BEN GURION WELCOMED IN DETROIT; CROWD OF 10,000 CHEERS HIM IN FRONT OF CITY HALL,

DEFROIT, May 21. (JTA) -- Israel Premier David Ben Gurior rejeived the welcem of the City for Datroit today at a civic reception at the City Hell. A crowd estimated at 10,000 mave him a tremendous ovation when he was presented by Soldon B. Deume, chairman of Detroit's 250th Birthday Festival, who presided at today's function.

The speakers, who included Govornor G. Monnon Williams of Michigan, and Mayor Albert Cobo of Detroit, as well as the Frime Minister, commented on the fact that the 250th anniversary of the founding of this city coincides with the third anniversary of the proclemation of Israel. Mr. D. nume presented to Mr. Ben Gurion, as a momento of his visit, a special medallion on the Detroit anniversary.

The speakers welcomed the Israeli leader and expressed confidence in Israel as a democratic bulwark in the Middle East. They declared that through such leadership as Mr. Ben Gurion gave, Israel would prosper and develop as a democratic state. In a brief reply the Premier expressed thanks for the welcome and gratitude for the friendship the people of Detroit showed to the people of Israel. He declared that Israel would survive and would be a democratic conter in the Middle East.

American Flag Presented by U.S. Military Color Guard

An American military color quard presented the American flag and a color ward of Iercell weterens living in Detroit presented the blue-white flag of Israel while the Detroit Fire Department Band played the Star Spangled Banner and the Hatikveh Emdreds of people broke through the police lines to shake the Premier's hand. He smiled and shook hands with many of them.

The weather today was hot and clear in sharp contrast to the torrontial reinstorm last night when the Promier flow in to Willow Run airport from Chicago. About a thousand people braved the storm to great Ben Gurion at the airport where a United States Air Force bend played the Star Spannled Banner and the Hetikwah and the Premier was welcomed to the city by Mar Canos, chairman of the Detroit bond committee. The Party proceeded to a Detroit hotel in an escowted 25-car motorcade.

At a press conference last night, the Premier expressed the hope that two Detroit-style industrial centers would be established in Icreel-at Elath and at Raife. This scening Mr. Ben Gurion, escented by Körar Kaiser, president of the Kaiser-Frazer Company, visited the company's Willow Run plant. He expressed special interest in the mass production methods employed, particularly in the conveyor system. In the afternoon, after the civic reception, Mr. Ben Gurion went to the Ford Motor Company where he was lunched meast of Homey Ford II.

Before Mr. Ben Carrion's arrival, the Detroit City Council adopted a resolution calling on the city's population to support the Israel Bond Issue. The Covernor and Mayor issued pro: Lamations naming today "Michiran Day for the State of Israel Independence" and "Ben Gurior Day,"

STORMY DEBATE OPENS IN ISPAEL PARLIAMENT OVER ARREST OF RELIGIOUS UNDERGROUND MEMBERS

JERUSALEM, May 21. (JTA) - A stormy debate on the errest and detention of more than a score of ultre-orthodox members of the underground Brit Emain which was smashed last week as it prepared to both the inceset, act under way today as the major opposition parties in the Parliament demanded the rejeal of the emergency defense laws under which the arrested underground members are being hold in detention camps. The first demand for repeal of the legislation was voiced by Rubbi Mordocai Murock, Religious Bloc deputy.

Be was arswered by Acting Premier Moshe Sharett who said that the government had applied the emergency laws "fully conscious of the gravity of the acts, and also fully conscious of the external and internal difficulties facing Israel. We were faced by a sorious conspiracy exainst the state," he continued, "therefore we were compelled to use all the laws within our power." He vicorously denied a charge by Rebbi Murcck that any of the detained men had been "tortured" by the police, asserting that the police used force "with bitterness and abborrence."

Mapam deputy Hane Rubin, who followed the Acting Pennier, seconded the motion to repeal the emergency defense laws, although he stressed that the left-wing Socialists will "vigorously fight example Religious domination" of the state. Right-wing Horut leader Menahem Beigin, who followed Rubin, bitterly attacked Mr. Sharott, charging that he "committed an act of terror by arresting people without any proof of their guils. You opened a detention camp in Israel," he accused the Premier, "you had no right to detain people in such a menner."

