ISRAEL RESUMES DRAINAGE OF HULES SWAMES; ACTS WITH CONSENT OF U.N. AUTHORITIES

JERUSALEM. Juno 11. (JTA) -- Israel today resumed work on the Huloh swamp drainago project in the Israeli section of the demilitarized zone, in accordance with a docision of the United Nations authorities here, announced during the weekond by Gon. William E. Riloy, U.N. Chiof of Staff. No incidents were reported.

Gen. Riley also armounced that he will continue investigations with a view to concluding arrangements with the Arab ewners of the seven-acros of land affected by the drainage project to accept compensation or exchange their present holdings for other land in the demilitarized zone. If agreement with the Arab landowners cannot be reached, Gon. Riley may find it necessary to seek further instructions from the U.N. Socurity Council.

The Arab newspaper Adifaa, published in the Arab-hold Old City of Jorusalon, today reported that the Syrian Government sent a telegram to its representative at the United Nations in New York instructing him to protest the decision authorising Israel to resume work in the Jewish section of the Hulch area. The report said that the Syrian representative was ordered to inform the United Nations that his government does not accept the decision.

Officials of the U.N. truce commission, meanwhile, today continued interviewing Arebs transforred out of the demilitarized zene in the Huleh area by the Israel Government, to ascortain whother they wish to return to their fermer homes. The intorvious are being conducted without the presence of Israel Army or police officors. The Israel Government has agreed to this procedure.

American Officer Designated Chairman of Mixed Armistice Commission

Gon. Rilay today designated Col. Samuel G. Taxis, an American, as chairman of the Syrian-Israeli Mixed Armistice Commission. He announced the appointment after consultations with officials of the Governments of Israel and Syria. Col. Taxis replaces the French chairman of the Armistice Commission whose handling of the Syrian-Israeli dispute was bittorly criticized by the Israelis.

It was also announced by the U.N. Truce Commission today that after more than 34 years of sorvice, Gon. Riley has, at his request, been placed on the retired list of the United States Marine Corps. He was retired with the reak of Lioutonant-Gonoral, but is subject to recall to active duty by the President. At the same time. he will continue in his present post of U.N. Chief of Staff.

U.N. hoadquartors horo announced that Holyer Anderson, director of the Palestine Conciliation Commission's Rofuzoo Offico, arrived today in Boirut, one of the first stops in his courtosy trip which will bring him into porsonal contact with the highest ranking government officials and with United Nations organs in the Middlo Bast.

MERGER OF PROGRESSIVES WITH GENERAL ZIONISTS IN ISRAEL URGED BY ZIONIST GROUPS

NEW YORK, June 11. (JTA) -- Nine major Zienist erganizations in various parts of the world today issued a joint call, insisting upon the unification of the Progressive Party with the General Zienists in Israel. The statement was issued on the initiative of the Zienist Organization of Camada and the Zienist Organization of America. Among the other organizations which have joined in this action so the Zienist Coganizations of Amstralia, South Africa, Brazil, Moxico, Chili, Belgium and France. The signaturies include the heads of all nine organizations and delegates to the forthcoming Zienist Congress.

"The unification of both wings of General Zienism in Palestine In 1946 was a constructive step which paved the way for the formation of the World Confederation of General Zienists and the catablishment of its constructive fund later in the year," the appeal says. "The united front functioned with a measure of success at the Basic Congress, and in the period which followed, helped to provide leadership and direction to the whole Zienist Movement. The subsequent rift in Israel, the emergence of two rival parties and its repercussions electher, has seriously importibed those gains, creating an internal problem for General Zienists throughout the world."

Pointing out that the official platforms of the two groups are substantially identical, the appeal says, "it is generally conceded that their differences have been of a tactical rather than ideological character; but such differences exist within most parties and do not necessarily lead to their disruption. It appears to us that objectively considered, the present moment is most projitious to bring about that union of forces in Israel so long and erdently desired by the great majority of General Zioniets throughout the world."

TRAG GOVERNMENT RESTRICTS MOVEMENTS OF JEWS WHO INTEND TO PENA IN IN THE COUNTRY

LUNDON, June 11. (JTA) -- Restrictions on the movements of 20,000 Iraqi Jows who have not reneunced their Iraqi nationality and intend to remain in that country were amounted by the Iraqi Ministry of the Interior, according to information received here today.

Brmission for those Jows to travel abroad will be granted for medical treatment, for business reasons, for study or holiday. Vecationers will not be allowed to spend more than three menths outside the country under penalty of less of their nationality.

LING-DESIGNATE OF LYBIA MEETS WITH ACTIVE CHIEF RABBI OF TRIPOLISSWED KNYON.

U.S. COMMISSIONER IN BAVARIA URGES AUTHORITIES TO SETTLE WITH JEWISH GROUP

MANICH, June 11. (JTA) -- Dr. Goorgo Shuster, American Commissioner for Ravaria, today urgod Bavarian authorition to reach a settlement as soon as possible with the Jowish Restitution Successor Cracmization on payments for heirloss Jowish property. The JTSO has asked for 25,000,000 Gorman marks while the Bavarian Government has countered with an effect of 15,000,000 marks. Dr. Shuster, former president of Hunter College in New York, recommended that the figure be 20,000,-000 Dautschmarks.

Addressing a press conference, the American official criticized the "standstill in compensating the persocutees." He added that an international lean of 40,000,000 marks would aid greatly in paying the claims of persocutees living outside Germany. Franz Edwalek, head of the Bayarian indomification office, told the Jowish Tolographic Aconcy that the budget for next year provides for only 8,000,000 marks for restitution. He added that he would seek to obtain a greater appropriation and that if he failed, he would resign.

The Bavarian Senate appealed to Federal German authorities to extend proferential treatment to the restitution claims of victims of Mazism who are more than 60 years of an and also to those who have been permanently disabled as a result of their suffering in Mazi concentration camps.

One deputy charged that of 100,000 compensation claims filed to date, only 12,000 have been processed. Dr. J. Spanier, newly-elected matter of the Evarian Sonate, declared that "if Evaria cannot meet its obligations under the restitution law, it would call on the Federal Government to provide the necessary funds."

AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE UNGES U.S. SO SUPPORT BERKEL'S CIAIM OF REPARATIONS

NEW YORK, June 11. (JTA) -- The United States Government was unused yesterday by American Jowish Committee to suppirt the claim of the Government of Israel for one and a half billion dellars in reparations from Gormany "on the ground that these acts of the Gorman State were the direct cause of Israel's enemous expenditure in receiving and rehabilitating nearly 500,000 Jows who seemed the Nazi generate."

In a lotter to Secretary of State Dean Acheson, Jacob Blaustein, president of the American Jovish Counttoe, declared that the entire economy of Israel has had to be genered to the absorption of those immigrants at great hardship to the community which they joined. "Since Germany is responsible for this expenditure by Israel and for the sacrifices which the people of Israel have had to make, it is proper that Germany make good, at least in a financial way, the damage it has caused." Mr. Blaustein pointed out.

SOVIET AUTHORITIES IN BERLIN AGREE TO RETURN COMMUNAL PROPERTY TO JEWISH COMMUNITY
