# U.S. ZIONIST LEADERS DEMAND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES IN ISRAEL FOR THE ZIONIST MOVEMENT

ATTANTIC CITY, June 14. (JTA) — Ranking Zionist loaders, headed by Benjamin G. Browdy, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and Dr. Abba Hilled Eller tenight here took issue with Israeli government efficials, including Prime Minister David Ben Gurien, over the status of the Zionist movement. The Zionist loaders emphasized that the World Zionist Organization must continue to play its important role with special privileges in the upbuilding of Israel.

As the Zionist Ordanization of America officially opened its 54th annual convention, Mr. Broady assorted that the "Zionist Movement in the United States must have a special standing as the most importent agency concerned with Israel's interests in the United States." He warned that the "whole Israeli aid program throughout the world would be in jeopardy without the Zionists and their active leadership." Recutly, Prime Minister Bon-Gurien had assorted at a dimmer of the Jovish Amency in New York, just prior to his departure for Israel, that the Zionist movement must not sook a privileged status with reference to Israel.

Mr. Browdy pointedly asserted that "only by investing American Zionism with special recognition will American Zionists be placed in a position that will emble than to carry the whole American Jowish corrunity with them, in the great embryise of mabuilding the Jowish homeland." In a similar stand, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver asserted that only a strong Zionist newment" can insure for Israel that strongth and support which the long hard pull shead will require."

"The Zionist movement," Dr. Silver said "which was responsible for the creation of the State of Israel, in the face of violent opposition and large scale indifference, can alone be trusted to carry through the second part of its essential program—the ingathering and the integration of Jose who have to go to Israel or who may wish to go there."

#### Dr. Silver Warns Israel Against "Undermining" the Zienist Organization

Criticizing those in the Israel Government who refuse to grant a special status to the World Zienist Organization, Dr. Silver declared: "If the State of Israel will, in the future, regard the World Zienist Organization as the authentic instrument of the Jovish people, endowed with status and authentity to speak for and implement the remaining phase of the Zienist program, the erganization will be in a position to most the challence of the hour and to bring maximum support to Israel. There is no other compotent agency or organization in the field, now existing or which can be created, which can take its place."

Dr. Silvor underscored the fact that "the issue is not whether the severeignty of the State of Israel should be interfered with, but whether the government of Israel

should undormine the authority, prestine and effectiveness of the World Zionist Organization in the fond hope of finding some other bodies in world Jovry which will contribute more politically and occarminally to it."

Mr. Browdy criticized the view held by a segment of Israeli leaders that any status afforded the Zionist movement "would only constitute a wall between the whole community as such and the State of Israel." The head of the Z.O.A. duphasized that the Zionist movement has been responsible for enlisting the support of non-Zionict bedies for Israel.

## Possibility of Cooperation Between Zioniets and Non-Zioniets Cited

"It is our profound conviction," Mr. Browdy said, "that the Zioniets alone can be depended upon to serve as the chief factor in mobilizing the resources, material, noral, political, of the whole Sendan people throughout the world in support of the State of Israel. It is our firm belief that without the Zioniets and their active leadership, the whole Israel aid program throughout the world would be in jeopardy."

Mr. Browdy stressed that the only method of bringing close cooperation between Zionists and non-Zionists is through the granting of opecial status to the Zionist Organization by the Inraoli government. Be characterized as "abourd" the argument that "we can loave it to American Jewry as a whole to come to the aid of Inrael," mintaining at the same time that the Zionist Organization is the main instrument for soliciting all kinds of support for the new state.

Abraham Rodolheim of New York, national convention chairman, also took issue with Prine Minister Ben Gurion's statement that "non-Zioniets have become an important factor in the development of the state of Israel." In formally opening the convention, Mr. Rodolheim declared that "it was only because of the degree persistence of the Zioniet novement and its never ending appeal to the hearts and minds of the Jows of America over a period of years and years that some response was elicited from non-Zioniet quarters."

Dr. Sidney Marks, national secretary and executive director of the 2.0.A., submitted to the convention a far-flung economic, cultural, and public relations program in bohalf of Israel and Joyish life in America.

#### 840,000 WILL GO TO ROLLS IN GENERAL ELECTIONS IN ISRAEL, INTERIOR MINISTRY ANNOUNCES

TEL AVIV, June 14. (JTA) -- Some 840,000 Israelis will no to the polls in the forthcoming general elections at the end of July, the Interior Ministry amounced teday. A total of 502,000 voted in the elections for Israel's first Parliament in January, 1949.

