## RILEY HULES ARMISTICE COMMISSION HAS NO JURISDICTION IN ECYPTIAN BLOCKADE OF SURZ

TEL AVIV, June 12. (JTA) -- United Nations truce supervisor Maj. Gen. William E. Raybidan point of view that the Impalia Expytian Mixed Arminito Commission has no jurisdiction in the matter of Eryptian blockade of the Sucz Canel to Israel-bound shipping. Gen. Riley ruled that the matter must be referred to a higher authority, either the U.N. Security Council or the International Court of Justice at The Hamue.

In his ruling, as chairman of a special mixed commission which superseded the Mixed Armistico Commission, Gon. Riley appealed to the Eryptian Government to end its blockade against Israel "since such acts can only be construed as inconsistent to the spirit of the armistice agreement." However, he pointed out that due to the logal technicality that such a problem is not provided for in the armistice pact he must "yote with Egypt that the Mixed Armistice Commission has no right to domand of the Egyptian Government that it not interfere with the passage of goods to Israel through the Sucz Canal."

The special committee met today to consider an Exprian appeal from an earlier ruling by the Mixed Armistice Commission searching its jurisdiction over the Succeed Depolation. The appeal was under consideration for many months while the U.N. Logal Department studied the problem and drafted an epinion of the logal issues involved. Con. Riley's vote was east, prosumably, on the basis of the Logal Department's opinion.

## Israoli Dologato Hits Riley Stend as Inconsistent

Gon. Riloy's docision was described as "nozative and disappointing" by Shabetai Resonno, lozal advisor of the Foredam Ministry, who was one of the sizuatories of the armistic pact and who attonde today's mooting. He instated that the U.N. official's attitude seemed "inconsistent" -- on one hand he condemned the blockade as an aggressive, heatile act, while on the other hand, he voted with the Exyptians on the basis of a logal technicality.

Mr. Rosonno referred to an earlier interpretation of Acting U.N. Mediator Ralph J. Buncho that free traffic through the Suoz Canal constituted one of the Principal aims of the namistice agreement. Be announced the fact that Isrcal will shortly publish its views on today's decision, and expressed the opinion that Isrcal will take the matter to the Socurity Council, which may subsequently seek a lexal opinion from the International Court of Justice.

### BEN GURION BLAMES U.S. FOR UNITED NATIONS! ORDER TO CHASE OPERATIONS ON HULEH

JERUSALEM, June 12. (JTM) -- The United States bears the greatest part of the responsibility for the United Nations Security Council's resolution ordering Israel to case drainage operations in the disputed area of the Huleh swamp, Framier David Ben Gurion doclared here today at his first pross conference since his return from a three-week tour off the United States. Es blamed the resolution on America's "unjustified" conciliatory policy toward the Arabs.

He reported that he had not discussed the Huleh project when he conferred with some tarry of State Dean Acheson in Washington. He added, however, that the work would go on. The world already understands the impossibility of the return of the areb refuseds to Israel, he asserted, but "it still insists that we pay them componential."

Commonting on the Zionist movement, particularly in the U.S., Mr. Ben Gurion and the movement could grow and be strongthoned provided its members devote themes alones to "more constructive upbuilding of Eracal," rether than to "indulgance" in party differences in Israel. The Premier was given the "freeder of the city" of Jordalam yesterday at a coromony at which Mayor S.Z. Shragai lauded Mr. Ben Gurion's contributions to making Jorgalom the capital of Israel.

#### Syria Protosts To U.N. Against Israel's Rosumption of work in Hulch

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Juno 12. (JTA) -- The United Nations Security Council received a Syrian protest today on resumption of Israeli work on the Haloh drainage project. Syria's U.N. delegate, Faris of Khoury, protested to the Council that the U.N.'s truce supervisor, Maj. Gen. William E. Miley, had exceeded his authority in permitting the Israelis to resume work on Jovish-ewned land. The Syrian representative insisted that an agreement between Israel and Syria must proceed any resumption of the drainage project, adding that a place-meal approach to an coverall solution of the dispute would projudice a full and fair sottlement. He contended that the Chief of Staff should seek such an everall sottlement and if he failed to achieve it should obtain further instructions from the Security Council.

#### BLAUSTEIN DISCUSSES ISRAELI MEEDS AT STATE DEPAREMENT; RAISES GRANT-IN-AID FROBLEM

WASHINGTON, June 12: (JTA) -- Middlo Eastern questions were discussed yesterday in an hour-long moeting between Assistant Secretary of State George C. McChee, in there of Middlo Eastern Agfairs, and Jacob Elaustein, president of the American Jevish Committee, it was disclosed today. Subjects discussed in the moeting, it was learned, included steps to ensure peace in the entire Middlo East, grants-in-aid to Israel, the Israeli-Syrian dispute over the Euleh reclamation project and the plight of the Jows of Trae.

# RELIGIOUS JENS MARKED AS"CIASS FIVE" CITIZENS IN HUNCARY; ARE SENT TO INTERNMENT CAME

IONDOW, Juno 12. (JTM) -- Rollinious Jovs are included in a category of "Class Five" citizens currently being rounded up in Hungary's main cities and being sent to interment camps, according to a report received here from Budapost.

