BEN GURION GETS IMPRESSIVE VELSOME IN LOS ANGELES; 22,000 CROWD HOLLMHOOD BOWL

LOS ANGELES, May 24. (JTA) -- An impressive City Hall welcome was given this morning to Israel's Premier David Ben Gurien who arrived here yesterday and was mot at the International Airport by hundreds of people and by a squadron of the U.S. Air Force. More than 22,000 people crowded into the Hellywood Bowl tenicht to hear Mr. Ben Gurien appeal for support of the Israeli Bond Israe.

American and Israeli flows were flown side by side along the streets of the city through which the notoreade proceeded to City Eall Stirred by the reception, Mr. Eun Gurion said that he was happy to visit California which, he pointed out, is similar to Israel in climate and other respects.

While flying over Arizona, the Israeli Promier declared that he was envious that the United States could afford to maintain such a "wenderful desert." Israel, he said, also has desert land but must concentrate on developing it into fartile seil in order to absorb the thousands of Jows who flee to the Jewish state from lands of oppression.

Millions of Dollars To Be Presented To Ben Gurion at Chicago U.J.A. Conference

CHICAGO, May 24. (JTA) -- Millions of dellars in each will be presented to Israel's Prime Minister Devid Bon Gurion by hundred of Jowish community leaders at a two-day national conference of the United Jowish Appeal which will take place this work-and at the Palmer House here, it was announced today.

It is expected that the cash presentation to Mr. Ben Gurien will twrr into one of the mastest demonstrations of American Jewry's concern for the State of Israel. The contributions are to be spent in Israel for the settlement of immirrants and the development of the country.

The conference, which will open on Saturday evening, will be addressed by the Israell Premier and by other members of the Israell Cabinet new visiting the United States. Among the principal speakers will be Vice-President Alben W. Barkley. The conference will map plans for further stops in the United Jowish Appeal campairm and will be attended by more than 1,000 leaders from Jowish communities in 10 states.

Loading spoakors at the parley will include Edward M.M. Warburg, U.J.A. general chairman; Dr. Mahum Goldmann, chairman of the American section of the Jewich Arency; William Resenwald and Rudelf G. Sennebern, national co-chairman of the United Jewich Appeal; and Julian Freeman, president of the Council of Jewish Federation and Wolfare Funds.

ISRAEL RESUMES DRAINAGE OF HULEH SWAMPS IN DON-DISPUTED AREA; CEASE-FIRE PACT EXPECTED

TEL AVIV, May 24. (JTA) -- Israel today resumed drainage of the Huleh evemps in the area which is not disputed by Arab Landowners. Yesterday it suspended the work on seven acros of disputed land.

MIXED ARMISTICE COMMISSION TAKES STEPS TO PREVENT FURTHER ISRAEL-JORDAN CLASHES

JETUSALEM, May 24. (JTA) -- A mooting of the Israel-Jordan Armistice Commission took place today near the village of Duweite where Israel and Jordan armed forces or change fire yearcay for several hours. The mooting discussed the clash and accided to send members of the armistice commission to the scene and to establish higher control of the Israel-Jordan demarkation line.

Israel military authorities today denied a report from Amman, capital of Jordan, that six Israeli soldiers were killed during the fight with Jordan Mational Guardsmon. An official communique issued here revealed the following facts:

On May 22nd, ar Israeli military patrol was fired upon by Arabs crossing into Israeli torritory with their flocks near Duweita. A short time later, elements of the Jordan Mational Guard also crossed the border and occupied four heights inside Israeli torritory. They fired at Jowish troops with small arms and morters but were driven off by the Israeli forces.

The next day, Jordan Fational Guard forces reappeared on the score accompanied by three amored cars of the Arab Larion. They beam shalling the Israeli position. Firing continued for 15 hours. During the clash two Israeli soldiers were eligibly woulded while the Jordanians suffered serious losses.

HEARINGS ON JERUSALEM BOMB PLOT OPENS; COURT ORDERS LEADERS HELD ANOTHER WEE

JERUSALEM, May 24. (JTA) -- A series of charges exainst four leaders of Brit Kenaim, the underground Orthodor group in Jorusalem, was presented today by the Assistant State Attorney before the Chief Maxistrate here, who erdered that the four be deterined for another eight days in order to enable the police authorities to complete their investigations.

