SITUATION ON ISRAEL-JORDAN FRONTIER DETERIORATING RAPIDLY

JERUSALEM, Jan. 25. (JTA) -- The Israel Cabinet today considered the problem of the rapidly deteriorating situation along israel's borders with Jordan. Foreign Minister Moshe Sharett and a representative of Army headquarters reported on the itset developments, including implementation of the armistice agreements with the other three Arab states on insrael's frontiers.
