PRESIDENT EISENHOWER ACCEPTS DEMOCRATIC LEGACY AWARD OF ADL

DENVER, Col., Sept. 8. (JTA) -- President Dwight D. Eisenhower has agreed to accept the America's Democratic Legacy award precented annually by the Anti-Defanation Legacy of Brail B** If the on American in recognition of "distinguished contributions to the enrichment of America's democratic legacy," the Summer White Raws annunced today.

President Elsenhower will appear in person to receive the medallion at a dinner in Washington on November 23 tendered by the board of governors of B'nai B'rith to mark the 40th anniversary of the Anti-Defamation League. It will be the President's first appearance before a national Jewish organization since he took office.

MSA FUND DIVERSION FOR IRAN MAY CAUSE SHARP CUT IN ISRAEL AID

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8. (JTA) -- Israel may suffer a severe cut in mutual security assistance owing to the diversion of Near Eastern economic aid to Iran, it was trevaled today by the Foreign Operations Administration.

An inquiry made with the Administration disclosed the fact that \$25,000,000 of the emergency \$45,000,000 grant for Iran announced by President Elsenbower on Sptember 5 will be taken from funds israel expected to share with the Arab states.

A spoke sman for the FOA said today that \$25,000,000 would come from the 1847,000,000 total provided in the new Mutual Security Act for economic sid to inzel, the Arab states, Iran, and certain Artican territories. ARAB LEAGUE VOTES FUNDS TO JORDAN FOR 'DEFENSE' OF JERUSALEM

LONDON, Sept. 8, (JTA) -- The Arab League has decided to give the Jordan Government 1,000,000 pounds to strengthen the Arab state's "defense" against larsel, it was reported here today from Cairo.

SRAEL ARMY CAPTURES ARAB GANG'S SUPPLY DUMP NEAR NEGEV FRONTIER

TEL AVIV, Sept. 8. (JTA) -- An Israel Army detachment operating near the Egyptian-Israel border in the Auja-El Hafir area, captured a large dump of arms and ammunition after a sharp clash with an armed Arab band, an Army spokesman disclased today.

The dump contained 80 kegs of dynamite, 130 mortar shells, a large quantity of detonators, British small-arms ammunition, six cases of home-made mines and other shells.

In another clash in the Negev near the border of the Egyptian-held Gaza coastal strip, two Arab infiltrators were killed, the spokesman said.

SENTENCE TWO IN BRAEL EDUCATION MINISTRY BOMBING

IRUSALEM, Sept. 8, (3TA) -- Two 20-year-old youths were sentenced in Jerusalem District Court today to prison terms of three years each following their conviction on three counts in connection with an attempt to bomb the Education Ministry building last May.

Judge Y. Goben ordered special treatment for the pair, Mordecai Freund and David Blau, and ruled their sentences should be retreactive to the date of their detention three months ago. He warred in the future severer sentences would be imposed on individuals seeking to impose their opinion on the authorities by use of violence.

The two youths were found guilty of conspiring to bomb the government building, of attempting to plant bombs in it and of possession of bombs. The attempted bombing of the ministry coincided with widespread religious protests against the National Service Act requiring girls exempt from military service because of religious reas. TWO FACE MILITARY COURT IN SECOND SARAFAND TERRORIST TRIAL

TELAVIV, Sept. 8. (JTA) -- Two men went on trial before a military court at the Sarafand army camp here today on charges of membership in an illegal terrorist underground organization. Previously, 13 men and women were sentenced to from one to 12 years in prison following their conviction as members of the secret orsuitation.

The two men, Zeev Yevin, 27, and Reuven Peretz, 23, made statements refusing to recognize the jurisdiction of the military court and demanding trial in a civilian court. The court refused to accept their demand and the two defendants announced their "mon-participation" in the trial. The court will appoint counsel for them.

Yevin, son of the writer and historian Yehoshua Yevin, told the court he had been reared to believe in a "kingdom of Israel." He advised the Israel Army to busy itself in reconquering areas of Palestine held by the Araba.

GERMANS WORRIED AS ARABS RENEW PROTESTS ON ISRAEL REPARATIONS

BONN, Sept. 8. (JTA) -- The issue of German reparations for Israel and the fature of German-Arab relations has again been taken up by the political committee of the Arab League at Catro, political circles here have learned with some anxiety.

These circles regard the new discussion of the much-discussed matter as the rettil of lack of German political missions in the Arab Courties. WEST GERMANY RATIFIES UNITED NATIONS CONVENTION ON REFUGEES

BONN, Sept. 8. (3TA) -- The West German Government has ratified the 1951 Beited Nations Convention on Refugees which extends legal, employment and social wilfare protection to political refugees irrespective of nationality. President Tendor Buses signed the convention for the Federal Republic.