Moanwhile, the Cabinet today appointed a three-man committee consisting of Ministers Pinchus Laven, Pinchus Resen and Mosho Shapiro to investigate the Circumstances surrounding the detention of the underground members, Minister of Police Boher Shetreet was instructed to investigate complaints that police mistracted some of the arrested men. A government spekesman revealed that one police correct has been suspended and faces disciplinary action on charges of having maltreated a prisoner.

The charges presented thus far claim that the Brit Engin arous planned to break into the Ministry of Defense and destroy all material concerning the mobilization of religious wemen. The four leaders of the underfround erganization are also charged with conspiracy exainst the state by planning to prevent a discussion in Farliament on the mobilization bill by throwing a bomb into the Farliament building.

The indictment contains mine other charges, including one of possession of erms and of training with erms. The four leaders are: Mordeca Alichu Salman, Eliahu Erful, Yehuda Ridder and Neah Mormessor. They are between 20 and 25 years of age. Four members of the Agudath Israel youth ersenization who had been held as suspects were released last night by the police.

Loibelo Weissfish, leader of the extreme Orthodox Neturei Karta among which does not recognize the Jovish State on the grounds that the Messiah alone can re-establish the Jovish state, was today sentenced to six member imprisonment for crossing into Jordan in order to evoid conscription into the Israel Army.

Government Has More Evidence Then It Presented, Spokesman Says

The Iercal Government has more evidence against the members of Brit Kinnin, the underground movement which planned to blow up the Parliament building, than it cares to make public, a government spokesman today said. Answering Parliamentery and other critics of the government's headling of the case, the spokesman said that today's open court hearings of charges against some of the leaders of the group had proved that neverment had not "exagerated" the activities of the religious underground.

A libel suit against the Minister would require the weiver of his parliamantary immunity, which is unlikely to be granted.

BONN, May 24. (JTA) -- Two high officials of the United Nations Human Rights Commission were invited today by the West Gorman Federal Government to come to Benn to discuss compensation for the victims of "medical experiments" in Mazi concentration

The monument boars the inscription: "May present and future momerations always remember that regial hatrod plumaes humanity into the december misery. From 1933 to 1945 over 5,000 Jows of this city-mon, we man and children's foll victims to the murdorous instincts of the Mazi flonds."

ITALIAN PREMIER EXPLAINS HIS ANTI-JEWISH HEMARKS; SAYS HE IS FRIENDLY TO JENS

ROME, May 2h. (JTA) -- Fromior do Grapori today assured Dr. Hafael Cantoni, president of the Union of Jowish Communities in Italy, that he is "friendly to all Jowish problems" and that there is no recound to consider him as unfriendly to days.

The statement was made in view of the concern expressed in Joyish circles over the Promier's remerks during an election speech in Florence, in which he denounced "persons professing other religious, particularly the Israelites whe insist on preaching to us the true meaning of Christian nespel." The Premier also had said during his Florence speech: "We Christians nove decemt of interpreting Jawish Law in its relation to the political and social attitudes of these professing the Joyish faith."

In his statement to Mr. Cantoni, Premier do Gaspori emphasized that his remark in Florence were addressed "only to Joviah members of Parliament who are in the opposition (Independent Regulicans and Communists)" who tried to prove that the policy of the Christian Democrats was in contradiction to the Gospel.

FEDERATION OF JEWISH MEN'S CHUBS OPENS CONVENTION; DISCUSSES VARIOUS PROBLEM

PARKSVILLE, N.Y., May 24. (JTA) -- Problems of adult Jewish education, changes in ritual, synagorus attendance and youth activities will be discussed at the 22nd enmual convention of the Mational Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs which opened here today. The delegates, representing over 150 Conservative congregations, will continue their deliberations through May 27.

Addressing the opening session, Rabbi Jacob B. Agus of Baltimore said that the progressive reassertion must most the challenge of Lending guidence and stimulation to the progressive reassertion of Judaism. "We need Chalutzim in America," he declared, stating that Judaism needs lay men and women who are william to serve as pieneous of "a full-blooded and truly spiritual pattern of life." He pointed to the State of Israel as an example of the Jovish will to live and create a new culture "in the noble spirit of our horitage."

POLICE DISCONTINUE FUBLICIZING RELIGIOUS FAITH OF CRIMINAIS IN "WANTED" CIRCUIARS

NEW YORK, May 24. (JTA) -- A request by the Anti-Defamation Learne of B'nai B'rith that police departments discontinue publicating the religious faith of triminal funitives in "Wanted" virculars is meeting with the wholehearted cooperation of the nation's police chiefs, Denjamin R. Epstein, A.D.L. national director, reported here.
