JEWS KILLED IN MOROCCO RIOTS; RAID ON JEWISH QUARTER REPULSED

PARIS, Aug. 23. (JTA)-- An attempted raid by a column of Arab nationalists on the Jewish quarter in Rabat, Morocco, was successfully repulsed by French pillor, the Paris Radio said today. The announcement added that police had dispersed the crowd without casualities.

One of the 15, Chaim Riklin, 22, was acquitted for lack of evidence. One of the defendants escaped from jall during the trial and another had his case severed because of ill health. Membership in the organization carries a maximum sentence of the years in jall, while activity is punishable by 20 years imprisonment.

TWO ARRESTED ON SUSPICION OF PLACING MINES IN JAFFA PORT

TEL AVIV, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- Two men were in custody today under suspicion of having placed four mines in Jaffa harbor as a protest against the arrival there of the first reparations cargo from Germany.

SEARL SUPPORTS SOVIET PARTICIPATION IN CONFERENCE ON KOREA

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. Aug. 23. As to the cruical question of an invitation for India, Mr. Eban said that Inrael would act in "obedience to one criterion alone - the criterion of utility and the proser of success in convening the conference and orbringing it to agreement." Then he paid tribute to Prime Minister Nebru of India and said that his "recent statement wholes this principle with exemplary force."

Being against a round-table conference, the United States is opposed to any norbiligerent such as India being at the conference, and the American delegate, Henry Cabet Lodge, amounced that he would vote against the resolution inviting India.

In the course of his speech, the Israell delegate paid a "profound tribute" to the is states which had provided troops for the United Nations action for what they had risked, endured and achieved in the common cause of resiting aggression. He said that the heavy losses suffered by the American people merited particular sympathy.

Eban Leaves for Israel to Confer with Israel Government

NEW YORK, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- Israel Ambassador Abha Eban took off by plane today for a brief visit to Israel where he will confer with government officials on American-Israel relations. He will return to this country before the regular session of the United Nations General Assembly opens about September 15.

During his absence, David Goitein, Minister Plenipotentiary, will be Charge &Affaires at the Embassy. Mr. Goitein himself is soon to be replaced by Reuben Shloah, who is reportedly coming to this country when Mr. Eban returns.

GERMAN COURT ORDERS RIGHTIST PARTY TO REMOVE ANTI-JEWISH POSTERS

BONN, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- A German court has ordered the German Party, rightist member of the West German coalition government, to remove anti-Semitic posters thad distributed in Lower Saxony, where the rightist party has its orgatest strength

The posters, accusing Social Democratic leader Erich Ollenhauer of being a Jew, were signed by the election chairman of the Gandersheim district of the German Party, who is a former Nazi police capital awaiting reinstatement to his post.

Printed in the black, white and red of Imperial Germany and the nationalist movement, the placards contain a latter asking Mr. Ollenhauer whether "numors" that be is a lew and served in the British army as a "lewish emigrant" are true. Then the paster adds that the Social Democratic leader never replied to the letter of inquiry, thereby intimating that the "chargess" are true. The coater also chides the Socialist

party for having picked its leader from among "the chosen people."

DISMISSED JEWISH OFFICIALS IN POLAND OFFERED LOWER POSTS

JERUSALEM, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- Jewish officials dismissed from civil service jobs in Poland have been rehired, but not in the same jobs, it was reported here today by Jewish rehisses arriving from Vienna.

They said that most of the Jewish officials have been rehired in lower classified jobs. They also said that the Jews are in no hurry to take up these new posts, because they fear that holding such jobs might weaken the possibility of emigration in the fature.

15 YOUTH LEADERS AND PROFESSIONALS SAIL FOR STUDY IN ISRAEL

NEW YORK, Aug. 23. CHICAGO, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- A two-day meeting of the national membership committee of B'nai B'rith closed here today with the adoption of plans to launch a drive to obtain 75,000 new members in 53 cities this year.

For the first time this year, the annual meeting decided to name a national membership Cabinet, headed by Bernard Roman of Chicago, to direct the drive to augment the numbers of the organization which now has 350,000 members.

RABBINICAL COUNCIL OF AMERICA OPPOSES DRAFTING OF WOMEN IN ISRAEL

NEW YORK, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- Rabbi Theodore L. Adams, president of the Rabbinical Council of America, an Orthodox group, today denied that the Council favored the proposed law for national service of women in Israel. He further denied that there was any disagreement or difference of opinion between the Council and the Union of Orthodox Rabbis on this matter, as stated last week in Jerusalem by Rabbi

Referring to the statement attributed to Rabbi Katz, Rabbi Adams stated "categerically that Rabbi Kats had no authority to speak in behalf of the Rabbinical Council of America or to pronounce its policy. "The position of the Rabbinical Council of America has already been enunciated as supporting fully the position taken by the Chief Rabbinate of Israel on all religious matters pertaining to Israel and that we have joined the Chief Rabbi in his opposition to the national service law," he said.

BRAEL EXPORTS RAINCOATS TO UNITED STATES; PHOSPHATES TO ITALY

TEL AVIV, Aug. 23. (JTA) -- A shipment of 4,000 Israel-made raincoats left here aboard a special El Al plane for the United States. The first shipment of 500 tons of phosphates from Israel's Negev region left for Italy. Larger quantities are expected to be shipped soon.
