ISRAEL GOVERNMENT PROPOSES TO HUNGARY TRANSFER OF ALL "UNDESIRE" JEWS TO ISRAEL

TEL AVIV, July 2. (JTA) -- The Israel Government has proposed to the Hungarian Government that the "undesired" Jews, now being deported from Budapest and other Hungarian cities under Hungary's so-called "resettlement" program, be transferred to Israel, it was learned here today.

The proposal was submitted to the Hungarian Government by the Israeli chargé d'affaires in Budapest who also asked that the fate of all the remaining Jews of Hungary be discussed. The Hungarian authorities have so far delayed their answer.

Over 2,000 former Hungarian Jews attended a public demonstration here today to protest the expulsion of "undesired" Hungarian Jews from the major Hungarian cities and population centers to small towns in that country. The parley also called on the Israel Government to give priority in immigration to 130,000 Hungarian Jews. Attempts by Communist groups here to disrupt the meeting failed.

Israel's Foreign Minister Moshe Sharett today met with a delegation of Hungarian Jewish immigrants and informed the delegation of the steps taken by the Israel Government to ease the situation of the "undesired" Jews in Hungary. Following this meeting, a coordinating committee was formed to help the Israel Government in its efforts on behalf of the Jews in Hungary. The committee is composed of representatives of the Foreign Ministry, of the Jewish Agency and of the Union of Hungarian Jews in Israel.

U.S. May Bring Complaint Against Hungary; Will Report Hungary's Action to U.N.

WASHINGTON, July 2. (JTA) -- The United States Government views the mass expulsion of Jews and others from the larger cities in Hungary with the "gravest concern," a delegation of the Agudath Israel of America was told at the State Department. The delegation asked U.S. intervention to halt the expulsion of Jews.

Members of the delegation were assured that when all the facts about the Hungarian Government's action are assembled, the American Government will bring them to the attention of the Human Rights Commission of the United Nations.

207 Hungarian Jews Leave For Israel; Travel Via Italian Port

BUDAPEST, July 2. (JTA) -- A party of 207 Hungarian Jewish men, women and children left here by train for Genoa last night on the first leg of their journey to Israel. They are part of the group of 3,000 whom the Hungarian Government last year agreed to permit to emigrate. So far about 2,400 of the 3,000 have gone.

IRAQI IMMIGRATION DUE TO END IN A WEEK; RUMANIAN JEWS GET NEXT PRIORITY

JERUSALEM, July 2. (JTA) -- The immigration movement of Iraqi Jews to Israel is due to end within the next week or ten days, after which priority in immigration to the Jewish state will be given to Rumanian Jews, Itzhak Raphael, Jewish Agency member, today told a press conference here.

Mr. Raphael announced that 106,662 Iraqi Jews had been brought to this country in 1,000 flights and that the remaining Jews who wish to leave Iraq for Israel will be brought here before the middle of July. He expressed his appreciation of the "indefatigable" political and financial efforts in behalf of the Iraqi Jews. In a review of the general immigration picture, he stated that prospects of Hungarian immigration are "dull," while he hopes that North African immigration will increase toward the end of the year. Earlier today, the Agency announced that 22,398 immigrants entered Israel last month.

GEN. RILEY DEFERS HIS RETURN TO U.S.; SECURITY COUNCIL MAY NOT ACT ON HULEH ISSUE

UNITED NATIONS, July 2. (JTA) -- Informed sources said here today that there would be no Security Council action on the "distress signal" messages sent here during the last few days by Lieut. Gen. William E. Riley until the United Nations Palestine Truce Supervisor returns here to report in person on the new difficulties that have arisen over Israel's project for reclamation of the Huleh swamp area.

Gen. Riley was scheduled to return to New York within a few days but information reaching here today said that he will not come to the United States this week. This report has given rise to the belief that he is making an attempt to resolve the new situation on the spot.

Gen. Riley reported to the United Nations last week that the Arab owners of land in the demilitarized zone had refused to enter into any negotiations with Israel to allow the drainage work to continue on their property.

JEWISH AGENCY PROPOSES FORMATION OF SINGLE NATIONAL ZIONIST GROUP IN COUNTRIES ABROAD

TEL AVIV, July 2. (JTA) -- A proposal for the establishment in each country outside Israel of a single national Zionist organization was made by Eliahu Dobkin, head of the organization department of the Jewish Agency, speaking before the committee on the agenda for the forthcoming World Zionist Congress.

The proposal was supported by representatives of the Mapai and the Women's International Zionist Organization but opposed by the General Zionists, the Mapam and the Mizrachi. The committee did not vote on the proposal. Mr. Dobkin declared that the most vital and basic tasks of the Zionist movement abroad were not carried out effectively due to party dissension. He maintained that the creative character of the movement would be lost unless some common ground for action were found.

600 WORKERS IN HAIFA REFINERIES VOTE TO PROCLAIM A GENERAL STRIKE NEXT SUNDAY

TEL AVIV, July 2. (JTA) -- A decision to proclaim a strike at the Haifa refineries on Sunday if the management does not reply favorably to the workers demands for improved working conditions was adopted today at a meeting of the 600 refinery workers. Yesterday the workers stopped work for three hours in a "warning strike."

