VIENNA JEWS PROTEST AGAINST TRIAL OF ZIONISTS IN HUNGARY

VIENNA, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- The Jewish Community of Vienna yesterday protested to the Hungarian Minister in Vienna against the trial of three Zionist leaders in Budapest on charges of carrying on various Zionist activities and for maintaining centact with Zionist organizations abroad, it was revealed here today.

The protest expressed the "deep distress" of the Vienna community and pointed out that the Zionist activities, on the basis of which the Jewish leaders are being tried, were legal at the time that they were carried on. It urged that the trials be halted and the defendants released.

The defendants are: Dr. Jieh Danes, former leader of the Zweish community of despest; Henrick Gales, former screetury peers of the Educist Crystanisation of Bedapest; and, Geas. Kornitzer, one-time leader of the Orthodox religious committy of Bedapest. Dj. Renes was enstanced to three years' imprisoned in 1970 on the same charges and was freed in 1956. JEWS IN SWEDEN DEMAND RELEASE OF ZIONISTS ARRESTED IN RUMANIA

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- A resolution calling upon the Rumanian Govtransent to release the Zionist leaders currently under arrest in that country was adopted here today at the concluding session of the national conference of the Zionist Faderation of Sweden.

Among the other resolutions carried at the session was one calling for the formation of a joint Jewish committee to seek compensation for Jewish victims of Hitterian wow living in Sweden "so that they can recreate their cultural institutions." Major speakers at the parley were: Zionist Federation chairman Frits Hollander, who was resoluted; Izared Minister Abraham Nissan; and Chief Rabbi Kurw Wilhelm.

JEWISH COUNCIL IN MUNICH WARNS JEWS NOT TO RETURN TO GERMANY

MUNICH, Dec. 23. [JTA] — The representative body of the Jewel in Germany this usck warned all Jewe who were not pre-war resident against trying to settle here, is strong words, it also cautioned them against coming to Germany with the idea of transmiserating to a third country.

The warning, adopted at a local meeting of the directorate of the Countral Council of the Jews in Germany, is primarily addressed to potential "Higgal returnees" policy listed. No belly will be extended to future inflitnees by the Jewish communities, the revolution of the directorate states, because the inflitne of such enligrants from Indiana, many of whom lived in German DP camps after their liberation from Nazi concentration camps, creates "serious serial, political and moral problems."

ANGLO-JEWISH ASSOCIATION OFFERS COOPERATION TO BOARD OF DEPUTIES

LONDON, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- In a move toward reconciliation with the Board of Depaties of British Jews, the Anglo-Jewish Association last night adopted a resolution "selcoming" the establishment of "permanent machinery for consultation" with the Board on all aspects of foreign affairs.

Two other motions on the subject were withdrawn after this was adopted. They called for: the Association to rejoin the Board, from which it had withdrawn; and for the AlA and Board to re-establish a joint foreign affair's committee.

ANTI-SHECHITA AGITATION GROWING IN ENGLAND: STUNNING DEMANDED

LONDON, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- Agitation against Jewish ritual slaughter of cattle is continuing in Britain and there is a growing advocacy in non-lewish circles of a system of stuming the animals before slaughter, Elsley Zeitlin, chaltram of the schechita committee of the Board of Deputies, reported to a meeting of the Board vesterday.

Mr. Zeitlin reported too that the ecclesiastical authorities of the Board had decided that stanning was contrary to Jewish ritual law. This decision, he pointed exhal been communicated to the rabbinate in Israel and other countries, all of whom had arreed with the view of the Board's authorities.

J. C. A. DECIDES TO SETTLE NEW FAMILIES ON LAND IN ARGENTINA

LONDON, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- Sir Henry D'Avigdor Goldsmid was re-elected president of the Jewish Colonization Assocation, at a quarterly meeting of the JGA today, while Rene Mayer, for mer Premier of France, was renamed vice-president.

An annual budget for the organization was approved at the meeting. It included appropriations for settling new families on JCA farms in Argentians and sums for improving education and social and cultural aspects of life in all colonies of the Association. Greats were voted to the Agricultural Faculty of the Bebrew University in Israel as well as other Israeli iffaining institutions, while increased grants were made to vocational training centrers in Israel and North Africa.

STANBUL JEWISH POPULATION SHOWS DECREASE; CITY HAS 44,000 JEWS

ISTANBUL, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- There wer: 44,000 Jews living in Istanbul in 1950, a census of the city which has just been made public revealed. There are no figures available for all of Turkey.

This figure represented a drop from 50,000 Jews in Istanbul in 1945. The decline is believed to have been caused by a migratory wave to Isrsel in 1948 and 1949, The 44,000 is made up roughly of 20,000 men and boys and 24,000 women and girls.

The number of Turkish Jees who spoke Ladino in 1950 was 39,000, as compared to 69,000 who spoke its 1973, sucher poll revealed. Ladino has been replaced by Turkish and Freech as the major language of Turkish Jees. The report also disclosed that 7.4 percent of the Jews of . Turkey were literate in 1950 as compared to 34.6 percent fet percent of the Jews of . Turkey work literate in 1950 as compared to 34.6 percent of the Jewsh population. Literacy among Jews had risen since 1955 when it was recorded at 57.7 percent of the Jewsh population.

1,155 IMMIGRANTS FROM ISRAEL ENTERED CANADA IN SIX MONTHS

OTTAWA, Dec. 23. (JTA) -- A total of 1,155 immigrants from Israel entered Canada during the Inter six months of 1955, the Dominion Minister of Citizenship and Immigration declared in a report submitted to Parliament. The Canadian Jewish Congress is preparing to consult with Michael Comay, Israel Minister to Ottawa, on this problem.

The total number of Jewish immigrants to enter Canada in the first ten months of this year was 3,178 as compared to the 4,271 who entered in the same ten months of 1952. This amounts to a 26 percent decrease.

The United Zionist Council announced today that 28 Canadian Jews left Canada for Israel during 1953. Twenty-one emigrated as Chalutaim for permanent settlement and seven to take various courses in Israel. Ten of the Chalutaim are members of the Hashomer Hatrair, the remainder are members of other Zionist youth grouns.