AMERICAN AGUDATH ISRAEL APPEALS FOR REIMASE OF AGUDISTS ARRESTED IN JERUSALEM PLOT

NEW YORK, May 21. (JTA) -- The Aradath Israel Committation of America today cabled President Chaim Metzmann of Israel and Acting Premior Meshe Sharett asking for the release of three leaders of the Amidist youth committation in Jerusalom arrosted last week in connection with the alleged plot to bomb the building of the Israeli Parliamont.

The three men arrested are: Rabbi Shlomo Lorentz, Israel Shadmi and Shimron Siroka. They have pleaded innocent, but are nevertholess denied the right to be wisted by an attorney, the Asudath Israel cable claimed. The Orthodox commization termed the detention of the three Asudate "a frame-up" simed at discrediting religious Jowe in advance of the forthcoming parliamentary elections in Israel.

DAVID NILES, ADVISER TO PRESIDENT TRUMAN, RESIGNS WHITE HOUSE POST; MAY VISIT ISRAEL

WASHINGTON, May 21. (JTA) -- David R. Niles, who served in the White House for 15 years, today announced his resignation as administrative assistant to Precident Truman and said that he is anxious to visit the State of Israel as a private citizen. The resignation, effective May 31, was due to the fact that Mr. Niles is "physically very tired."

Mr. Miles served as White House specialist on minority problems and advised the President on matters pertaining to Jows and other minorities. In accepting the resimation, President Truman told Mr. Miles in a letter: "You have been a town of strength to me during the peat six yeers and I cannot tell you how much I appreciate it. I regret very much that conditions are such that you feel you must have a free lay-off--that is the only reason in the world why I am accepting your resignation."

TRIAL OF FORMER HEAD OF RESTITUTION OFFICE IN BAVARIA WILL OPEN THIS MONTH

MUNIUE, May 21. (JTA) -- The trial of Dr. Philip Auerbach, former head of the Restitution Office of Bavaria, will open here at the end of this month, it was amnounced today by Bavarian Premier Hans Ehard.

Dr. Amerbach, who was arrested several months and after coming under attack by political opponents in the provincial purliament, is being held on charges of fraud in the operation of his office, the acceptance of bribes, and mistreatment of fellow prisoners in the Osweicim camp during the Mari routine. The manner is which his case has been publicized - to the detriment of the Jewish community - has been protested by German Jows and German liberals.

Dr. George Shueter, American High Commissioner for Bevaria, last Friday called for a speedy trial for Dr. Ausrhach, so that lustrach could be adven an opportunity to defend himself. The present situation, the U.S. Commissioner said, is siving rise to all sorts of rumors and provides ammunition for anti-democratic elements. The public, he said, was entitled to know the facts and the vesults of judical investigations into the resitution office. The American officials said that while Ausrhach's conduct of the restitution office had left much to be desired, what Auerbach had done in the nature of restitution and indomnification for Nazi persocutees should not be underestimated.

Immediately after Dr. Shuster's statement, the public prosecutor's office released the second part of the accusation against Auerbech. This charged him with fraud, brickery and faithlessness to his office, accused him of preferential treatment to personal friends in extending credits and of maintaining bookkeeping and administrative methods not in accordance with State regulations.

BOARD OF JEWISH DEPUTIES IN LONDON SEEKS TO ESTABLISH UNITY IN COMMUNAL LIFE

LOWDON, May 21. (JTA) -- Progress toward healing a two-year-old split within the Board of Deputies of British Jews by the withdrawal of the Sephardic and Reform communities was revealed here today when the Board ratified an anvesment providing for the return of the Spanish and Fortunaes Synapogues.

Action on the agreement with the Liberal Reform movement was held up, pending clarification of several religious principles. Dr. Abraham Cohen, who became president of the Beard following the resimation of Prof. Solis Brodetsky who want to Israel to head the Hebrew University, has been active in bringing about a healing of the breach. He pleaded for unity today, pointing out that the resurrence of Nazism in Germany must be met by the strongest possible Jewish front.

A report by the Board's foreign affairs committee revealed that the British Government has pledged not to force the emigration of any Iraqi Jews now in Britain as long as present conditions continue in Iraq. With regard to Germany, the Board adopted the following resolution:

"The Board of Deputies of British Jews notes with concern the widespread and despreade character of Wazism in Germany, as demonstrated by the success in the resent Lower Sexony Parliamentary elections of the Socialist Rei hepertel, which is modelled on the methods and spirit of Hitler's Wazi party. The Board urvee His Majesty's Government to take immediate steps in view of the cutlawing of parties and movement in Germany which aim to destroy the democratic way of life, and which are likely to initiate a new waye of religious and recial discrimination and prove a manage to the peace of the world."