ISRAEL AMBASSADOR PRESENTS MEMORANDUM TO STATE DEPARTMENT ON GERMAN RESTITUTION

WASHINGTON, July 2. (JTA) -- Israel Ambassador Abba Eban presented Henry Byroade, State Department Director of German Affairs, with a detailed aide memoire which urged the settlement of Israel's claim for restitution from Germany. Mr. Eban emphasized that the moral grounds of Israel's claims have been generally conceded.

The Ambassador said he pointed out the practical possibility of repayment. The improvement in Germany's economic status and exports, indicated by a higher standard of living in Germany than exists in Israel, should create a better chance for Germany to meet its obligations, Mr. Eban declared, adding that it was intolerable that the perpetrators of crimes against Jewry should make less sacrifices than the victims.

GERMAN POLICE RAID JEWISH HOMES IN MUNICH; JEWS URGED TO WATCH GERMANY

MUNICH, July 2, (JTA) -- German police raided several homes and shops in Munich's Jewish quarter and confiscated small quantities of alleged black market goods.

Zionist institutions and a small Jewish community should remain in Germany in order to watch and report the development of anti-Semitism to the rest of the world, the Jewish publication "Unzer Welt," advocates in its current issue.

FIRST JEWISH COLLECTIVE FARM ESTABLISHED IN POLAND; JEWS SURRENDER OWNERSHIP OF LAND

LONDON, July 2. (JTA) -- The first Jewish collective farm in western Poland was established last week by a group of Jewish farmers in the Bzlerzanow area, according to a report received here today. The farmers, who surrendered their ownership of the land to establish the 400-acre collective farm on Soviet lines, acted after a vigorous propaganda campaign conducted by representatives of the Warsaw Jewish cultural and social organization.

Polish authorities, in cooperation with representatives of the Jewish community in Warsaw, have set up a committee to erect a memorial for the hundreds of thousands of Jews executed in the Treblinka death camp. Members of the Jewish Central Committee who recently visited the notorious site reported that all human remains, which until recently had been strewn about, have been reburied.

DUTCH PARLIAMENT ORDERS RETRIAL OF WAR CRIMINALS UNDER SENTENCE OF DEATH

THE HAGUE, July 2. (JTA) -- The Dutch Parliament today ordered the retrial of all war criminals under sentence of death who remain in Dutch prisons.

PROGRESSIVES DEFEATED BY CONSERVATIVES IN ELECTIONS TO ROME JEWISH COMMUNITY COUNCIL

ROME, July 2, (JTA) -- Rafael Cantoni and Renzo Levi, president and vice-president, respectively, of the Union of Jewish Communities in Italy, today resigned from their posts following the election of a new Jewish Community Council in Rome. The resignation was due to the fact that their party, the Progressives, was defeated by the opposing conservative group.

AMERICAN MIZRACHI WILL SEEK "RADICAL REVISION" IN STRUCTURE OF JEWISH AGENCY

NEW YORK, July 2. (JTA) -- A "radical revision" in the structure of the Jewish Agency will be sought at the forthcoming World Zionist Congress by the delegation of the Mizrahi Organization of America, Dr. Pinkhos Churgin, president of the organization, declared here today in a statement before embarking on the s/s La Guardia for Israel. "The structure of the Jewish Agency must be changed to render it more efficient in conformity with the changed conditions erected by the establishment of the Jewish State," he said.

The delegation also will seek the creation of "some kind of territorial coordination between the different Zionist organizations in each country in order to meet the challenge of forces attacking Zionism and the Jewish State," he declared. It will also press for "greater latitude of activity" by the various Zionist organizations in their relations with the Jewish National Fund and the Palestine Foundation Fund, the two major Zionist fund agencies.

U.S. MIZRACHI LABORITE CONVENTION CLOSES; PLEDGES SUPPORT TO J.N.F.; RE-ELECTS BICK

FALLSBURG, N.Y., July 2. (JTA) -- The 28th annual convention of Hapoel Mizrachi, at its closing session today, adopted a resolution pledging the organization to the maintenance of the full independence and integrity of the Jewish National Fund. The resolution was adopted following an address delivered by Mendel N. Fisher, executive director of the J.N.F. Charles Bick of New York was reelected president.

SO. AFRICAN ZIONISTS CHARTER PLANE FOR DR. SILVER; U.S. ZIONIST LEADER VISIT RHODESIA

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, July 2. (JTA) -- The Zionist Federation of South Africa has chartered a special plane for the use of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, who is now visiting the Jewish community in this country, to make possible Dr. Silver's meeting his crowded itinerary in the face of a national transportation slow down by South African transportation workers.

Meanwhile, Dr. Silver has visited the Jewish communities of Salisbury and Bulawayo, in Rhodesia, where he was received with great acclaim. He returned here this week-end to address a meeting tonight.

I.M. LEWIN, ISRAEL CABINET MEMBER, ARRIVES IN VIENNA; HONORED BY JEWISH COMMUNITY

VIENNA, July 2. (JTA) -- I.M. Lewin, Orthodox member of the Israel Cabinet, arrived in Vienna and was met at the airport by leaders of the Jewish Community which is arranging a reception for him at the Concert House.
