MAN OPTIMISTIC ON POSSIBILITY OF U.S. CONGRESS APPROVING GRANT-IN-AID FOR ISRAEL

MEW YORK, Juno 20. (JTA) -- Optimism over the chances for approval by the U.S. Congress of Israel's request for a grant-in-aid from the American Government was expressed here today by Abba Eban, Israel's ambaseader to the United States. He said that a part of the grant-in-aid would be spont to buy more grain in this country.

Addressing a press conference, the Israeli diplomat declared that Israel still moods military supplies from the United States and would continue trying to obtain more. He confirmed a report that Israel will seen sign a treaty of friendship, corrorco and navigation with the United States.

In response to a question about oil in Israel, Mr. Eban said that Jewish experts had been in contact with American oil experts on the question of whether there was any oil under Israel's soil. He stated that Egypt's ban on Israel-bound goods being shipped through the Sucz Canal may be placed on the agenda of the United Nations . Security Council in the near future and expressed the hope that the U.S. would support Israel's point of view on this issue.

The Israel diplomats said work on the Hulch drainage project was going on, but that Israel was not satisfied with the situation which pormitted work only on Jowishcwood Land. Ho said the project will be completed only as originally planned, roquiring the use of seven acros of Arab-owned land. Mr. Eban gaid there had been differences with the U.S. over the spirit with which Israel had carried on the work, but not in respect to the aims of the project.

ENYFT'S BLOCKADE AGAINST ISRAEL DISCUSSED IN BRITISH FAREJAMENT; ACTION URGED

LONDON, Juno 20. (JTA) Every opportunity is being taken to bring pressure upon the Egyptian Government to permit the transit of Israel-bound oil tankers through the Suoz Canal, British Foreign Socretary Herbert Merrison told the House of Cornens today.

Anthony Edon pointed out that Britain has been trying to persuade Egypt for two yours to give up its blockede against Israel and that all offerts in this direction brought no rosults. "Thoro are measures in our power which can be taken together with our allies, " he insisted. Mr. Morrison replied that he would be willing to consider any suggestions, including a suggestion by Mr. Eden that the oil tankers bo sont to Haifa through the Suoz Sanal under effective escert.

British newspapers today carried articles wring stronger pressure from England on Exppt's blockeding of Israeli shipping in the Suoz Canal. The Daily Graphic says that the United States has premised arms to Egypt, provided that Egypt reaches a political agroomont with Britain.

JEWISH AGENCY ESTABLISHES DEPARTMENT TO ENCOURAGE EMUGRATION FROM ANGLO-SAXON LAMS

TEL AVIV, June 20. (JEA) -- The establishment of the department to deal especially with now immirration to Israel from Analo-Sexon countries was announced here today by the Jovish Agoncy. The department will callaborate with the Zienist expanizations in Analo-Sexon countries to Ancilitate the immirration of Jove from these lands, and the sottlement and integration of the prospective newconers in the Jovish state.

Explasizing that about 5,000 Jows, coming principally from the United States and Britain, have already scattled in Israel since the establishment of the Jewish state, the announcement says that a large number of tourists who recently visited Israel displayed a keen interest in settling in the Jewish state in the near future. Moreover, it is understood that British authorities have lately approved, on a small scale, the transfer of capital for British citizens who may desire to enterate to Israel, the Jewish Agency announcement reveals.

The principal feature offered by the new department is the possibility of acquiring new housing, thereby evercoming the main difficulty confronting all nev-comors in Israel. The plan involves partial payment of the total cost of the house in foreign currency for which the Jowish Avency will buy all building naterials necessary for the creation of the house. The new-comor will be paying the balance after his arrival in Israel in easy installments and through long-term norteages.

The new department is intended for immigrants with limited financial means, to be recruited chiefly from the middle class. The houses for these immigrants will be built by Anider, the housing corporation which is parely owned by the government and the Jovish Amoncy, thus ensuring maximum construction speed and official support for the integration of the newcomers into the country's economic life.