Others included in the "Class Five" category are: "exploiters," "enemies of the pocyle," "Mostern minded" Protestants, and Roman Cathelle pricets, the report stated. The man said to be responsible for the decree, Dr. Bela Szanthe, is reported to have died suddenly leat wook.

The towns in which "Class Five" citizens have been rounded up thus far include: Budapost, Miskelez, Szened, Gyer and Debreczen. It is believed that the decision to incurcerate these people was taken suddenly because the interment camps are apparently unprepared to handle them and the new arrivals are not provided with the bare necessities of life.

#### FRENCH NEWSPAPER ATTACKS JEWS; PRESIDENT AURIOL SPONSORS MEMORIAL FOR JEWISH MARPYRS

PARIS; Juno 12. (JTA) -- A victors attack on Jows appears in the current issue of Hivarol, a nowspaper supporting former Marshal Philippo Potein, now serving a life sentence for treason to France during the Mazi occupation. The paper says that the Alliance Israelite Universelle, leading French Jowish expansion is working for the achievement of Jowish world domination. The paper also defends the Nazis, declaring that "the Hitler regime killed only 1,500,000 Jows, not six million."

President Vincent Auriel has agreed to spensor a monorial for the 6,000,000 Jovs who died during the Mazi regime, it was amounted today. The memorial will be drected in the heart of Paris by the Jowish Documentation Center. President Auriel told the delocation which requested his spensorship that his deeper sympathy has always one out to Jowry for its suffering during the occupation.

A number of Jowish graves in the cometery at Begnour, near Paris, were reported today to have been described. The Union of Jowish Societies is taking the matter up with the authorities and is asking for a thorough police investigation.

#### ELECTIONS IN AUSTRALIA INDICATE HOSTILITY TOWARD ADMISSION OF GERMAN IMMIGRANTS

MBLBOURNE, June 12. (JTA) - The recent Australian general elections have demonstrated that there is a marked hostility in the Dominion against the government plan to admit large murbors of Volkedoutsche innigents, the Jowish Council for Compatting Fascism and Anti-Souttier declared in a statement issued here.

The Council pointed out that while a small number of the Nationalist candidates openly supported the Holt Plan for the admission of 100,000 German immigrants in the next four years, most candidates shunned the subject in public statement or debate. The Council also stated that the attempt to smear candidates who opposed the immigration plan with enti-Senitic propegands had failed.

The Molbourne Jowish Council to Combat Fascism and Anti-Semitism has accided to send a delemation of four to attend the forthcoming Youth Festival at Berlin, it was learned here today.

# U.S. MILITARY LEADERS ENDORSE B'NAI B'RITH PROGRAM FOR MEN AND WOMEN IN ARMED FORCES

WASHINGTON, June 12. (JTA) -- Top military landers of the United States, headed by General George C. Marshall, Secretary of Defense, paid tribute to the reorganized Fini Birith service program for the men and women in the armed forces and the disabled votorens in hespitals, it was revealed here today.

General Marshall, in a statement, said: "I was glad to learn that B'nai B'rith, through its National Service Counittee for the Armed Forces and Veterans, has resumed its programs of religious, recreational, and personal services for the benefit of the mon and women in our armed force. In World Mar II similar services of B'nai B'rith wen the praise of the men and women in uniform, and gained official citations and recognition both of the Army and the Navy. I feel confident that the same high standard of Service so characteristic of B'nai B'rith will be maintained during the present successor."

Other letters of indersement came from Frank Rate, Secretary of the Army; Francis P, Matthews, Secretary of the Navy; Thomas K. Finletter, Secretary of the Air Force; Maj. Gen. Lowis B. Horshey, Director of Selective Service; Maj. Gen. Carl R. Gray, Jr., Administrator of Veterans Affairs, and Millard Celevell, Administrator of the Federal Civil Defense Administration. Frank Geldman, president of B' nai B'rith, communiting on the statement of General Marshall and the other severment leaders, declared that the B'nai B'rith men and women would be stimulated to greater efforts during the matienal emergency.

#### EXPERT OF U.S. BUREAU OF MINES GOES TO ISRAEL TO INVESTIGATE MINERAL RESOURCES

WASHINGTON, June 12. (JTA) -- Secretary of Interior Oscar Charman announced today that George M. Potter, a metallurgical engineer of the U.S. Bureau of Mines, is on his way to fol Ayiv to conduct a proliminary investigation to determine the feasibility of mineral resources development projects.

Mr. Pottor, the first Interior Department expert to so to Israel under the Point Four program, will study several minerals projects, including research on bituminous limestome, establishment of an ere dressing laboratory, and development of the potach industry. Mr. Potter's work will be financed jointly by the Technical Cooperation Administration, Department of State, and the Israel Government.

## TRUMAN NAMES JEWISH WOMAN TO FEDERAL BENCH; FIRST U.S. WOMAN JUDGE IN NEW YORK

WASHINGTON, Juno 12. (JTA) -- Miss Frieds B. Homnock, who came to the United States from Poland at the age of six and was naturalized in 1916, was named yesterday to the Federal bench by President Truman. Miss Honnock, who is active in Jowish affairs, will be the first woman to sorve as a Federal Judge in the New York district. She is the first woman over to be a member of the Federal Communications Commission and, at 23, was the youngest lawyer practicing in New York.
