SECREIT GOUNCIL MEETS TODAY ON ISBAEL COMPLAINT AGAINST EOFFT UNITED MATONIN, N. Suez Canal Blockade Debated in Commons

(In London, today, former Foreign Secretary Herbert Morrison reminded the Covernment in the House of Commons that Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden, when a member of the opposition, had demanded that the British Navy be used to escort israeli-bound British wessels through the Egyptian blockade at the Suez Canal.

(To Mr. Morrison's query as to what had become of Mr. Eden's advocacy of this course, Minister of State Selwyn Lloyd Feplied that Mr. Morrison himself had a measure of responsibility for dealing with that suggestion. Mr. Lloyd added that the quastion of the Egyptian blockade was now an international matter, not an issue on a "Allocal level."

(Mr. Lloyd further told the House that Britain had repeatedly informed Egypt that she did not recognize the Egyptian blacklisting of ships and said that refusal of facilities did not necessarily prevent passage through the Suez Canal by the blacklisted ships.)

The Exprain occupant on the Outlete Nations, in a press statement, tonight charged the Israel Government with filling a "spurious complaint" against Egypt with the Security Gouncil to cover up the "moral damage suffered by Israel as a result of the recent condemnation of its butchery of innocent Arab men, women and children" at Kibya.

The Inzell complaint that Egypt is violating a Security Gouncil resolution and the Irzell-Egyptian armistice agreement by its blockade of the Suez Canal against irzel-bound shipping was characterized by the Egyptian statement as a "three-barrilled gan designed for Arab hatred-blazing, Israel's consure-erasing, and Zionist internising."

"The significance of geographical distortions," the statement continued, "spelt out at the very outset of an official memorandum to the Security Council by calling the Gulf of Aqaba that of Ellat, cannot fall to give rise ts further misgivings regarding Zimist expansion in the Middle East."

The Israeli delegation characterized the Egyptian stitement as "one of the most ridicalous statements in international history and literature" and said it showed "a spirit of complete and intransipeant desceration."

The statement, the Israelis charged, "falled to touch in any substantive manner upon the central features of Israel's complaint." Egypt's position, the Israelis declared, was defined by the Security Council in 1951 as an "lillicit abuse of Egypt's rights and obligations."

The Israeli statement added that "Egypt now faces the just indignation of world only one of the defiance of interestational law and arbitrary interference with the rights and interests of Israel and of other maritime countries."

WEALTH AGENCY DEFERS SCHEME TO A VOID ARAB ANTI-ISRAEL BOYCOTT

GENEVA, Feb. 3. (JTA) -- The executive board of the World Health Organization has referred back to the assembly of WHO for further study procedures permitting the Eastern Mediterranean Regional Committee to be divided into two subcommittees to overcome the refusal of the Arab States to sit with Israel.

The regional director, who had called a meeting of the first sub-committee, in which is all does not sit, has been instructed by the director general of WHO to postpose the meeting until such time as the second sub-committee could also meet.

The action followed advice by larget to the agency that the compromise it had attempted to sidestep the boycott of the Jewish State by the Arabs had not worked out and that "it would be better to await more propitious times in order to undertake z-rexamination of this question."

Dr. M. Kahany, permanent delegate of Israel to the Geneva headquarters of the Visited Nations, reminded the board that not one of the II member countries having this reat of government in the region had expressed desire to sit on the second subcommittee with Israel. Only one of the three European countries administering territeries in the region had agreed to sit on both sub-committees, he said.

Dr. Kahany pointed out that with the fixing of the stat of the first sub-committee as Alexandria, Israel had been deprived of freedom-of choice and was virtually excluded from memberahip on that committee, with Israel as sole member of the second sub-committee, he said, "this would be tantamount to the barely disguised exclusion of a member from its region."

"We were not and are not opposed to any bona fide effort which may be made to resolve at least provisionally the deadlock created by the obstructive attitude of the Atab countries," the Israell representative declared. He said that "efforte made by the rejonal director in pursuance of the wish expressed by the assembly can hardly warrant much hope that this solution can presently be found."

WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION GRANTS WORLD OSE UNION OFFICIAL STATUS

GENEVA, Feb. 3. (JTA) -- The World OSE Union, Jewish health organization.

The agency was admitted, after its application had previously been denied, under a broadening of WHO admissions criteria to admit "sectional" groups and to allow admission of more than one non-governmental agency working in the same field.

Admitted with the OSE were two Catholic health agencies. Admission of these three groups was opposed by the Brazilian representative, Prof. M. J. Peffeirs, who held it was the wrong step to accept organizations based on confessional grounds or testricted in membership by race or other criteria.

SAEMY JAPHET, BANKER AND PHILANTHROPIST, DIES IN LONDON AT 95

LONDON, Feb. 3. (JTA) -- Saemy Japhet, prominent London banker and philanthe London, died here yesterday at the age of 95. Mr. Japhet contributed to a number of lewish causes and took a deep interest in Palestine development, although he was lever identified with the Zionist organization.

Mr. Japhet was born in Frankfurt and received his training in the banking busibiss as an apprentice in a German bank for which he began working when he was 15. After a number of years in London, he established S. Japhet and Company, which is now one of Lendon's greatest banking houses.