RELIGIOUS GROUPS IN ISRAEL SYLTT ON ELECTIONS: PROGRESSIVE PARTY HINTS SUPPORT FROM U.S.

JERUSALEM, June 20. (JTA) -- All efforts to establish a Roligious Bloc for the fortheoning parliamentary elections, which are scheduled to take place on July 30, failed today when the Mizrachi Laborito Party announced that it will present a separate list of candidates.

The loaders of the party emphasized that they see no way of joining the Religious Bloc of which the Migrachi laborates were a part in the provious parliamentary elections. All indications point to the fact that there may be at least four competing religious lates in the election campaign.

Addressing the opening session of the national conference of the Progressive Party in Tol Rviv last mint, Dr. A. Granott, head of the Jovish National Fund; said that the majority of the number of the Zioniet Organization of America and the Hadassah members in the United States are supporting the progressive trend in General Zionism. In a message to the conference Promier David Bon Burion said: You are manner the few who dered to continue in this country the fine tradition of Zionism.

FIRST CENTRAL WATER HIMPING STATION FOR NEGEV OFFICIALLY OFFINED

TEL AVIV, June 20. (JTA) -- A new control purping station, feeding water into the Negov-bound pipeline, was officially inaugurated today. The new plant, situated northwest of Boorshoba, has a capacity of 15,000,000 cubic motors annually.

The plant will act as a distributor and relay point for water pumped from wells located further north, and will pump water enward to the Negov. It will irrigate a large area extending between Negota in the north to Beershoba in the South.

RABBINIC. ASSEMBLY DECIDES TO REVITALIZE OBSERVANCE OF SABBATH; RE-ELECTS DAVIDSON

KIAMESIA IAKE, N.Y., Juno 20. (JTA) -- An intoneivo offort to rovitalizo obsorvance of the Sabbath by Conservative Jows throughout the United States and Canada assended here today by the 275 members of the Rebbinical Assembly of America, noting at their 51st annual convention at the Notel Concord. The Rabbis pleamed their salves to make observance of the Sabbath the primary task in their convergations during the centing year. Rabbi Max Davidson was re-elected president of the Assembly for a composer torm.

In his roport of the activities of the Assembly during the 1950-51 period, Rebbi kar J. Reuttenborg, executive vice-president, pointed out: "The American Jowish community continues to be the nest understaffed religious denomination in American life. Hundreds of small, isolated Jowish communities throughout the land are compelled to so without any spiritual leadership whatseever, or, what is frequently worse, fall proy to the free-lance charletans who wrock incalculable camego on their unsuspecting victies."

Dr. Mordocai M. Kaplan, distinguished theologian, said at the afternoon session: "Not until religious Loaders of the principal religions in the world can acros on some fining workship program that would make possible an organization which would render religious diversity compatible with ocumenical unity, can religion amount to more than a verbalization of wishful thinking."

EQUAL RIGHTS FOR REFORM AND CONSERVATIVE RABBIS IN ISRAEL ASKED AT RABBINICAL CONVENTION

NEW LONDON, Comn., June 20. (JEL) -- Addressing the opening session of the annual moting of the Contral Conference of American Rebbis, the organization forfers rabbis, br. Hillip S. Bornstein, president, said that in plocking support for Israel he was critical of the fact that Reform and Conservative phases of Judaism did not only in Israel the same status as other religious groups. He expressed here that this condition would be rectified.

Rovioving general conditions, Rabbi Bornstoin said: "Organized religion must support the forces of law, order and freedem in this struggle. The people of Russia are entitled to any kind of government they are ready to accept. But the government of Soviet Russia does not have the right to impose its domination or its social even on other mations. Unless such enforced dominations is resisted, it will employ the order of the resistance by the United Rations to such aggression is morally right and realistically importative.

"Therefore," Rabbi Bornstein continued, "the president of your conference expresses his endorsement of the policies followed by the President of the United States at this time. I support his policies to resist and to localize aggression. I commend his for acting within the framework of the United Nations. The policy of our government does not guarantee poace. There can be no absolute guaranty of peace without the co-paration of the Kremith."