So far, the Ministry said, over 773,000 veters have been enrolled in 1,435 polling places throughout the country. In Tel Aviv-Jaffa 215,329 persons registered, while in Jerusalem 73,716 registered and in Haifa 83,176 indicated their desire to vote.

#### 260,000 VOTES CAST IN ISRAELI ELECTIONS FOR DELEGATES TO WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

JERUSALEM, June 14. (JTA) -- A preliminary count of yesterday's voting for delegates to the World Zionist Congress revealed that screwint over 260,000 votes were cast, although some 650,000 shekulin were sold in Inrael. Jowish Americy circles stressed that at least 35 per cent of the 650,000 shekulin were never distributed or were lost by their original purchasers. Therefore, they said, actually 60 per cent of the distributed shekulin were voted.

# ISPARL SAYS EGYPTIAN BLOCKADE OF SUEZ CANAL MUST BE TAKEN UP BY U.E. COUNCIL

UNITED NATIONS, June 14. (JTA) -- A spokesman for the Israel delegation to the United Nations last night said that the Expetian blocked of Israel-bound shipping through the Sues Canal must be considered by the United Nations Security Council
as a problem involving international interests. In a statement commention on this
ruling by Major General William E. Riley, Chief of Staff of the U.W. Truce Supervision
organization in Relectine, reparding Israel's complaint against Expet for denying
free passage of Israel-bound vessels through the Canal, the spokesman said:

"General Riley makes it clear that Expt has been engaged for two years in an 'aggressive and hostile act' contrary to the object of the armistice agreement between Israel and Egypt.

"This considered judgement by the authorized representative of the United Nations Follows the action of the Israel Government in initiating a discussion in the Socurity Council in November, 1950. Moreover, wider intermational interests are also involved. Mearly all of the maritime powers have protested at various times against Egypt's action.

"Israel agrees with General Riley that the matter cannot rest where it is, and has no doubt that further consideration of the problem by the Security Council must follow. At the same time, it is difficult to see how an 'aggressive and hestile att' by Egypt against Israel can be regarded as lying outside the jurisdiction of the Egypt-Israel Mixed Armistice Commission."

#### Britain Will Not Bring Suez Canal Issue Before U.N. Security Council

LONDON, June 14. (JTh.) -- The British Government does not consider it necessary to raise in the United Nations Security Council the question of Egypt's blocked of the Sucs Canal against Isrcol-bound shipping because the Jovieh state has already placed the matter on the Council agenda, an official spekesman said here today.

Ho said that the British Government expects that the Council will consider the question after Major General William B. Riley, U.B. Chief of Staff in Falestine, reports on the situation. Asked if the British Government has confidence in Gaus Riley, the spokesmen answered affirmatively, pointing out that the General is an official of the U.R., which Britain supports. It is known that British official circles were surprised by Riley's ruling in favor of Empt on the Suez Canal blocked issue.

Monnwhile, a Foreign Office official denied reports that Eritain had postponed large-scale Royal Air Force maneuvers over the Sucz Canal zone in order to "avoid intermational complications," as had been reported. The spokessma said that the Air Ministry had made the chance for administrative reasons, and without consulting the Foreign Office. The exercises, scheduled for the end of this month, were supposed to have been the largest in that area since the end of the war.

## TURNEY HENDWIS TRADE PACT WITH ISRAEL; AGREEMENT CALLS FOR EXCHANGE OF GOODS

ISTANBUL, June 14. (JTA) -- The Israeli-Turkish trade part signed last July has been extended another year, in accordance with the provisions of the originat treaty, it was learned here today. The agreement calls for the exchange of \$640, -000 torth of goods between the two countries.

# NITED NATIONS GROUT DECIDES TO COMBAT PACTAL PREJUDICE; WITH PUBLISH PAMPHLETS

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Juno 14. (JTA) =- As part of its campaign against model projudico, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization plans to issue five pauphlots on various aspects of race, it was announced here today. The pauphlots will deal with racial myths, race and biology, race and culture, race and psychology and roots of projudice.

UNESCO has also concluded contracts with specialists to do studies of the cultural assimilation of immigrants in verious countries, including Israel. The studies will take account of such factors as language assimilation, inter-group relations and participation in political and social newcounts.

#### SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL OF AMERICA PLEDGES COOPERATION WITH CIVIL DEFENSE AUTHORITIES

WASHINGTON, Juno 14. (JTA) -- Prosident-cloct Rabbi Simon G. Kramor of the Symanomo Council of America today plodaed all possible ecoporation at a conforence of religious leaders of all faiths which rapped plans for ways in which churches and symanomous will aid the Civilian Defense Administration.
