assured place in history as a result of their unparalleled resistance in the face of overwhelming odds," lord Henderson said.

Reviewing in detail the Mazi persecution of Jews, the British statesman said that the Jewish defenders of the Warsaw Abetto gave the world "an example of unparalled heroism that will never be forgotten." It would be inconceivable, he declared, if the German people had no stirrings of conscience "for the dastardly acts of the Third Beich" and if they were without any wish to make such material reparation to the Jews as lay in their power.

There could be no greater reflection upon the new democratic Germany than a refusal to look the tradic facts in the face and to do whatever possible to repair the great ground. He capacity of Germany either now or in the future to provide such material indemnification that would be adequate to the crimes committed. Hevertheless, he pointed out, reasonable amends would do much to assume the bittor recollections of the Jewish people and to pave the way for a new understanding between world Jewry and democratic Germany.

Lord Henderson expressed the hope that the young state of Israel "will thrive economically and culturelly as a peaceful democratic country, and that it will provide new opportunities for its people to make their own special continuitions to the Progress, happiness and well-being of mankind," (See page 4 for more news on the observance in various countries of the anniversary of the Marsaw Abetto revolt.)

ISPARI, TO GET EXPERIS FROM INTERNATIONAL IABOR ORGANIZATION; PACT SIGNED IN COMMA

GRIEVA, April 18. (JIA) -- The Covernment of Israel and the International law Organization, Specialized organ of the United Nations, have sized an agreement prividing for the I.Lob. to supply labor and social insurance experts to assist the legisle state, it was amounced here. Dr. I. Kehany, Israel representative in General and Devid Morse, Director-General of the I.Lob., were the signatories.

The experts will be placed at Israel's disposal for a period of six to tells months, with the U.K. unit paying transportation expenses and salaries of the promel to and from Israel. The Jewish state will pay the local transportation expenses and the daily living allowances of the experts.

The agreement also provides for Israel to supply a number of candidates for I.L.O. fellowships in foreign countries where the candidates will study new methods of labor and social insurance administration worked out there. The expenses of them and women will be shared equally by the I.L.C. and the Israel Covernment.

ISPARL'S RECIAMATION PROJECT IN HUIER WILL ALSO BENEFIT STRIA. BRITISH SCHOLAR SAIS

LANDON, April 18. (JTA) - The importance of the reclamation of the Huleh and for the economic future of Israel was emphasized here last night by Sir Clarant Skrine, noted British scholar and explorer, speaking before the Royal Geographical Society.

JERUSALEM, April 18. (JTA) -- Members of Parliament Hillel Took-Berger and Fri Jabotinsky today filed an application with the Israelli Supreme Court asking that it issue an order demanding that President Weizmann rule the present Cabinet "miastal" because it does not enjoy the confidence of Parliament.

The applicants argued that the President had no right to appoint the member of the present Cabinst to serve as a caretaker government until the national elections. The Court has not yet decided whether to consider the applications. Both Ecol and Jabotinsky were elected to the Enesset as members of the Herut Perty, but recently broke with it and asked Parliament to consider them a segmental faction.

HISTADRUT REJECTS PROPOSAL TO INVITE LEFT-WING LABOR DELECATION TO ISRAEL

TEL AVIV, April 18. (JTA) - The executive committee of the Histadrut, the letiah Labor Federation of Israel, roted down a proposal to invite a delegation of the World Federation of Trade Unions to visit Israel. The leftist-controlled federation had requested an invitation to enable its representatives to inquire why the Histania had withdrawn from membership in the international body.

The decision not to extend the invitation was taken by a vote of 32 to 16 steral a stormy session in which the left-wing Magam Party members in the committee present for the invitation and frequently clashed with the Magai majority.

BAVARIAN COURT FINDS DR. AUERBACH "ABOVE REPROACH" IN GRANTING RESTITUTION CREDIT

FRANKFURT, April 18. (JTA) - Dr. Fhilip Amerbach, former director of the Bavarian State Restitution Office who is now under arrest, was found to be "above repreach" in his handling of credit, it was announced today by Richard Ringelmann, Secretary of State for Bavaria.

The announcement was made following conclusion of a special investigation by the Bavarian Supreme Court of Accounts which established that Dr. Auerbach never advanced any credit without first notifying the Minister of Finance. The investigation also established that most of the loans have been repaid. Whenever Dr. Auerbach discovered forgeries in the credit documents, he himself reported the matter to the proper authorities, the investigators emphasized in their report.

Pr. Auerbach who beweral days ago made an unsuccessful attempt to commit suicide, was still in the prison hospital today. His lawyer said that Dr. Auerbach was "in a temporary state of depression" when he attempted to take his life.

MAYORS OF MUNICH AND HAMBURG OPPOSE SHOWING OF FILM BY ANTI-SEMITIC PRODUCER

MINICE, April 18. (JTA) -- The film "Immortal Beloved" produced by the anti-Semitic director Veit Earlan will not be shown in Munich, it was announced here today by Mayor Thomas Wimmer.

Labor unions in Munich amounced that their members will hold public demonstrations should the film by the anti-Semitic producer—who also made the notorious anti-Semitic film "Jew Suess" for the Nazis—be shown in any of the city's motion picture houses.

In Hamburg, Mayor Mar Brauer declared that he is opposed to showing the "Immortal Beloved" in any of Hamburg's cinemas since its producer, Harlan, is "identified with Natism and anti-Semitism."

A German court at Schweinfurt today sentenced Erich Boettiger and Otto Gesse each to four years imprisonment for the murder of four Jews near the town of Goerlets, in Silesia, on June 30, 1934. Four other defendants in the same case were acquitted.

CETTO MORTALITY AMONG JESS DECREASES IN TUNIS; GOVERNMENT LAUDS OSE ACTIVITIES

MEM TORK, April 18. (JTA) -- Child mortality among Jews in Tunis decreased considerably last year due to the expansion of activities of the CSE, Jewish health ormanization, it was reported here today by the American OSE Committee.

The report is based on a letter by the director of the Government Statistical Bureau in Timits. The letter also stated that a survey conducted by the Timis municipality established that "the decrease in child mortality among Joses in the city was due exclusively to the medical and child-care activities of the OSE."

CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO JOINS IN SOVIET CAMPAINA AGAINST ISBABL; ATTACKS HEN GURION

VIRNNA, April 18. (JTA) -- Recio Fracue has joined the anti-Israel campaign being conducted by other Communist radio stations. In a "Manifesto to Norking Boopele," the Czechoslovak radio stronely criticized the covernment headed by Fremier David Ben Gurion and blamed it for the "florrightme black market" in the Jeviel state.
